Four Fall Team Sportsmanship Award Winners Selected

STEVENS POINT, Wis. – The Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association, in cooperation with Rural Insurance, has selected the team Sportsmanship Award winners for the 2007 Fall Championships.

The winners of the prestigious award are Eleva-Strum in football, Notre Dame in boys soccer, Big Foot/Williams Bay in girls team tennis, Cuba City in girls volleyball.

It is the first time Eleva-Strum has won the Sportsmanship Award in football and the second award overall. The Cardinals received the honor for their sportsmanship during the 1989-90 boys basketball tournament. Eleva-Strum won the State Division 7 championship after finishing runner-up in 2006 by defeating Southwestern, 41-6, in the championship final. Receiving honorable mention for the award in football were Arrowhead, DeForest, Kettle Moraine Lutheran, New London, Southwestern, Stratford and West Salem.

The sportsmanship efforts of Notre Dame at the Boys State Soccer Tournament earned the school its second Sportsmanship Award. The Tritons other recognition came in girls soccer in 2002. Notre Dame defeated Catholic Memorial, 5-3, in the title game to win the Division 2 championship. Kenosha Tremper, De Pere, Hudson, Catholic Memorial, McDonell/Regis and Grafton received honorable mention for the award.

The Big Foot/Williams Bay co-op team was selected as the award winner at the Girls Tennis Team Tournament. It's the first time the programs were bestowed the honor. The Chiefs advanced to the title match in Division 2 by defeating Altoona, 6-1, in the semifinals. They finished runner-up after falling to champion University School, 5-2, in the championship final. Neenah

received honorable mention.

Cuba City received the highest evaluation score at the State Girls Volleyball Championships to win its second sportsmanship award in the sport. The Cubans also received the award for the 2003-04 tournament. They won the Division 3 championship this fall, defeating Regis in the semifinal and Oostburg in the title match. Receiving honorable mention for the award are Catholic Central, Kettle Moraine Lutheran, D.C. Everest, Menomonee Falls, Green Bay NEW Lutheran, Greenwood, Oostburg and Marathon.

While no sportsmanship award was presented in boys volleyball. Catholic Memorial and Marquette received honorable mention.

The WIAA/Rural Insurance Sportsmanship Award is presented to one school and community in each of the State team tournaments that exemplifies outstanding sportsmanship.

Award winners are determined by the conduct and sportsmanship displayed by athletes, coaches, cheer and support groups, mascots, bands and spectators. Additional consideration is given for the effort of school administrators and chaperones to insure support for their teams are positive and that the highest ideals of sportsmanship are upheld.

Award winners receive a plaque and banner in recognition of the honor. Schools receiving honorable mention are acknowledged with a certificate of recognition.

The selection process includes contributions and evaluations from contest officials, tournament management, police and security personnel, crowd control and ushers, WIAA staff members, and area hotels and restaurants on occasion. +

2007-08 NFHS Swimming & Diving Rule Books Will Be Used In 2008-09

The WIAA will be experimenting with the use of the 2007-08 NFHS Rule Books during the next two years. The current rule book that has been provided to WIAA member schools and to WIAA officials will be the rule book that will also be used during the 2008-09 Swimming and Diving season. The NFHS Swimming and Diving Rule Book is the only rule book involved in this distribution modification.

Swimming and Diving coaches and officials are asked to keep their current copy since rule books will only be provided to new coaches and officials during the 2008-09 school year. 2008-09 NFHS rule changes will be provided in an addendum format. 2007-08 Rule Books will only be distributed to schools with new coaches and to new WIAA officials during the 2008-09 school year.

The objective of the experiment is meant to identify the possibility of producing NFHS rule books on an every other year basis. Governing sport association bodies such as the United States Golf Association (USGA), the United States Tennis Association (USTA), USA Hockey and the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) are already providing rule books on an alternate year basis.

Notice of this distribution change is being provided a year in advance so that WIAA coaches and officials can be aware and prepared for this change.





2007-08 Wrestling Rules Interpretations

Publisher's Note: The National Federation of State High School Associations is the only source of official high school interpretations. They do not set aside nor modify any rule. They are made and published by the NFHS in response to situations presented.

Corrections to Rule Book: (Underlining shows additions; strikethrough shows deletions.); Page 25, Rule 5-16-3 (Reversal):. . . In awarding a reversal at the edge of the mat, control must be established while the supporting points of either wrestler. . .; Page 27, Rule 5-22-1 (Random Draw): . . . Random draw is the random selection of one of the 14 weight classes to determine the order of weight classes for the dual meet. A random draw for championship final matches for an individual tournament, regular season and/or state high school championship series, may be used for competition. . .; Page 57, Offensive Starting Position (New 5-20-6): This rule change now allows the offensive wrestler another choice from the offensive starting position after the period has started during the match. . .

Corrections to Case Book and Manual: Page 4, Offensive Starting Position (New 5-20-6): This rule change now allows the offensive wrestler another choice from the offensive starting position after the period has startedduring the match. . . .; Pages 22-23. S.11.4 SITUATION C: . . RULING: . . . COMMENT: In this situation, Wrestler A has won the match, but if the flagrant misconduct took place after the match was terminated and was called on Wrestler A, A would be be disqualified and there would be no winner of the match.

Corrections to Preseason Guide: Page 1, Second Paragraph under "New Restart Option: Neutral Position:" . . . Rule 5-20-6 allows the offensive wrestler to request a neutral position on the restart after a period has started.during the match.; Page 1, Caption under picture: . . . When wrestling resumes either to start a period or

after an out-of-bounds situation, offensivedefensive wrestlers will be able to choose a neutral position restart...; Page 4, Fourth column under "Head Coach Penalized for Improper Uniform/Equipment:"... The head coach shall not be penalized when a wrestler reports to the scorer's table withwithout headgear (PlayPic A) or shoelaces that are not properly secured (PlayPic B)...

SITUATION 1: The visiting school shows up for a dual meet. The scale the home team initially provides does not have a current certification sticker (in accordance with guidelines established by the state association). The visiting coach offers to let the home school use his scale, which is certified, that he happened to bring along. **RULING:** Correct procedure. While Rule 2-4-1 specifies, "â \in the scale shall be provided by the home team," the home team is actually providing a scale it borrowed (from the visiting team) for the match. To use the scale without a current certification sticker violates Rule 2-4-2. (2-4-1; 2-4-2)

SITUATION 2: DELETE

SITUATION 3: During a tournament, the tournament director decides to wrestle the championship final matches beginning with the 103-pound weight class but skipping the 130-pound weight class and the 160-pound weight class and wrestling those two weight classes after the 285-pound weight class because both of those bouts feature wrestlers who are undefeated for the season. **RULING:** Incorrect procedure. A random draw may be conducted to determine the order of the championship final matches only, and the draw must take place at the conclusion of weigh-ins. However, the weight classes must be wrestled in order from the first weight class drawn, without skipping certain weight classes. (1-1-2)

SITUATION 4: During a regular-season quadrangular meet, two referees are wearing a short-sleeve knit shirt with alternating

black-and-white 1-inch stripes, and the third official is wearing a short-sleeve gray knit shirt with black pinstripes. **RULING:** Illegal. All referees must be dressed alike. (3-1-1)

SITUATION 5: During a championship final match, the referee calls a caution on Wrestler A in the first period. In the second period, the referee calls a caution on Wrestler B but the official scorer inadvertently puts down a second caution on Wrestler A. During the first overtime period, the referee calls a caution on Wrestler A again. The official scorer calls the referee to the table to tell the referee that this is Wrestler A's third caution. The referee corrects the bout sheet and wrestling continues with Wrestler A having two cautions and Wrestler B having one caution. **RULING:** Correct procedure. (6-6-5a1)

SITUATION 6: Wrestler A, the offensive wrestler, is warned for stalling and the match is stopped for the warning. Before the restart, Wrestler A informs the referee that he/she wants to restart in the neutral position and wants to give Wrestler B an escape point and start in the neutral position. May Wrestler A do this in this situation? **RULING:** Yes. Even though they have not gone out of bounds, wrestling is resumed in this situation as if they had gone out of bounds. (5-20-6)

