# FOOTBALL

The WIAA began sponsoring a football playoff program in 1976.

Antigo (AA), Menomonee Falls East (A), Plymouth (B) and DeSoto (C) won the first championships.

The first championship playoff games were played at Oshkosh (AA), Menasha (A), Madison (B) and La Crosse (C).

The playoff program involved 4 divisions and a total of 16 teams in 1976 and 1977. It was expanded to 5 divisions and a total of 20 teams for 1978 and 1979. Division 5 (smallest schools) was given 8 playoff participants, making a total of 24, in 1980.

Beginning in 1981, the playoff program was changed to 6 divisions with 8 teams in each, a total of 48, so that all conference champions could be incorporated into the system. That plan was expanded in 1987 to 96 teams with conference runners-up as well as champions qualifying. In the first five years, participants were determined on a system ranking schools on basis of fewest losses and other factors.

When playoffs began in 1976, divisions of competition were based on average enrollment of conferences. But effective with the 1984 season, competition was based on enrollment of participants – largest schools in Division 1, next largest in Division 2, etc.

Championship games were played on many sites through the first six years of the playoffs. But in 1982, all six games were played at Camp Randall Stadium in Madison in a two-day program. That format remains in existence.

Monroe has the most titles with four; Antigo, D.C. Everest, Darlington, DeSoto, Kenosha Tremper, Manitowoc, Osseo-Fairchild, Two Rivers and Westby have won three titles and Grafton, Middleton, Milton, Monona Grove, Mosinee, Plymouth, Shell Lake, Edgar and Baldwin-Woodville two titles. Leading the way with most appearances in championship games are De Soto with six, Osseo-Fairchild and Monroe with five and Grafton, Kenosha Tremper, Mosinee, Port Washington and Westby with four. State championships have been won by 65 different schools.


