

WIAA Provides Opportunities; Structure . . .

The Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association (WIAA) is a voluntary, unincorporated, and nonprofit organization. The Association membership has a diversified membership of public high schools, nonpublic high schools, public middle schools, and nonpublic middle schools. Its purpose is to organize, develop, direct and provide interscholastic athletics for member schools. There are 514 senior high schools affiliated with the WIAA. The estimated number of student-athletes in athletics is 80,000-

There are 514 senior high schools affiliated with the WIAA. The estimated number of student-athletes in athletics is 80,000-85.000 annually.

Governance of the WIAA is performed by the member schools. Rules and policies of the Association are developed, promulgated and implemented by the membership either through membership vote for constitutional issues or through a membership-elected committee structure for sport seasons regulations. Therefore, ownership of the membership's rules and regulations, as well as the responsibility of compliance with them, lies with each member school.

The Development of Rules . . .

As fans watch the games during the tournament, some wonder how the rules of the game and of the WIAA were created.

♦ The National Federation of State High School Associations is the authority of the competition rules for sport contests (i.e. uniforms, length of contest, game rules). As a member of the NFHS, the WIAA adheres to those rules as a member in good standing. The WIAA, as well as all state associations in the NFHS, has input with an advisory role in the review and promulgation of the playing rules. The NFHS office is located in Indianapolis, Indiana.



- For changes to the membership's Constitution, Bylaws and Rules of Eligibility, a vote of the entire membership is required at the Annual Meeting each spring. The Constitution contains information relating to the Association as an organization. The Bylaws encompass information relating to member high schools' responsibility concerning WIAA rules and regulations. The Rules of Eligibility embody information relating to the relationship of the student-athlete to the high school and the WIAA.
- ◆ The Board of Control has the ultimate authority in determining the outcome of sport seasons rule recommendations and regulations. Changes to the sport seasons regulations are advanced through the democratic committee structure. Among the advisory groups that provide input to the Board are the coaches advisory committees for each sport; the sports advisory committee, comprised of school athletic directors from each of the seven districts; the Advisory Council, consisting of school administrators from each elector district; and the executive staff. Other groups with advisory responsibilities include the Medical Advisory Committee, Sportsmanship Committee and the Officials Advisory Committee. The Season Regulations address, among other topics, definition of the sports seasons, participation, contest control and tournament procedures.

Currently, the Association sponsors 24 sports including baseball, basketball, cross country, 8-player, 11-player football, golf, hockey, soccer, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field, volleyball and wrestling for boys; and basketball, cross country, golf, gymnastics, hockey, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and volleyball for girls.

2020 State Preview

TEAMS COMPETING: The schools qualifying for the State meet in Division 1 are Arrowhead, Brookfield Central, Cedarburg, Hortonville, Kettle Moraine, Notre Dame, Tomah and Waunakee. The team qualifiers in Division 2 are Edgewood, Freedom, Lakeside Lutheran, Prescott, St. Croix Central and The Prairie School.

DIVISION 1 INDIVIDUAL QUALIFIERS: The 12 individuals who have qualified for the State meet in Division 1 are freshman Madison Haugen of Brookfield East, senior Claire Fugate of Franklin, junior Lauren Ambrookian of Hamilton, senior Madeline Kiley of Kimberly, juniors Lanie Veenendall and Sydney Nolan of New Richmond, senior Amber Nguyen of Onalaska, senior Samantha Pendowski of Slinger, sophomore Norah Roberts of Union Grove, senior Jasmine Yang of Wausau East/West, and freshmen Kylie and Katelyn Walker of Westosha Central

DIVISION 2 INDIVIDUAL QUALIFIERS: The nine individual qualifiers in Division 2 are junior Hallie Tulip of Arcadia/Independence, senior Ashley Stanislawski of Catholic Memorial, senior Faith Flynn of Green Bay NEW Lutheran, senior Jackie Wallin of Ladysmith, senior Morgan Cooley and freshman Brianna Kirsch of Lancaster, sophomores Lydia Jensen and Elli Anderson of Regis/Altoona, and senior Lauren Haen of Xavier.

INDIVIDUAL PREVIEW-DIVISION 1: Three of the top 10 finishers from last year are back competing for medalist honors. Junior Sarah Balding of Brookfield

Central seeks to improve on her runner-up finish from a year ago. She returns to the State Meet for the third straight season, finishing 52nd as a freshman. Senior Elise Hoven of Cedarburg returns to the meet after finishing third a year ago, one stroke behind Balding, Hoven is also a three-time qualifier, placing 42nd in 2018. Another returning golfer that placed in the top 10 last year is senior Reagan Stuke of Kettle Moraine. She is back after placing in a tie for 10th. In addition to Balding and Hoven, the sectional champions competing to be in the mix for medalist honors are sophomore Grace Durkin of Notre Dame, who won the Notre Dame sectional, and junior Lanie Veenendall of New Richmond, who captured the title of the Tomah Sectional.