SITUATION 7: DELETE

SITUATION 8: In the first period, Wrestler A earns a takedown. No other scoring occurs until a flurry at the end of the first period in which Wrestler B earns an escape and a takedown, then Wrestler A earns an escape. The official scorer does not see the referee award Wrestler B's escape, and because of the flurry, the official scorer believes the referee was unable to give the signal for a reversal and records a reversal instead of an escape and a takedown. The scoreboard operator (not the official scorer) sees Wrestler B's escape awarded and posts it and points for the ensuing takedown. At the end of the first period, the scoreboard has a 3-3 score posted, an escape and a takedown for each wrestler, but the official scorer has recorded 3 points (takedown and an escape) for Wrestler A and only 2 points (reversal) for Wrestler B. Because the scoreboard shows a score of 3-3, the error is not challenged by Wrestler B or his coach. The match is wrestled to conclusion with each wrestler earning an additional escape, making the official scorer's score 4-3 in favor of Wrestler A. At this point, Wrestler B and his coach, both still in the mat area, point out the recording error claiming the match should be tied 4-4, and should now go into overtime. RULING: According to 2007-08 NFHS rules change, this error can be corrected prior to the offended wrestler leaving the mat area. The match would proceed to overtime. It is good practice for a referee to clarify all points awarded at the end of a flurry, and particularly at the end of a period. It is also one of the duties of the official scorer to be in constant communication with the scoreboard operator to make sure they agree. In the event of errors by the timekeeper, official scorer or referee which require additional wrestling. Rules 6-6-4a1 and 6-6-5a1 both allow the correction of such errors prior to the offended wrestler leaving the mat area. (3-3-1; 6-6-4a1; 6-6-5a1)


SITUATION 9: A wrestler advances to the championship finals of a tournament that will be held the day after the semifinals. On the day of the finals, the wrestler, who was not injured nor became ill during the tournament, fails to make weight. Does the wrestler who failed to make weight earn second place? **RULING:** No. Rule 10-2-7 states that in order to place in a tournament, a wrestler must make weight each day of the tournament. The other finalist would be awarded a forfeit for the final match. There would be no second-place winner. The wrestler who failed to make weight would lose all place points earned for his team. The wrestler who failed to make weight would retain advancement points as well as points earned for falls, forfeits, defaults, technical falls, disqualifications, decisions and major decisions for his team. (10-2-7)

weight at the weigh-in was 129 pounds, properly reports to the scorer's table to compete in the 130-pound weight class. Wrestler B then properly reports to the scorer's table, at which time Wrestler B withdraws and thus Wrestler B is awarded a victory by disqualification in the 130-pound weight class. Wrestler A then again reports to the scorer's table as the competitor in the 135-pound weight class. RULING: Wrestler A is ineligible to compete in the 135-pound weight class even though his weigh-in weight qualifies him to compete at that class. Once a wrestler properly reports to the scorer's table and is then withdrawn, he/she is disqualified (Rule 5-8) from competition in the dual meet because "No wrestler shall represent the school in more than one weight class" (Rule 1-2-2). Wrestler A has already represented his school at the 130-pound weight class and then was disqualified by his withdrawal. (1-2-2; 5-8)


SITUATION 11: Wrestler A takes a second injury time-out at the conclusion of the first period. Wrestler B is now given the choice at the start of both the second and third periods. During the second period, Wrestler B now takes a second injury time-out. Who has choice on the restart and does Wrestler B still get choice at the start of the third period? RULING: On the restart in the second period after Wrestler B has taken a second injury time-out, Wrestler A would now have choice of top, bottom or neutral position on the restart only. Also, Wrestler B would no longer have choice at the start of the third period because the second injury time-out has been used. Wrestler B could still have the option to start the third period if it was his/her choice because of the rotation determined by the pre-meet choice with the flip of the disk. **COMMENT:** If the second wrestler, during the course of the match, takes a second injury timeout, the choices in place for this wrestler should be disregarded. New choice(s) should be issued to the opponent based on the second injury time-out procedure. (1-2-6, 8-2-1)

SITUATION 12: A match is still tied at the conclusion of the one-minute sudden victory period in overtime. The referee penalizes Wrestler A for unsportsmanlike conduct: (a) prior to the start of the first 30-second tiebreaker; (b) in between the conclusion of the first 30-second tiebreaker and the start of the second 30-second

John Olson to Receive First NIAAA Frank Kovaleski Professional Development Award



INDIANAPOLIS, IN (November 29, 2007) as well as assistant director of the NFHS, — John Olson, CMAA, longtime athletic administrator from the Madison (Wisconsin) Metropolitan School District, is the first recipient of the inaugural Frank Kovaleski Professional Development Award presented by the National Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association (NIAAA).

The Frank Kovaleski Professional Development Award is presented each year to a NIAAA member who possesses and has contributed to the vision of professional development – the legacy of Frank Kovaleski – and who has made significant contributions and demonstrated excellence in professional development at the local, state and national levels. Kovaleski was director of the NIAAA,

from 1989 until his retirement in January 2005. He was responsible for starting the NIAAA Leadership Training Program in 1996 and expanding the NIAAA Certification Program in 1999.

Olson, one of the most respected high school athletic administrators in the United States, who was inducted into the National High School Hall of Fame in 2000, retired from the Madison (Wisconsin) Metropolitan School District in 1998. In an exemplary career there that spanned 39 years, Olson taught science and physical education, coached football, and served as high school athletic director, assistant principal, district administrator of athletics and assistant superintendent of the school district.


A lifelong resident of Madison, Olson attended grade school, junior high school and senior high school there. He then attended the University of Wisconsin, where he majored in biology, general science and physical education. While there, he rowed on the UW crew team and was a member of the national championship Badgers team in 1959.

That same year, he graduated with the first of his three degrees from the Madison campus, and subsequently joined the Madison School District.

Initially assigned as a general science teacher with coaching assignments in football, basketball and track at Central High

School, Olson helped open James Madison Memorial High School in 1967, where he was head football coach and athletic director. At Memorial, Olson's teams won several conference championships.

In 1974, Olson moved fulltime into school administration, and from 1980 to 1987, he taught in the University of Wisconsin School of Education. Olson then returned to the Madison schools as assistant superintendent, and district administrator for security services and athletics programs.

In addition to his heavy involvement with the Wisconsin Athletic Directors Association and the Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association, Olson made enormous contributions to the National Federation of State High School Associations and the NIAAA. One of his key contributions in that regard has been in the field of writing.

Olson served on the NIAAA Publications Committee for 13 years, during which time he developed and published 90 articles and research pieces for the Interscholastic Athletic Administration journal and began development of the Leadership Training Program.

Olson also was a contributing editor and moderator for the annual Blue Ribbon Panel discussion of contemporary issues and problems at the National Conference of High School Directors of Athletics.

Olson is also the chief writer and editor of "Athletic Administrators Reference Manual," a comprehensive resource book of the best practices and state-of-the-art professional methods and strategies for athletic ad-

ministrators.

Along the same time, Olson also maintained active military reserve status and was activated for Operation Desert Storm (1990) and Operation Uphold Democracy (1994). Appointed as NIAAA Director of Curriculum in 1998, Olson has since authored 13 Leadership Training courses and edited all 30 of the courses currently available to NIAAA members.

Among his recognitions, Olson has been inducted into the National Council of Secondary School Athletic Administrators Hall of Fame, the Madison Sports Hall of Fame and the Wisconsin High School Football Coaches Hall of Fame. He also is the recipient of both the NIAAA Award of Merit and the NFHS Citation. ÷





Hockey Rule Interpretations

OUESTION: After receiving four penalties in a game, must the player receiving these four penalties be removed from the remainder of the contest?

INTERPRETATION: Yes, WIAA Season Regulations, 15., b., Any player receiving a total of four penalties (minor, major, or misconduct) in a game shall be removed from participation for the balance of that game. This does not include bench penalties served by the player or violations resulting in penalty shots. The ejection is not considered a game misconduct or game disqualification.

QUESTION: A minor penalty was assessed on Team A at the 10:55 mark of the third period. Before the stoppage of play, a minor penalty was assessed on Team B. Are these coincidental penalties and do the teams play five on five or four on four?

INTERPRETATION: NFHS Rule 4-2, Art. 7,

Immediate substitution may be made for an equal number of coincident minor penalties assessed to each team. Each penalized player shall report immediately to the respective penalty bench and shall not return to the ice until the first stoppage of play following expiration of the full penalty time. The penalty times of the players for whom substitutions have been made under this rule shall begin immediately

QUESTION: Is there a "warning" in a WIAA hockey game for not using a mouth-guard?

INTERPRETATION: No, NFHS Rule 3-4-4 indicates: All players, including goalkeepers, shall wear and have properly inserted into their mouth during the course of play a dental guard which should cover all the remaining teeth of one jaw.

PENALTY: For initial violation, offending player shall be immediately replaced on the ice, and the referee shall warn the offending team that subsequent violations by any player of that team shall result in the player being assessed a misconduct. GOALKEEPER-Minor.

QUESTION: Can a JV game be officiated by 2 officials, or does there need to be 3 to start the game? I'm looking in the NFHS rules book and it only says that a game shall be officiated by either a two or three official system. I know you need 3 for a varsity game. Can you clarify for me?

INTERPRETATION: WIAA Sr. High School Handbook, page 52, indicates-"Hockey (3)-Referee, Assistant Referee, and Linesman-at all levels of competition.

