It will be Watertown's sixth trip to the State Tournament and the first since 2002. The Goslings previous experiences at State have produced a pair of runner-up finishes, one in 1981 and another in 1984. They are the co-champions of the Wisconsin Little Ten Conference and the Arrowhead Sectional after defeating Waukesha West in the sectional final 4-0. **Appleton East** is back at State for the fifth time and for the second year in a row. The Patriots won the State title in 2000 and followed up that with a runner-up finish in 2003. The Patriots placed second in the Fox Valley Association this season and qualified for State by shutting out Green Bay East 3-0 in the sectional final hosted by Ashwaubenon. Greenfield is appearing at State for the fourth time and for the first time since 2006. The three previous experiences have resulted in losses in the quarterfinals. The Hawks are the champions of the South Division of the Woodland Conference this season and are the winners of the sectional they hosted by virtue of a 7-5 win over Muskego in the final. Waunakee advances to State for the second time. Its only other appearance came in 1987 when the Warriors were crowned the Class B champions. This year, they won the North Division of the Badger Conference title and defeated Middleton 4-3 in eight innings in the Waunakee Sectional final. Menomonee Falls is also participating in its second State Tournament. Its only other appearance came in 2003 when the Indians fell in quarterfinals. They are the champions of the Greater Metro Conference this season. Their entry into the final field of eight was earned with an 8-0 win over Homestead in the Germantown Sectional final. Kenosha **Bradford** will make its first-ever State appearance after defeating Westosha Central 4-2 in the Verona Sectional final. The Red Devils are the champions of the Southeast Conference.

THE DIVISION 2 FIELD: Last year's runner-up **Monroe** makes its fourth appearance in the State Tournament and its second in a row. The Cheesemakers also finished runner-up in 2004 after winning the Division 2 State title in 2003. They won the Badger Conference's South Division championship this spring and shutout Edgerton 3-0 to win the Prairie du Chien Sectional title. Altoona is back in the State tourney for the sixth time and for first since winning the State championship in 2001. The Railroaders reach the final field of four this year following a 7-2 win over Rice Lake in the New Richmond Sectional final. They are the co-champions of the Western Division of the Cloverbelt Conference with Division 4 qualifier Thorp. Luxemburg-Casco qualifies for State for the second time overall and for the first time since 1998. This year's appearance comes by virtue of a 5-1 win over Winneconne in the New Holstein Sectional final. The Spartans finished fourth in the Bay Conference this season. Port Washington will make its first-ever appearance. The Pirates finished fourth in the North Shore Conference this season and advanced on the tournament path through the Waupun Sectional with a 10-2 win over Union Grove in the final.

THE DIVISION 3 FIELD: Grantsburg qualifies for the fourth time in school history and for the third time in the last four years. The Pirates won the State title in 2006. They are the champions of the West Division of the Lakeland

Conference and advanced to State through the Regis Sectional with a 7-3 win over Prescott in the final. Lancaster qualifies for the first time since finishing runner-up in its only other appearance in 2006. The Flying Arrows are the champions of the Southwest Wisconsin Conference and proceeded to win the Brookwood/Royall Sectional with a 4-0 win over Deerfield in the final. Weyauwega-Fremont qualifies for the first time since its only other appearance resulted in a runner-up finish in 2004. The Indians finished second in the Central Wisconsin 8 Conference this season. They have qualified through the Ashwaubenon Sectional with a 4-2 win over Pacelli in the final. Laconia is making its first tournament appearance. The Spartans finished runner-up in the Wisconsin Flyway Conference and earned a position in the final four with a 3-0 win over Roncalli in the Shoreland Lutheran Sectional final.

THE DIVISION 4 FIELD: Last year's runner-up Thorp qualifies for the State Tournament for the second time. The Cardinals defeated Glidden/Butternut 4-0 in the final of the Shell Lake Sectional. They are the co-champions of the Western Division of the Cloverbelt Conference this season. Oakfield is making its eighth appearance overall and its second in a row. The Oaks participated in last year's tournament in Division 3. They won the State championship in 1997. This year, they won the North Division of the Trailways Conference title. The Oaks earned their way into the State Tournament field by defeating Catholic Central in a sectional final played at Oakfield, 4-3. **Belmont** makes its fifth appearance at State and its first since finishing runner-up for the second year in a row in 2006. The Braves won the State championship in 2002. They earned a berth in this year's State Tournament with a 7-5 victory over Cochrane-Fountain City in the Independence Sectional final. They are the champions of West Division of the Six Rivers Conference. Rosholt will make its first appearance at State. The Hornets are the champions of the Central Wisconsin 10 Conference. They secured the opportunity to play for a State title by defeating Wausaukee 6-0 in the Assumption Sectional final.