INDIVIDUAL PREVIEW-DIVISION 2: Four of the top 10 finishers from a year ago return to contend for the individual championship, including last season's runnerup. Sophomore Ava Salay of Prescott earned the silver medal as a freshman at last year's State Meet. Junior Sally Vangsness of St. Croix Central is back after finishing in a tie for sixth last season. A pair of experienced Edgewood teammates should also contend for the crown. Senior Caitlyn Hegenbarth qualifies for the fourth time, finishing eighth last year, fifth in 2018 and 10th in 2017. Senior Grace Jaeger is also a four-time qualifier, having placed 15th last season, third in 2018 and 15th in 2017. Senior Lauren Haen of Xavier is also a four-time qualifier with sights on a State title. She tied for ninth last season after tying for eighth in 2018 and placing 23rd in 2017, Senior Maya Heckmann of Lakeside Lutheran has finished just outside the top 10 in recent years and won the Arcadia Sectional ahead of Hegenbarth and Jaeger. She tied for 11th last season and was 12th in 2018. The other sectional champions were Salay and junior Callie Berg of Freedom, who finished tied for 17th last year,

LAST YEAR: Middleton captured the Division 1 State team title for the third time in program history with a 36-hole score of 651. Brookfield Central was runner-up at 664, and 2018 champion Kettle Moraine was third at 665. Jo Baranczyk of Bay Port was the individual medalist for the second year in a row by shooting a 36-hole score of 149. Sarah Balding of Brookfield Central finished a stroke behind with a second-place score of 148. Edgewood won its second straight Division 2 crown and its 15th overall. The Crusaders finished with a score of 702. Prescott placed a distant second with a score of 773. Grace Welch of Edgewood won individual medalist honors by shooting a 158, and Ava Salay of Prescott placed second with a 166.

2020 State Girls Golf Championship



The WIAA began its golf tournament program for girls in the fall of 1972. Madison West won the first team championship, finishing ahead of runner-up West Bend East and third-place Brookfield Central.

The first tournament was held at Winagamie, near Appleton. It has been held at various locations - Fond du Lac, Lawsonia, Wisconsin Rapids, Stevens Point, Lake Arrowhead, Janesville Riverside, University Ridge in Madison, and Cherokee Country Club in Madison in 2012. It returned to University Ridge in 2013 after course renovations were completed. The Tournament Series expanded from one division to two divisions in 2003. Amidst the COVID-19 pandemic, Blackwolf Run serves as the host of the State Championship in 2020.

Edgewood leads in number of team championships won with 15. Madison West, which won the first five State titles, and La Crosse Central are next in line with five. Appleton West, Arrowhead and Homestead have won four titles, and Madison Memorial, Middleton, Notre Dame and The Prairie School have won three.



Osceola has produced the largest number of medalists with eight. Madison Memorial has had six individual champions, and Appleton West, Edgewood and Racine Case have each produced five individual champions.

Brookfield Central has qualified a team for the State meet more than any other program with 28 appearances and next is Homestead with 27. Edgewood is next with 23 and then Arrowhead with 21, followed by Madison Memorial and Middleton with 20 appearances.

In 2008, Lindsay Danielson of Osceola became the first golfer to win four individual cham-

pionships (2005-08). Her sister, Casey Danielson, became the second individual to accomplish the feat from 2009-12. Heather Suhr of Racine Case is the only other golfer to win medalist honors three consecutive years (1996-98).

Two Madison Memorial girls--Chris Regenberg (1976-77) and Sherri Steinhauer (1979-80)--as well as Ellen Mielke of Appleton West (1985-86), Erika Brown of Madison La Follette (1989-90), Carly Werwie of Kenosha Bradford (2004-05), Tory Bauman of Nicolet (2007-08), Emily Joers of Waukesha South/North/West (2009, 11), Jessica Reinecke of Verona (2012-13) and Jo Barancyzk of Bay Port (2018-19) have won medalist honors twice.

Casey Danielson shot the best 36-hole performance in a State Meet with a 138 (69-69) at University Ridge in 2010. There have been seven hole-in-ones recorded in the State Tournament. Holly Stark of Arrowhead and Lauren Anzelone of Racine Park both scored a hole-in-one at the 2001 State Meet. Jami Kessenich of Arrowhead accomplished the feat on hole 17 at University Ridge in 2008. Aimee Tripp of Onalaska did it on hole 8 at University Ridge in 2009, and Mari Pechacek of River Falls had an ace on hole 3 at University Ridge in 2011. Megan Elmes of Madison Memorial accomplished the feat on hole 5 at Cherokee Country Club in 2012, and Mary Hommen of Cambridge did it on hole 8 at University Ridge in 2019.

Scoring & Qualifying Procedures

This is the 18th year the WIAA is sponsoring two divisions for girls golf. Schools were assigned to one of eight regionals in Division 1 and one of six regionals in Division 2 played on Setember 30-October 1. From the regionals, the top four teams and top four individuals, who are not members of one of the top four teams, advanced to one of nine sectionals. The four best scores of each team are used to determine the team score.

The first two teams and the top three individuals, who are not members of a qualifying team, will participate in the State Tournament.

Groups for Monday's play have been devel-

oped using sectional team placing as well as the individual's rank on her team. They will be grouped with players holding a similar position at another school.

Tuesday's foursomes will be designed based on the score shot by the team on Monday. Those teams with low team scores on Monday will be teeing off last. This allows teams to compete head-to-head with their competition.

Individual qualifiers will be grouped together and appropriately placed before team groupings.

At the conclusion of the meets, awards will be available at the registration table.

Playoffs will be held to determine the first place team and/or the first place individual. Playoffs are on a sudden death (hole-by-hole) basis. Duplicate medals will be awarded for ties in individual places two through six with a maximum of five medals being awarded unless there is a tie for sixth place. Hole number 1 will be the first playoff hole. All five members of a team will participate in the team playoff with the scores of the top four counted. The score of each individual is not cumulative. Results are available at the course each day or can be found on the WIAA web site www.wiaawi.org.