Three (3) WIAA registered ice hockey officials are required in order for an ice hockey

QUESTION: I have been approached by a few of the players that were cut from the team that would be interested in practicing with the JV team but not playing in any games. Our coach is very interested in having the guys come out and have a red shirt type of season where they can work on their skills and become stronger skaters but not play in any games. We would also outline with these guys the team rules and the expectations for the season. They could also participate with the team as managers or assist the team with stats or other needed activities. Is there a problem with this at all? We would discuss it with all the current players

as well to make sure that they understand what the program is all about.

What do you think?

INTERPRETATION: Past history in ice hockey has been to "cut" student-athletes and then they are allowed to return to non-school (WAHA) teams. Keep in mind that any student-athlete who is "cut" can be asked to return to the school team one time during the season. If a player returns to the school team and then competes on a non-school team, they are no longer allowed to compete with the school team. In the meantime, a studentathlete can be practicing and/or competing with a non-school team.

If a school wishes to keep players they have "cut" and practice with them, the school is allowed to do so. There are no limits during the regular season to the number of players on a school team's bench. The school could develop an additional schedule for them if they so choose to do so and are able to gain governing body support. Having student-athletes only practice with/against the varsity team can develop into difficult situations and may be an issue that school administrators want to think very carefully about.

In the email the term "red-shirting" is used. Please keep in mind there is no shirting" for high school student-athletes. Each student-athlete has four years of eligibility beginning with the start of their freshmen year. You may wish to review WIAA Rules at a

Regarding players remaining as managers,

statisticians, etc., school programs are certainly allowed to have student-athletes handle these positions. Keep in mind, they are limited and during the tournament series do have limitations to the number of coaches, managers, and players allowed in the box.

QUESTION: Both teams are at even strength. Team A commits a minor penalty. The referee has a delayed penalty signal. Team B maintains control of the puck and scores a goal before team A can gain control of the puck. The penalty to team A is then washed. A goal is applied. The question is: Does the Team A players name go on the score sheet?

INTERPRETATION: For a penalty to count against a player' record (and for recording on the game score sheet) the penalty must be assessed, recorded AND served (all 3 must be

QUESTION: We would like to do a fundraiser of some sort with our hockey team for a local cancer campaign. Can we start a program where our team can be involved in a donation for the number of goals we score in a game?

INTERPRETATION: In simplest terms -





bling" which accompany fundraisers based on performance in competition/outcomes of games... our membership has zero interest in embracing this style of fundraiser.

Fundraisers based on - yards rushed, takedowns, shots on goal, goals scored...free-throws/assists, etc., ...etc., any/all of these (and others) are not acceptable/appropriate school/program fundraisers when connected to performance in a competition with another school.

Activities like shoveling snow, getting groceries, running errands, raking a yard, etc., for a donation or a specific price are all acceptable programs for a high school team to be involved.

QUESTION: Can a school hockey program scrimmage a WAHA non-school hockey team?

INTERPRETATION: No, WIAA Winter Season Regulations, page 22, 4., a. indicates that one scrimmage, over one day, <u>with another school, or schools,</u> may be conducted in addition to the maximum allowed games, meets, or contests . . .

If a non-school program is included in a scrimmage, the scrimmage must be counted as one of the school team's 20 contests.

QUESTION: Can the scorebook and/or scoreboard be used during scrimmages?

INTERPRETATION: No, neither the scorebook nor the scoreboard can be used during a scrimmage. WIAA Winter Season Regulations, page 23, 4., a., (4).

If a scorebook and/or scoreboard is used during a scrimmage, the scrimmage must be counted as one of the 20 contests for the school team's involved.

QUESTION: Can high school hockey teams play two games in one day?

INTERPRETATION: Yes, NFHS and WIAA language remains silent regarding the number of contests in one day. Each game played does count as one of the 20 maximum contests allowed during the regular season.

QUESTION: Is there a limit to the number of contests a hockey player who plays both JV and varsity can compete in during the regular season?

INTERPRETATION: No, WIAA regulations remain silent regarding the number of contests during the regular season. It is the responsibility of a coach to be particularly concerned about overexposing students to the point of adversely affecting their health and safety. It is highly recommended that coaches who use players at more than one level of competition document the number of periods played for each individual.

QUESTION: Doesn't the WIAA five period regulation prevent two hockey games from being played in one day?

INTERPRETATION: No, the language related to playing in five periods in one day is for contests at two different levels. In other words, if a player goes from the JV to the varsity level, they may only compete in a maximum of five periods on that day.

As the regulation reads, coaches are also reminded that it is the responsibility of the coach to be particularly concerned about the overexposing students to the point of adversely affecting their health and safety. It is highly recommended that coaches who use players at more than one level of competition document the number of periods played for each individual.

QUESTION: We have blown an air horn located outside the rink at the south end and opposite the spectator seating when we scored a goal in our var-

sity hockey games. The question is: Are we in violation of the rules or abusing the rules by doing this only for our home team?

INTERPRETATION: During the regular season, matters of neutrality for contests are the responsibility of the conference (if a conference game) or the host school (if a non-conference game). During the WIAA Tournament Series, the WIAA has responsibility for matters like this.

In ice hockey, the use of "Foghorns" whether recorded or live has become quite popular during recent years. The problem with the use of "Foghorns" is that a minor official, who is to be as neutral as possible, is usually responsible for blowing the foghorn. The WIAA informs host schools during our tournament series that if a foghorn is to be blown following a goal for the host school, it must also be blown following the scoring of a goal by the visiting team. Otherwise, it should not be blown at all.

During the regular season, this is a regulation that many schools and conferences have applied to their school contests. Many times, because there are also non-school contests played at rinks, this is misapplied.

QUESTION: My son would like to play hockey but the school has no team. Can he play on a different high school team?

INTERPRETATION: Unless a co-op is established or if the student is still in 9th or 10th grade, the only options that now exist for this situation is for a family to make a full and complete move into a new community where the school in that community has ice hockey or play on nonschool programs.

Parents need to contact their school's ath-

letic director in these situations if they have a student in 9th or 10th grade or attending a junior high school or a middle school.

QUESTION: During the pre-game warm ups, a team moves the goal from its correct position to a spot along the boards half way between the goal line and the blue line. They place one goalie in front of that goal, the other goalie at a similar spot on the other side of the ice, and play a three-on-three mini scrimmage. Is this acceptable? My view is that is n't. There is no protective netting in front of the seating area for one, so a tipped shot could go straight up into the stands. It seems dangerous to me. Could you clarify?

INTERPRETATION: Most rinks now provide netting around the goal areas. This netting is not provided in many rinks around the entire rink. When a rink does not have netting encircling the entire rink or when a warm-up procedure described above is used without netting behind the goal, obvious liability/risk issues can easily develop.


This is a local-school-team-coach decision;

This is a local-school-team-coach decision; however, the best advice is not to move the goal to an area where there is no netting provided behind an area where student-athletes are taking shots.

QUESTION: Do hockey uniforms have to have numbers on their sleeves?

INTERPRETATION: Yes, NFHS Rule 2-1-2 indicates that all players shall wear numbered uniforms. It is required that all players be numbered with at least 10-inch (25.4 cm) high Gothic, colored numbers on the back of their jerseys and the same numbers at least 4 inches (10.16 cm) in height on both sleeves of the jersey. The color of the numbers shall contrast with the color of the jersey. +

Wrestling Questions & Answers

- **Q.:** When a wrestler has a pre-existing medical condition that requires intravenous fluids on a regular basis, can he compete if administered the day of the competition?
- A.: Based only on this, I cannot give a simple yes or no. This should be addressed in advance of competition with WIAA would require input from WIAA Medical Advisory as well as specific details from primary care physician.
- **Q.:** Can the opponent of a wrestler that uses 5 minutes of blood time default the match?
- A.: Yes. The rule says you may default to your opponent "at any time".
- Q.: May a wrestler report to the table, check in, and then default the match?
- A.: Yes. Again, the rule says you may default "at any time".
- **Q.:** If you get your skinfold test after Dec. 25, what growth allowances do you get before you wrestle your lowest predicted weight?
- A.: You get all growth allowances at all weights above your lowest predicted weight. You will need to make scratch weight the first time you weigh in at your lowest predicted weight class.
- **Q.:** When should the seeding meeting start at regionals?
- A.: Immediately following the weigh-in. We are allowing schools to declare their entries prior to the start of the seeding meeting, so it is in our best interest to start the meeting immediately.
- **Q.:** At regional competition, may the host school run off a copy of the weigh-ins and distribute it prior to the seeding meeting?
- A.: Yes, if this practice does not delay the onset of the seeding meeting.
- **Q.:** Does a wrestler have to wear a mouth guard to cover the braces, or may he wear a "snap on" plastic cover that snaps onto the braces?
- A.: If the snap on plastic cover adequately covers the braces, this should be legal. However, it must be examined and approved by the referee.
- **Q:** If a wrestler spits out the mouth guard, what are the referee's options?
- A.: More then likely the first time this occurs the referee will call a time out when there is insignificant action. He will encourage the wrestler to keep it in his mouth at all possible. If it happens again, it could be considered to be delaying the match, which of course would be called as stalling.
- **Q.:** If the defensive wrestler gets in a referee's position and the offensive wrestler now indicates he wants to start in a neutral position. What is the call?
- A.: The first time this occurs it will more then likely be a caution and the referee will honor his request. Inform the wrestler that he must make a decision before the defensive man resets. If this happens again it could be considered stalling and perhaps in some situations even unsportsmanlike conduct.
- **Q.:** When is the offensive wrestler able to choose the neutral position?
- A.: Think of it this way. Anytime a wrestler could choose the optional start, he may also choose neutral. Off course, the defensive wrestler will be awarded 1 point for an escape.
- **Q.:** If a wrestler does not weigh in on day 1 of the team state tournament, may he weigh in on day 2?
- A.: Yes Review Wrestling Season Regulations regarding Team State on p. 64, which provide that rosters may be changed from one weigh-in to the next during this tournament series.
- **Q.:** At an out-of-state multiple event, some teams from other states weigh in at 12:00 noon and the competition begins that evening. May we weigh in shoulder to shoulder with the other teams or must we wait to 1-2 hours prior to competition?
- A.: National Federation and WIAA rules governing weigh-ins require they be conducted in accordance with rule 4-5-2 (one to two hours prior to competition in a dual meet/tournament). There is no waiver of this provision.
- **Q.:** When awarding a takedown at the edge of the mat, do you award the takedown to the potential scoring wrestler if he has control around the ankles of the defensive wrestler and finishes with his toes in bounds?

