## Rural/Urban Plan

A motion was made and seconded to convene the Basketball Coaches Advisory Committee as soon as possible after the 2017 Area Meetings to review and make a formal recommendation regarding the Rural/Urban Divisional Plan for basketball as presented to the Board of Control on June 22, 2017. The recommendation of the Basketball Coaches Advisory Committee will be forwarded to the Sports Advisory Committee and the Advisory Council for specific discussion in concurrence with the fall sports review process. The Board will review recommendations and take action on this plan in January of 2018 for a potential 2018-19 implementation. Motion carried on a 8-1 vote.

## Membership Requirements

Article III-Membership
Section 2-Admission
A. Application for membership shall be considered by the Board of Control of this Association upon receipt of the form provided for such purpose of evidence that the school:

1) Minutes of school's governing board action authorizing application to the WIAA
2) The school's Board-approved extracurricular code of conduct.
3) Department of Public Instruction school identification number.
4) Indication of at least one independently sponsored, interscholastic athletic program.
5) For continued membership, schools must have administrative oversight of at least one independently sponsored interscholastic athletic program or co-op athletic program that is maintained throughout duration of membership

## Membership Requirements

## Article III-Membership

Section 2—Admission continued
A. 6) Completed WIAA membership application form provided as evidence that the school:
a. Is eligible as a public school or institution, substantially supported by taxation, and the application for membership by the public school has been approved by the school board of the school district of which the school is a part.
b. Is eligible as a nonpublic school, qualifying for Section 501(c) (3) status as a tax-exempt organization, and the application for membership by the nonpublic school has been approved by the recognized governing body of the nonpublic school.

## Membership Requirements

## Article III-Membership

Section 2-Admission continued
A. 6) c. Will conduct its athletic program under the CONSTITUTION, BYLAWS, and RULES OF ELIGIBILITY and all other regulations of this Association.
d. Agrees to abide by decisions and respect interpretations of the Board of Control of this Association.
B. A school shall be a member in good standing for one calendar year prior to programs becoming eligible for entry into Association tournaments.
C. A school shall be a member in good standing for one calendar year prior to being eligible for entering into cooperative team programming with another member school.

## 2017 Constitutional Changes

- Removal of membership dues in the Association. Also stipulation that the Board of control retains the authority to levy proportionate fees in the event of an emergency. Those assessments would be sufficient to meet the identified crisis to sustain operations and services of the organization. (391-3)
- Schools in football-only conferences that voluntarily withdraw from their $\qquad$ league will now be removed from conference schedules in all sports sponsored by the school for two years in addition to the existing four-year ban on participation in the football playoffs. (332-57)


## 2017 Constitutional Changes

- Establish a uniform date to distribute protective equipment for summertime use. All schools, with approval of their governing administration, may issue protective equipment on the Friday prior to Memorial Day. (391-3)
- Student-athletes will be permitted to receive keepsakes issued by the school that does not exceed $\$ 200$ in fair market value. Any award for athletics participation, honors or recognition that doesn't exceed $\$ 100$ in fair market value will be allowed. Students will be able to retain items of apparel
$\qquad$ that are worn as part of a team uniform in nonschool athletic competitions. (382-6)