- A.: Your guideline should be: If you would award that as a takedown in the 10 foot circle, then it is a takedown. In the situation you described, it would not be a takedown. Control is established when the scoring wrestler has control around the knees or above the knees. That means his arms must be approximately at the knees, or at least the scoring wrestlers shoulders forced against the knees. For example, arms may be wrapped around mid calf, but finishes with shoulders at knee level with force against the knees. This is supported by pictures 12-14 in the NFHS rule book.
- Q.: Is there a time period that the DXA body scan skinfold test has to be done after the second skinfold for a wrestler. In the rules it says 14 days for the second skinfold after the first skin fold. However, it doesn't say anything about time for the DXA body scan. Also, is there a maximum or minimum of a 1/2 pound gain/loss per day also from the time of the skinfold to the DXA body scan?
- A.: DXA 'rules' are the exact same as for underwater weighing. If done as part of appeal process must be within the 14 days and wrestler may not have competed. If access comes as result of special re-weigh, those rules hold true. Same as in ALL other circumstances either skinfold appeal and/or weigh-in for competition wrestler may not lose more then .5 lb./day (or gain more then same for appeal).
- Q.: I have a wrestler who is taking his ACT test this upcoming Saturday, on which we also have a wrestling tournament. Is it WIAA okay, if he would come to the tournament late? This would require him to weigh-in after the "official weigh-in" was done. He thinks he would be at the tournament around noon. Please let me know if this is permissible.
- A.: There is considerable precedent for allowing a student to arrive ASAP after such scenarios as you describe above - and to be allowed to weigh-in individually...immediately upon arrival. KEYS: So long as there is no objection from any participating teams/host/coaches, and so long as there is no indication of manipulation/abuse/circumvention of the rule. We in this office and the wrestling coaches as well as officials have generally supported the idea of wanting kids to compete under such circumstances. If host 'OK's' this, to create awareness, they should alert head of officials, make plans for athlete to be transported...officials can be prepared/notified to address weigh-ins. Host should also alert other schools. Would be most appropriate for this to be discussed/approved, etc., by
- **Q.:** At the beginning of the 2nd or 3rd period can a wrestler signal the "optional" start and the official just start the wrestlers on their feet... or can this new rule only be applied once a period has begun and there is some sort of break in the action... out-of-bounds, stalling, etc.?
- A.: If at the start of the 2nd or 3rd period, the wrestler with choice chooses the down position. Can his opponent signal the neutral position to the referee? Yes, the referee will signal the neutral position and then award one point and start the period with both wrestlers in the neutral position. Use this as a guideline. Anytime the offensive wrestler could choose the optional start, then he may also choose "neutral." Off course, the defensive wrestler will then be awarded 1 point escape.
- **Q.:** Is it against the WIAA rules to video tape a high school wrestling match. (Two other schools than the team my son is on.)
- A.: WIAA rules are silent in this area. Thus it is not prohibited. Just the same, it is the sort of thing which can trigger irrational/emotional response/reaction, nonetheless. This potential for emotional fires can be stemmed somewhat by being addressed with your school's AD. He may want to touch base with other member schools in advance to let them know your coming. Also if/when video is used to same-day scout the 'next opponent' it would disqualify the wrestler as video scouting the same day is prohibited. Good question to ask in advance.
- **Q.:** Our wrestlers took the skinfold test on Thursday, November 29. After entering the data and looking at the results, I have a question re-

- garding the first date of eligibility. Let me explain my question this way: Say we have a wrestler who weighed 126 the day of the skinfold and his minimum weight class is 125. My assertion is that he should be eligible for 125 THE NEXT DAY since he can lose 1/2 pound the day of the skinfold (after his weight was recorded) and 1/2 pound the next day. Track/wrestling would report his earliest date of eligibility as 2 days from the skinfold date. The reason I ask is that some of our kids would be eligible for a weight class on the Saturday of our first tournament (Dec. 8) if my assumption is correct. According to Track/wrestling, they would not be eligible until the next day. To me, it seems like a similar situation to the end of the season situation where a wrestler can drop 4 pounds between conference and regionals
- A.: Given the unknowable amount of weight loss which often precedes the skinfold day we DO NOT begin the count on the day of assessment always Day 1 is the day following and the days to being eligible are determined from that day the day after the test.
- Q.: I have a wrestler who would like to appeal his first measurement. Unfortunately, it is past the 14 days for a remeasurement. I looked into the underwater weighing procedure to see if that was an option. Unfortunately, the rules state: If being underwater weighed as provided in the minimum weight appeal process, to appeal the original skinfold measurement, the only prereguisite is that the underwater re-weigh must be done before the wrestler's first competition. Once a wrestler competes, they are no longer able to access underwater weighing as part of the appeal process (another deadend). I then read the next paragraph entitled "Underwater Re-weigh via Special Re-Weigh Provision. It states: Underwater Re-weigh via Special Re-Weigh Provision: Only wrestlers, who with parental permission are within two (2) pounds of a lower weight class as determined by their original skinfold measurement and minimum weight projection printout may be hydrostatically reweighed at any time during the season, up to 15 days prior to regionals (January 25, 2008), whether the athlete has competed or not. I believe this option is open to my wrestler. So here is my question--my wrestler's body fat with parental permission was 127-pounds. If I'm interpreting the rules right--that means he is within 2-pounds of 125 with parental permission; consequently, he can do an underwater weighing anytime prior to Regionals. Is my assumption right?
- A.: If your figures are correct so is your interpretation that the wrestler could compete at 130 and still be underwater weighed up until 1-25-08.
- Q.: I was writing to inquire about the rule change made for wrestlers with braces. (4-2-5 NEW - Each contestant who has braces or has a special orthodontic device on his or her teeth. shall be required to wear a tooth and mouth protector.) We have a wrestler on our team who has both upper and lower braces in his mouth. He has been fitted for a mouthpiece, but has an extremely hard time breathing during practices and matches when his mouthpiece is in. We had our first competition last night and he came off the mat in a panic, claiming he couldn't breathe. I guess my question is; is this a common complaint with this rule change? And is there anything that can be done for this? I realize this is early in the season, but I'm curious as to what I should suggest the rest of the way. Could you email me any help that you would suggest?
- A.: Understandable the difficulty breathing. Find a rubber/plastic, moldable mouth piece that is hinged in the back...so it will stay in place on both upper and lower braces - but open when the mouth opens. If I were coaching and could find no other options, I would experiment with a couple varieties of inexpensive football-style, moldable mouth quards and first fit one on the lower teeth - working hard to suction a secure fit. Then one on the upper teeth. I might shave a little of the thickness away from the top/bottom bite surface areas - in attempting to get a little more comfort. I might even try putting two on simultaneously and biting together and fitting while still moldable. But before you go to the basement work shop, do a little checking around. There are mouth guards out there with either a hinge and/or a formed/built

- in air way. Dave Miller at All-American Wrestling has some options. 888-285-2228
- **Q.:** What is the regulation on inviting other JV teams to compete prior to a varsity dual? For example, if I'm hosting a dual, and neither team's JV wrestlers match up, can I invite other teams to bring their JV's to provide opportunities for the JV kids to wrestle?
- A.: Please see Winter Season Regulations p.44, State Association Regulations i.
- Q.: If a wrestler skinfolds and has a 7% of 108.0 and a 5% of 106.0, that qualifies him to wrestle at 112. When the wrestlers receive the additional pounds (growth allowance) in January and February, would that wrestler be able to wrestle 103 with parental permission? (His 5% weight of 106) Also, when the wrestler is given a pound allowance for multiple days of competition, if it allows him to weigh 106, would he be allowed to compete in the 103 (106) weight class?
- A.: No. A wrestler is never able to be eligible for a weight class they do not qualify for based on minimum weight procedures as a result of growth allowance. Using your example: When 103 becomes 106 your wrestler is expected to be weighing (and is not eligible below) 109. Everybody is expected to grow. Also see Winter Season Regs. p. 47, #6 NOTE.
- Q.: Question 100 on the rule test says, "Failure to verify entries by a stipulated deadline or by the completion of weigh-ins shall result in disqualification from a tournament." According to the rule book, this answer is true. It is my understanding that in Wisconsin, we have until the seeding meeting begins to verify entries. Is my understanding correct?
- A.: Your understanding is correct, our 'stipulated deadline' is up to / prior to the seed meeting beginning. Remains a 'true' answer.
- O.: I have a question about the weigh-in procedure when wrestling in MI. We are located in northern WI and often wrestle with MI teams. In the past it was simple; when we wrestle there we follow their rules and when they come here they follow our rules. Now it seems as if the new rule will make it impossible to wrestle across the border. For example we wrestle at one particular tournament and have done so for years. As a MI school they have Friday night weigh-ins for Saturday tournaments. There are only 3 WI teams in this tournament and the MI schools are not going to do Saturday morning shoulder to shoulder weigh-in. We have no choice but to follow their rules or drop out of the tournament. This is a great tourney for my wrestlers as we get to see many MI teams and wrestlers that we do not see anywhere else in the season. I feel that this rule needs to be reevaluated and justified. I am looking for guidance as to how we can follow the WI rule yet participate in MI tournaments. We have many MI teams that participate in our wrestling invite and they have never objected to Saturday morning shoulder to shoulder weighins. How do I handle this situation?
- A.: When I have spoken with other MI hosts, I have explained to them they should provide you an opportunity to weigh in the day/morning of the event within the hour or two as is prescribed by the National Federation wrestling rules which our membership has chosen to abide by and adhere to.
- Q.: We schedule each year a wrestling invite on the third weekend in January. This year, it is January 18/19. The question comes in regards to weight allowances. Since our tournament is after Christmas, it is our understanding that we should give a 2 lb. growth allowance. In addition, we have a number of teams who will wrestling on Thursday prior to our event, so they should get a 1 lb. allowance in addition for a total maximum of 3 lbs. Is that correct? With our tournament going into Saturday, would they then be eligible for 1 additional for a 2 lb. consecutive days of wrestling allowance, giving a 4 lb. allowance on Saturday, or does it max out at 3 lbs.?
- A.: On Dec. 25, 103 becomes 105, e.g. and so on. WIAA rules provide that teams may receive a maximum total of 1 lb. allowance for successive days of wrestling. See, Winter Season Regulations, p. 44 State Assoc. Regulations, c. In your example you 'max out' at 3 lbs. +

Eligibility Questions & Answers

Residence & Transfer

Q.: Second-semester sophomore student wants to transfer from (private school) back to the public school in her district of residence within the next couple of weeks. As I read the rule, she can do so but she's ineligible for competition for the remainder of this school year although, with written consent of both schools, she could compete at a non-varsity level. 1) Am I correct in my interpretation and, 2) what's her status next year assuming she stays here?

A.: Yes, 365 days of restricted/nonvarsity eligibility for one calendar year from date of enrollment with you.

Q.: What happens if we do not have a JV girls team? Can a 10th grader who transferred and is eligible to play non-varsity, play on the varsity squad?

A.: Not having sub-varsity programming does not mitigate the member's transfer rules. Student remains ineligible, but could be allowed to practice, since he/she is a 10th grader.

Q.: We had a student move into our district two weeks ago and would like to wrestle on our wrestling team. He is a junior and transferred from X high school. His parents just recently divorced and his mother is originally from town, so she moved back with her son. He played JV soccer in X during the fall season and wrestled the past two years there. I received his physical card and the eligibility verification of transfer student from X and want to check on his status with the WIAA. I am assuming that he will be able to compete on the JV level, but I am unsure of his varsity status. Please let me know if he will be eligible for any varsity competition.

A.: First, when these events are real and 'fresh' - in email form this may come across as insensitive - it is the format and not the true feeling. Just want to acknowledge that first. Unless/until we are able to verify this situation, the rule provides that a transfer after fourth semester is not able to practice or compete - at any level. When was divorce finalized? You may want to direct mom to write up her story and bring to you. Might include the last page of the signed/dated divorce document. Are there other children? Have they relocated as well? Is family living with other family members? Renting? If/when this sort of 'fresh/current' event triggers a complete/total move - there is considerable precedent for relief. Have parent write it up, bring to you. You may put together the cover letter requesting res/transfer waiver.

Amateur Status

Q.: Is it acceptable for several students to accept monetary support from local businesses to pay some of or all of the costs associated with a club sport (club soccer) during the offseason? Or does this threaten their amateur status? Apparently, three or four students want to play in a club soccer league in Milwaukee (I am assuming during the winter) which costs \$900. They are wondering if local businesses or individuals can assist in paying some of or all of this fee. Does this threaten their amateur status?

A.: Simple answer is no, not automatically a violation. This has unsavory potentials; e.g., when your kid gets money, because he's 'pretty good,' but when my kid asks is denied...arguably in that scenario this becomes amateur status rooted – benefit/perk, based on your success/celebrity as athlete. Do you really wish to promote local business being hit yet again for personal interests of this kind? Help get kids a job. But the essence remains, 'no, not a violation out of hand.'

Q.: On page 34 of the Senior High Handbook (Article IV, Section I of the rules of eligibility it lists those items that are permitted and those which are prohibited. One of the items that is prohibited is "balls". Then it refers to Bylaws Article XI-Awards. On page 29, (Article XI-awards, section 1A of the Bylaws) it lists "game balls" as a permitted award. So that I can clarify this to my committee members, is there a distinction between "balls" and "game balls" or is this a typo?

A.: A 'game ball' is typically 'awarded'

post game for 'special' performance/achievement/extra-special contributions. Made to team for "tonight's victory," sometimes signed by all team mates and coaches. Most typically ends up on a shelf or case, POWERFUL when presented by team/coaches. Game balls awarded in this manner, are seen the same as trophy only more special. But nonetheless - a 'symbolic' award when given in this manner. Obviously, there are times when my skill and/or celebrity as an athlete could see me presented with a ball or balls as product and/or perk and/or benefit, e.g., "since winning regional golf/tennis last spring, now every time I go to the club I get a free bucket or bin of balls." This would be a big problem. Hitting closest to the pin or longest drive, I won a summer long supply of golf balls. Again, nothing symbolic in this. It's product/merchandise based, won for performance/achievement as an athlete. For making the winning basket, the local dealer gave me a brand new basketball of my own, just to shoot around

Q.: Someone wants to buy basketball shoes for our three boys teams. Is this legal? Red flags just went up when they told me.

A.: Shoes – just given to athletes - would be an amateur status violation. If the benefactor wished to 'gift' the school district and in turn you wished to issue shoes to your teams, you could do that. They then become school property issued just like shoulder pads and should be collected and reissued or collected and discarded following the season in accordance with school board policy. Also see Art. IV, Rules of Eligibility p. 34, Section 1B-1c. I would also recommend there be administrative discussion on the topic from a gender equity perspective – is there anyone who will provide the same for the girls?

Competition & Practice

Q.: Concerning our middle school girls basketball team, the non-school county team they play on has an opportunity to conduct an unscored seven to eight minute exhibition at the half time of a women's MATC basketball game with another team. The date of the exhibition is after the club season is done and after the second day we start the season for the MS girls. Does an exhibition of this type fall into the definition of a game meet or contest for in season competition?

A.: Yes. And as you are obviously aware is that once your school season begins, this would violate Art. V (Middle Lvl ROE) non-school competition rules and kids would not be eligible for the rest of the season. If this is really special and important, something you really want to do for the kids to experience, delay the start of your school season for a day or two (if schedules for first game and min. days of practice allow).

Q.: We have three varsity boys basketball players serving suspensions for alcohol violations. They are serving five game suspensions. My question is this: Can a non-varsity game such as a varsity reserve game be counted as one of those 5 games? Is this something that is left up to the individual school. We were hoping to have the suspensions completed after our two varsity games this week. If we have a weather related problem this week, that may not happen and we do have varsity reserve games scheduled for Saturday. I know the coach was planning on playing all three of them in those games so they could catch up on some playing time.

A.: You will need to determine - what level these kids play at. Are they varsity regulars? If so they miss the varsity games. The suspension must be served by missing the appropriate game. If the athlete was slated to play in the varsity game, he serves his suspension by missing that game. If he normally would not play in that game, he must miss the junior varsity game.

Participation Issues

Q.: If our high school has a foreign ex-

change student in our school, and they meet all of our school's requirements for participating in our WIAA sponsored athletic programs, is there any reason why they can't be a player on a varsity team? Some of our coaches believe that they're only eligible to play at the JV level. I believe that they should be eligible for varsity competition, but there seems to be some discrepancy among some of our coaches whether or not this is true - please help to clarify this.

A.: This topic is thoroughly addressed on p. 33 of the Handbook. Rules of Eligibility, Art. II, Sect. 4. The form is available on our website (download a current one each year). Complete and mail or fax. WIAA will determine status based upon the information contained in the application

Q.: I have a high school student that has just returned to school and is on a modified schedule which means he is here from 8:00-11:30. My question is the students need to be here the entire day of a game and the day after- so is he in fact eligible to participate?

A.: The daily attendance requirement is your rule - you will need to interpret and reconcile such a circumstance within your policy. The WIAA, however, does require a student be enrolled as a full-time student...and meet all expectations as every other fulltime student - without exceptions (see Handbook, p. 35 Art. V, Section 1A- NOTE). If there is some circumstance that prohibits this student from being treated as / held accountable as every other full-time student, perhaps we should discuss.

Q.: We have a student who is a fourth year student yet is considered a freshman due to credit deficiency. This student has an IEP and is enrolled as a full-time student. During the first quarter the student had poor attendance and multiple failing grades. There was an IEP which created a schedule change on 10/29 and 10/30 to assign this student community-based classes, including a job. The first quarter ended on 11/7. The current report card lists grades as CP (continuing progress) which is a passing mark. We see some potential issues with this scenario and would like to try to clear them up sooner rather than later.

A.: On one level you might say that so long as student is enrolled as full-time student and is meeting the academic standard - they may be considered eligible. And it is permissible for an IEP to prescribe non-traditional grades. This circumstance may not be as simple as that. You have a fourth year freshman (who does not appear interested in coming to school). So, an IEP prescribes 'community based courses' seeking to make student eligible? Your note and description raise countless questions. Not knowing your district's policy and SOP in this regard, best I can do is point out what some of the obvious questions/concerns might be and encourage you to be thorough in exploring. You will want to be bullet proof. This is bound to raise evebrows and call into question the district's credibility/integrity. It will bring close scrutiny from within your own district, instructional community, as well as within your conference and region. Has this student ever/already had an IEP? Why the change in, or to an IEP now? The potential elements inherent in what you describe certainly sound different then/more than standard operating policy/procedure. What happened to the original course grades? Was student able to withdraw from those courses without any trace or record? When? Is that normal and according to district policy/procedure? I would advise extreme caution/thoroughness in this review. If in this action the result is in effect, allowing for other students would be recorded as failures, to 'have classes or grades disappear' ought to be questioned. Has the redesign of the IEP as well as the timing of it been done in complete accordance with district policy for such matters - as well as failing grades being changed

to 'progress', if that's what's occurred? As I expressed in our phone conversation, that the district is concerned for eligibility for a fourth year freshman who didn't come to school much first quarter, is really puzzling. To an outsider it would appear that for this student sports does not appear to be the 'dangling carrot' as it is for some. Be sure you are able to defend within your policy any/all actions taken in this regard. The expectations will be that these will be steps and service, processes and procedures identical to those which would be known and provided and available to each and every other district student.

Coach Contact

Q.: The father of our pitcher for softball is going to be a volunteer coach this season. In the past, him and his daughter have practiced together in the gym in the mornings before school (pitch and catch). If he assumes the role of a volunteer coach, can he still do that or would that be a contact rule violation?

A.: A coach can always work with their own child - see Art. I of Rules At A Glance. BUT - becoming a coach for the team - would now preclude the parent and pitcher from including any other friends/students who would be team mates/any other team members this spring.

Q.: I coach cross country and track at one high school, but I teach at another high school. I was thinking about starting up a high school running club during the winter so kids from both schools could run together and also involve students from an area private school. Would this be against WIAA rules or not? There would be no money involved, just meeting at the school's on a rotating schedule.

A. This would not work as initially described. First, you are correct in that coaches can now recreate with students in school sponsored open gym settings... kids/coaches could run together, recreationally in/as part of an open gym. A running club - or running at the club - is not open gym. Open gyms are school sponsored opportunities and may not include students from other schools.

Q.: Has there been anything published regarding sport coaches training athletes in the weight room during the off-season? How can they help the strength coach? What can't they do? I want off season sport coaches to be able to help me in the weight room during their off season. Any potential problems?

A.: Fundamentally within our member's Bylaws, strength/conditioning opportunities fall under "Open Gym" provisions. Coaches may supervise Open Gyms. In open gym weight rooms are seen a bit differently from other sport based open gyms, due to the fact that theoretically, they are not sport and/or sport skill specific.

In addition, a certain amount of 'instruction' e.g., safe lifting, safe spotting, training regimen and rationale, are 'understandable' and permitted. There are a few sticky spots where when move into speed/agility/quickness phases. Randomly offered: Tough for track coaches to be involved in running training - speed, form running starts, etc. (plyometrics/box/jumping training might be ok). No sport implements and/or sport specific movement/drills should be part of the open gym. If it looks like spring football practice/training - chances are we are going to hear about it. You may review the BYLAW relating to this topic in Sr. High Handbook, p. 26, Art. II, Section 2A-2. Also read carefully/thoughtfully: Art. I, Art.II-A and II-D of the Rules At A Glance.

Out-of-Season Concerns/Equipment

Q.: My son is a junior in HS and has been invited to participate in the US Army National Combine Jan. 3-6, 2008. There is a registration fee that covers cleats, apparel, lunch, bus

transportation and a ticket to the US Army All-American Bowl. Would his participation affect his eligibility for participation in his HS sports?

A.: Combines have generally presented no problems - from either amateur status perspective, all-star competition, or from non-school competition perspective. On the surface I am not able to see an obvious WIAA eligibility concern - but I have not seen/reviewed any text/literature on this opportunity.

Q.: A local sports club offers the following leagues: 7v7 18 and under indoor passing league; 8v8 18U, 16U and 14U indoor softball leagues; 6v6 18U, 16U and 14U indoor baseball leagues; 9v9 U18, U16 and U14 indoor soccer. All of these have very different rules than the WIAA version of football, softball, baseball and soccer that are played at the high school level not to mention are all played indoors. Would you interpret that these four sports are different enough from the ones played at the high school level, therefore, would not be looked at by WIAA as a violation to the rules of teams gathering during the school year to play in

these indoor activities?

A.: I would respond by requesting assistance from the club/business to be certain any student groups from my high school were not placed on a singular team. Would try to educate the local business of the Association's rules as well as the real risks and ask they help me look out for the school and kids interests by protecting them. It's not that hard to do if I really want to. When an AD comes asking for -"best practice / best advice" - our response must always be shaped and influenced by what we experience when complaints/assertions come in here at tournament time. That advice will always be to make the schools programs and interests bulletproof. At this time and unless/until the members would vote to change the current rules we would suggest you advise students, coaches, parents that club teams contain kids from outside your/one single school and at least - certainly, include kids who are not part of the school's sport program. Though the text is not framed for application to this specific question – If you look at text of Art. III-D non-school participation – when applied to concerns for in-season violation of school loyalty provisions, modified and/or gimmick competition is viewed no differently then traditional competition...in the times and context of this rule's application.

Open Gyms and Camp Issues

Q.: Can a high school, public or private, entertain a sports team or group of middle school students from another school at the high school and conduct either a sports related clinic or open house? Does it have to be the whole grade invited, or can a select group of students be targeted? Or in other words, do the rules prohibiting the singling out of high school students for school enrollment apply to middle school students? Example 1: A parochial middle school volleyball team is invited to the local public high school to observe and participate in a session with the high school volleyball team? Example 2: An entire 8th grade from a

parochial middle school is invited to an open house during the school day at the private high school?

A.: Your school can legitimately provide a variety of opportunities to let middle school students know about you. (But at this time of year – a member school can not sponsor a 'clinic".)

Health & Behavior

Q:: I have a question about eligibility and the use of medications. It is my understanding that if it is a prescribed medication that is being used for a medical condition, there should be no problem with eligibility. My son will be seeing a specialist and may be going on growth hormone. He is concerned that he would become ineligible to play sports. I would like to assure him that there would be no problem.

A.: You are correct. When medicines and treatments are prescribed by an MD and the medicines are used by the individual they are prescribed to - and used, as they have been prescribed - they will not be considered a violation of the WIAA's steroid/supplements prohibition. +

Swimming & Diving Question Interpretations

Question: Just wondering if there are any restrictions on practicing grade school and high school kids together in a sport like golf or swimming (no contact). They are sharing facilities and coaches and I wanted to make sure that was okay.

Interpretation: At the 2004 Annual Meeting, the WIAA membership strongly approved of a Bylaw change separating competition between 8th graders and 9th graders in WIAA school programs. This WIAA Bylaw change began with a request from the WIAA Middle Level/Jr. High School Council and was fully supported at all WIAA committee levels.

As we reviewed and processed waiver requests for 8th graders to compete on 9th grade teams, we found there were concerns pertaining to red-shirting, recruitment, use of non-school programs for team selection, selection of players for high school programs as early as seventh grade and other concerning situations that were not appropriate for school programs. Please do not take this to in any way indicate that your school was involved in these situations, it is simply that there were numerous school football, basketball, wrestling, baseball, softball, tennis and volleyball programs involved. Many of these programs contacted our office well in advance of the school season. This raised numerous questions about allowing this waiver to be used.

Even in our smallest member schools we have found that numerous school programs are actually "discouraging" student participation rather than "encouraging" more students to participate in programs like basketball and volleyball where large numbers are not needed to field a team that is two-deep at all positions. This is contrary to what we see in other sports. In addition, if a school program cannot gather enough student-athletes from a particular class to form a team, then, perhaps, that program should not be offered.

With these thoughts in mind, the WIAA membership approved of 9th graders being allowed to compete on 8th grade teams at the 2007 WIAA Annual Meeting. This regulation is now found with each sport in the WIAA Season Regulations. It seems that there are plenty of other alternatives such as recruiting 9th graders from your school who may have played in years past, allowing 10th graders who may not be guite as skilled and getting much playing time on a Sophomore or JV program to play on the 9th grade team or there is a 5th quarter waiver available for WIAA school teams in basketball and an extra inning waiver available in baseball and softball.

As this relates to the allowance of "practice" by 8th graders on high school teams, WIAA regulations remain silent on this matter. Consequently, this remains a local school district's philosophical position. Obviously, similar concerns to those listed above can easily develop. This is especially true when one 8th grader is allowed to "practice" with a high school program while other 8th grade students are not provided this privilege. The effect of allowing an eighth grader to even

"practice" with a school team has a tendency to lead to a dramatic impact on school sponsored programs.

In considering the allowance of 8th graders to "practice" on high school teams, the WIAA encourages school districts to discuss this matter carefully with their coaching staffs, school administration and school board in hopes of developing a policy that will work for that school district.

Question: Can I schedule a scrimmage for my school swimming and diving team and allow it to count as meet for another team?

Interpretation: No, scrimmages can only count as the one scrimmage each school swimming and diving program are allowed. One school cannot count a scrimmage as a scrimmage while another school identifies it as a regular season meet.

WIAA Season Regulations now have a NOTE that reads: If either school counts a scrimmage as a game, it must be counted as a game for both programs, schools or teams.

Question: Can we have more than two school programs attend a scrimmage we are hosting?

Interpretation: Yes, more than two school swimming and diving programs can participate in a scrimmage.

Keep in mind, the scrimmages must be modified and altered so that they do not have the appearance of a meet.

Question: Can a non-school program participate in a scrimmage?

Interpretation: No, WIAA Winter Season Regulations, page 31, 4., a., One scrimmage, over one day, with <u>another school or schools</u> may be conducted in addition to the maximum allowed meets . . .

If a non-school team participates, it must be considered to be a "meet" that counts toward one of the school team's 14 regular season meets.

Question: The last edition of the WIAA Bulletin indicated sophomores, juniors and seniors could not delay reporting to the school swimming and diving team. Is this true for a sophomore boy who is going out for swimming for the first time?

Interpretation: No, WIAA Sr. High School Handbook, page 37, Rules of Eligibility, Article VI, Section 1, A., (2), indicates a student who was a member of a school team in a given sport during the previous year may not delay reporting for the school team beyond the school's official opening day of practice in order to continue nonschool training or competition . . .

Question: Can you tell me if there are any guidelines as to whether or not a school can give a school or pool record to a swimmer based on a relay split when they were not the lead off?

Interpretation: National Federation (NFHS) and WIAA language remains silent regarding record recognition. Determination of records is a local matter allowing schools to determine records they wish to recognize.

Question: Is there a rule about whether or not relay splits can be used as seed times if they were not the lead off on the relay?

Interpretation: For the WIAA Tournament Series, WIAA regulations allow for splits from relays only if it is a leadoff swimmer. Conference or school regulations for seed times are determined at the local school or conference level for regular season meets.

Question: Can you tell me what the consequences are if a relay split that is not a lead split is entered as a seed time?

Interpretation: If a seed time/relay split (non-lead split) were challenged at a WIAA sectional coaches meeting and found to be a non-lead split, the meet manager would ask the coach of the student-athlete involved to provide a new seed time that the coach is able to verify or that the other coaches are in agreement would be a more accurate time. It is possible the heat/event might have to be reseeded. Emphasis for WIAA events is placed on finding a way for student-athletes to be allowed to compete in the sectional

Question: I have a question for you regarding eligibility. We have a senior boy who transferred to our school from School BBB this year.

It seems the School BBB swim program has a fun holiday event where alumni come and swim with the current team. They have asked this swimmer to join the event this year and swim with the alumni since he is no longer a student there. Evidently after the swim, there is a dinner/picnic for families and friends. I want to get your approval prior to having him attend.

Interpretation: First, as far as allowing him to attend and be involved in the dinner/picnic, WIAA regulations do not prevent this. He is able to attend the alumni event and the dinner/picnic without consequence to his eligibility.

However, since he is now participating with another school swimming and diving team and this event is during the WIAA swimming and diving season, participation in the event must be monitored. If it is an event where there will be competition of any kind, he may not compete. Best for him to not even consider getting in the water.

If this is an event where alumni are getting together, it is open to anyone to use the pool, swim and have some fun, there are no races, events, etc., just open swimming, then it is OK for him to participate. Remind him to be careful if he decides to attend this event. It is situations like this that are often brought to the attention of the WIAA office during the tournament series. We are required to investigate. Situations like these can be very distracting to student-athletes during the tournaments.

Question: Our high school has an alumni swim meet over the Christmas break. It's just a fun meet (T-shirt relays, etc.). My question is: Can current members of the girls HS swim team take part? Our girls' coach is very concerned about any of her swimmers running afoul of the rule that prohibits girls from practicing with the boys team.

Interpretation: There are a number of issues involved with your question. First, alumni can participate. As a safety precaution, those alumni who are currently swimming for collegiate programs may want to check with their coaches and/or their compliance officers to be certain they are able to participate as I am not familiar with the

specifics of NCAA or other collegiate regula-

Next, alumni meets have to be counted as a part of a school team's 14 allowed meets when members of the boy's team are involved.

In addition, any girls with remaining eligibility in swimming and diving are not allowed to compete as this will mean they have participated in two seasons of swimming and diving during a single school year. Girls with remaining eligibility who participate in this alumni meet will jeopardize their eligibility for future participation in high school athletics.

I encourage you to discuss this meet further with the athletic director at your school as he/she is your direct contact for issues like this.

Question: In a non-championship meet, is it necessary for dual confirmation of a false start to be made in order to disqualify a swimmer?

Interpretation: Yes, WIAA Season Regulations, page 33, 15., g., indicates: In all meets (championship and nonchampionship) there must be dual confirmation of a false start by the referee and starter before a school swimmer or relay team is disgualified.

Question: I was told to contact you regarding a potential fundraiser for our school's swimming team. The idea of the fundraiser is to solicit individuals to pledge at least a dollar for every meet the varsity gets over the 14 meet regular season. The team wins 10 meets that translate into a 10 dollar donation. This is much like a free throw a thon only instead of paying per free throw made they are paying for each win. The reason I like the idea is because I am in a smaller community and they are hit with many fundraisers and get products they do not need. This is a unique idea that the community would have fun following. The negative is if we win no games then we have no money in our account. I am prepared for all scenarios

My question to you is if this is legal according to the WIAA?

Interpretation: In simplest terms - "no".

The WIAA's Board of Control and the other advisory committees which guide the Board, have taken a clear, firm position opposing any/all fundraisers which are based either on performance within a competition and/or based upon the outcome of a competition.

Both from the sportsmanship perspective as well as for the "flavor" of "gaming/gambling" which accompany fundraisers based on performance in competition/outcomes of games... our membership has zero interest in embracing this style of fundraiser.

Fundraisers based on - yards rushed, takedowns, shots on goal...freethrows/assists, etc., ...etc., any/all of these (and others) are not acceptable/appropriate school/program fundraisers when connected to performance in a competition with another school. +

Ice Hockey Notes

Checking from Behind and **Aggressive Penalties**

The WIAA 2007-08 Ice Hockey season is off to a great start. Games have been exciting and well played. Many score sheets show few penalties at numerous contests. Through Tuesday, December 5, there have only been four (4) game disqualification penalties assessed. Let's keep it at four and no more!! All of them have been checking from behind. In games I have attended and in reviewing electronic score sheets provided by Point Streak, there have been other numerous 10-minute misconduct penalties for checking from behind being called.

Athletic directors and coaches must understand that if a player is regularly being called for checking from behind or other aggressive, injury potential penalties, there is a problem with this player! Examples of aggressive penalties are slashing, high sticking, charging, boarding, spearing, butt-ending, cross-checking, elbowing, checking from behind, fighting, head-butting and kicking.

Schools have been known to handle these situations by having a meeting with any player who receives three aggressive penalties during the year. If a player is given two more aggressive penalties, for a total of five, a parent meeting with this player should be organized. Should any

additional aggressive penalties take place, playing time needs to be limited. Other action plans can easily be developed and implemented in accordance with other school district policies.

If a player is regularly being called for aggressive penalties, especially checking from behind, GET HIM/HER OFF THE ICE! DO NOT HESITATE! WE DO NOT NEED ICE HOCKEY PLAYERS WHO ARE NOT ABLE TO DEMONSTRATE CARE AND CON-CERN FOR THE WELL BEING OF OTHER PLAYERS IN THE HIGH SCHOOL GAME.

Coaches, please keep a close eye on players who have been known to become aggressive, especially towards the end of a contest. They need to be taken off the ice as games come to closure. Officials, please continue to communicate to coaches players who seem to be "loosing it" on the ice. Communication between officials and coaches has prevented many dangerous, potentially catastrophic situations from developing and taking place.

Implementing a school policy early in the season is an effective tool to preventing inappropriate behavior with school ice hockey teams. Each game disqualification penalty during the 2007-08 school year will require that the athletic director and head coach of the school involved provide me with a written report of the incident and the steps that will be taken during meetings, practice, and games to prevent this inappropriate behavior from happening again.

Goalie Equipment

Officials are reporting numerous violations of inappropriate goalie equipment as the year gets underway. The new NFHS Rule as identified on page 24 of the NFHS Rule Book reads as follows:

Throat guards must be separate, commercially manufactured, unaltered and properly attached to the helmet, face mask or neck. Acceptable throat/neck protection includes; a mask with a "flapper"-style protector attached or a mask with an extension worn in combination with at least one of the following: A separate neck quard providing throat protection or a neck quard as part of a manufactured undergarment providing throat protection (chest protector extensions do not satisfy the requirement).

THIS MEANS GOALIES NEED TO HAVE BOTH a mask with a "flapper"-style protector attached or a mask with an extension AND a separate neck guard providing throat protection or a neck quard that is part of a manufactured undergarment.

ATHLETIC DIRECTORS ARE ASKED TO PLEASE CHECK THE GOALKEEPER'S EQUIPMENT WITH YOUR HEAD COACH TO BE CERTAIN THESE SPECIFICATIONS ARE BEING MET.

Point Streak Electronic Score Sheet

The Wisconsin Hockey Coaches Association has agreed to work with the Point Streak website company to get each high school game posted on the website. They are indicating they currently have all but four boys teams involved and are working to get all boys and girls teams using this electronic score sheet. This website provides an electronic score sheet for each game.

Please have scorekeepers using the electronic score sheet include the name of each official in their proper position. This typed name can be used as an "official" verification and approval of each contest replacing the official's signature previously used. Please encourage scorekeepers to connect their computer/laptop to a printer so that they are able to print out a copy of the score sheet for the officials following completion of the game. It will be most beneficial. +

WADA Presents Distinguished Service Awards

Individuals who have made significant contributions to high school sports were honored last month by the Wisconsin Athletic Directors Association.

The recipients were recognized during the WADA's Distinguished Service Awards Banquet in November at the Paper Valley Hotel in Appleton. Each of the seven districts in Wisconsin selects the individual(s) outside the field of interscholastic athletic administration based on their contributions to interscholastic athletics.

District 1 - Lee Schierkolk

For many years, Lee Schierkolk was involved in Prairie Farm High School athletics and activities. In fact, he has been involved in school athletics on many levels for more than 25 years. He retired seven years ago from being a physical education and health teacher and athletic director at Prairie Farm, but is still very active in the school and community.

His love for Prairie Farm athletics and dedication continue to be outstanding. Schierkolk remains very involved with the Prairie Farm Booster Club. A coach, announcer and scoreboard operator for many years, he also organized the "Field of Dreams" project, compiles an Alumni Booster Club newsletter, and organizes Booster Club fundraisers which help raise \$12,000 an-

District 2 - Mark Decker

A sports official, coach, and active member of the Booster Club at Athens High School, Mark Decker has been involved in local sports for nearly 30 years. His experience as a WIAA official spans nearly 25 years - for various years in various sports: Basketball, volleyball, softball and baseball. His coaching duties at Athens included 13 years as JV girls' basketball coach, 2 years as varsity boys' basketball coach, and 6 years as softball coach.

Decker also maintained and repaired equipment in the school's weight room. He also organized and was president of the Athens Bluejay Booster Club, which funds athletics at the 6th, 7th and 8th grade levels in the district. Decker also developed and increased the club's fundraising abilities, and oversaw all of the club's numerous activities.

District 3 - John Klang Posthumous presentation

A passionate educator, John Klang was an advocate for the students of the Weston School District. He lived his entire life in the Weston School District, during which time he was the school board president for many years, the athletic director for 2 years, and the principal for nearly two years.

John was a sincere, genuine, honest, hard-working man of integrity and unbelievable character. As many know, on Sept. 29, 2006, John was shot and killed when a student entered Weston High School with multiple guns. John confronted the student and wrestled the student to the ground in an attempt to disarm him. John managed to disarm the student, but not before being shot and mortally wounded.

His actions saved the lives of his students and staff members at Weston High School. Klang lived his life in service to others, especially the students, staff, and community of the Weston School District. His widow, Sue Klang, accepted the award in John's honor. **District 4 - Glenn Teske**

A 1963 graduate of Kewaunee High School, Glenn Teske is a former KHS athlete who is a loyal sports fan and backer of Kewaunee athletics. He is still involved as the volunteer announcer for all home and playoff foot-

ball games and for track meets. Glenn also is a summer

league coach, and he continues to assist the grade school athletic program.

A cooperative, enthusiastic and involved person, he graciously volunteers in the following ways: Football chain gang 30 years, scoreboard operator 31 years, founder and 34-year member of the Kewaunee Indians Sports Booster Club which has donated hundreds of thousands of dollars to the Kewaunee athletic program, and chair for 8 years of the Booster Club Calendar Committee, one of the club's largest fundraising events.

District 5 - Mike & Connie Moran **Bob & Mary Pat Vosberg**

The School District of Platteville is fortunate to have had four outstanding individuals make sure events always run smoothly. Mike and Connie Moran & Robert and Mary Pat Vosberg took an organization on the verge of bankruptcy and in a few short years created one that carries a substantial, positive balance. They are dedicated leaders who have used vacation days as part of their contributions to Platteville student-athletes.

Mike & Connie also have been involved with Platteville baseball, a traveling soccer team, concession stand coordinators for home games, and Silent Action for the Booster Club. They organized fundraising for a new concession stand, storage building and for field up-

Robert & Mary Pat have also been volunteer bas-

ketball coaches at St. Mary's school, scorekeepers and volunteer supervisors for home games, coordinators for concession stand for St. Mary's games and Platteville High games. They are members of St. Mary's Church Council and the Home and School Council, and organized the concession stand for home track meets.

District 6 - Keith Brandstetter

A district administrator of Waterford Union High School since 1999, Keith Brandstetter is a wonderful supporter of education and extra-curricular activities. He started as a science teacher at Waterford in 1978 before moving to Mukwonago from 1984-1993. Brandstetter came back to Waterford and started an alternative high school, founded the SOAR Freshman Orientation, instituted ACT Prep classes, and designed summer PASS classes for students to make up credits. During his tenure, the school has increased the number of AP classes, the number of students taking the ACT test, as well as increased test scores.

He had a major influence on the success of two referendums for Waterford athletic areas. Additionally Brandstetter spearheaded a co-curricular code, senior plaques, and formed the 3-W Club for three sport athletes, and the first 3-W Recognition Dinner.

District 7 - Richard Regner

From 1999 to 2004, Richard Regner was the principal at South Milwaukee High School and clearly the number one advocate for sports at South Milwaukee High School. He grew up around sports and always had such a passion for athletics and activities at South Milwaukee. Regner attended almost every football game, home or away, many basketball games, and most of the other sports teams' competition.

His tenure at South Milwaukee was not long, but considering what Regner did at South Milwaukee plus his previous coaching and service in Appleton and Kenosha, Regner compiled a resume' of a man instrumental in making athletics and activities an integral part of high school life. He often did things to get more students to participate in sports, and made sure they knew the value of athletic competition. Regner genuinely cared about the student-athletes and what they were doing, and continually promoted athletics.
