WIAA Winter Team Tournament Sportsmanship Awards Announced

STEVENS POINT, Wis. – The Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association, in cooperation with Rural Insurance, has selected the team Sportsmanship Awards for the 2007 winter State Tournaments.

The winners of the prestigious award are Luxemburg-Casco in team wrestling, Barneveld in girls basketball, Aquinas in boys basketball and Holmen in gymnastics. There were not awards issued in boys and girls ice hockey.

Luxemburg-Casco receives the award in team wrestling for the second time, which accounts for both the sportsmanship awards won by the school and community. The Spartans also won the team wrestling sportsmanship award in 2001. They finished runner-up in Division 2 this year, following a 33-22 dual defeat to Ellsworth in the championship match. They advanced to the finals with a 36-32 victory over Lodi in the semifinals. Cadott received honorable mention for the award.

Holmen receives the sportsmanship award presented in gymnastics for the first time. It's the second sportsmanship honor overall, having won the softball sportsmanship award in 1999. The Vikings finished third in the Division 2 team standings at the State Tournament this season. The schools and communities receiving honorable mention include Eau Claire Memorial/North, Homestead, Hudson, River Falls, Southwestern/Cuba City, Waterford and Waukesha West/North/South.

Barneveld topped the list of schools and communities in the running for the award at the Girls State Basketball Tournament. It's the second sportsmanship commendation for the Golden Eagles in basketball. They also received the honor in 2003. The Golden Eagles' large following displayed outstanding sportsmanship and enthusiasm in their 49-43 semifinal victory over Catholic Central and in their 53-44 loss to Flambeau in the championship final. Schools and communities receiving honorable mention include Amherst, Catholic Central, Greendale, New London, Osseo-Fairchild and Sheboygan North.

Aquinas was selected to receive the sportsmanship award in boys basket-ball following its 51-41 victory over Roncalli in the semifinals and its 60-56 loss to defending champion Racine St. Catherine's in the Division 3 title championship game. It's the first-ever WIAA/Rural Insurance Sportsmanship Award presented to the Blugolds. Oshkosh West, Gilman, Randolph, Roncalli, Suring, Verona and Wausau East received honorable mention.

The WIAA/Rural Insurance Sportsmanship Award is presented to one school and community in each of the State team tournaments. The award winners are determined by the conduct and sportsmanship displayed by athletes, coaches, cheer and support groups, mascots, bands and spectators. Additional consideration is given for the effort of school administrators and chaperones to insure support for their teams are positive and that the highest ideals of sportsmanship are upheld. Award winners receive a plaque and banner in recognition of the honor. Schools receiving honorable mention are acknowledged with a certificate of recognition.

The selection process includes contributions and evaluations from contest officials, tournament management, police and security personnel, crowd control and ushers, WIAA staff members, area hotels and restaurants. +

Sauer to Address Scholar-Athletes at Reception

Jeff Sauer, former head hockey coach at the University of Wisconsin, will speak at the 24th Annual Scholar-Athlete Reception at the Westwood Conference Center in Wausau Sunday, May 6.

Thirty-two senior students attending Wisconsin public and private high schools are named winners of WIAA Scholar Athlete Award annually. The

program launched in 1984 to honor scholastic and athletic excellence.

Sixteen boys and 16 girls are recognized each year at an award ceremony held each spring. Each of the WIAA member high schools in the state is invited to nominate one boy and one girl for Scholar Athlete honors.

Sauer has 45 years experience in the sport of hockey as a player coach and administrator. He guided the UW hockey program from 1982-2002, leading the Badgers to two NCAA Division 1 championships, 12

NCAA Tournament appearances, three Western Collegiate Hockey Association titles and five WCHA playoff championships and four 30-win seasons. He compiled a 489-306-46 record, which makes him the winningest coach in UW and WCHA history.

Sauer became the first coach in collegiate history to win a national championship in his first year (1982-83). He then led UW to its fifth championship in 1989-90. He holds the WCHA record for most games coached with 1,244 and the UW record with 841. His 655 career wins ranks him seventh on the all-time NCAA wins list. In addition, he guided the collegiate careers of 17 NCAA all-Americans and has had numerous players go on to careers in the National Hockey League.

Prior to coaching at UW, Sauer served 11 years as head coach at Colorado College where he competed as a player from 1961-65. He won 166 games and was named WCHA Coach

of the Year twice.

He is one of the most respected coaches in the sport and remains one of the finest ambassadors for hockey at all levels. He received the Distinguished Achievement Award from USA Hockey in 2000, presented to the person who has made outstanding contributions to the sport of hockey during their professional career.

Other coaching experiences include serving as an assistant coach at Colorado College and UW, coaching his first women's team at the U.S. Olympic Festival in 2000 and coaching the first WCHA all-star team against elite teams in Europe.

Recently, Sauer has contributed to media coverage of the WIAA Boys and Girls State Championships for FSN. \div



Girls Soccer Reminders

PRE-GAME PROTOCOL

For consistency statewide, the following pregame protocol will be used:

5 minutes prior to the scheduled kick-off time:

- 1) Officials blow whistle and teams move to bench area.
- 2) Teams line up on the touch line and shake hands.
 - 3) National Anthem and/or player introductions.
 - 4) Play begins.

No REQUIRED handshakes at the end of the game. Officials leave the game site immediately.

If players and/or coaches wish to shake hands on their own at the conclusion of the game, this is completely permissible. What has changed is that a handshake is NOT required as part of the

postgame protocol.

Players should be ready to shake hands when they are whistled over to their bench areas. It should not then take 5-10 minutes for players to get into their player attire before they are ready to shake hands. It is also not permissible for officials to start this process 15 minutes prior to the published game time. Coaches need to have their players dressed and ready to participate in the handshake when the whistle is blown 5 minutes prior to the start of the game!

OVERTIME PROCEDURE

It has come to my attention that some coaches believe that overtime cannot be played if a varsity contest ends in a tie. This is not accurate. Overtime SHOULD NOT be played if a subvarsity game ends in a tie. If a varsity game (conference or nonconference)

ends in a tie, a maximum of two 10-minute overtimes can be played (sudden victory). Penalty kicks may not be used to break the tie if it remains after the playing of the two 10-minute overtimes. Penalty kicks could be used to determine which team would advance in a tournament bracket (multi-school event).

YELLOW CARD REPORTING

The WIAA is again keeping track of the number of yellow cards issued during all varsity girls soccer games. Officials are REQUIRED to submit a report indicating any yellow cards issued during the course of a VARSITY game. An electronic form is available on the WIAA Official's Center and must be completed and filed 24 hours after the game is completed. Coaches and/or athletic directors can view their team's number of yellow cards by selecting the appropriate link under the GIRLS SOC-CER information on the WIAA School Center page. Any team that accumulates more than 24 yellow cards during the course of the season will NOT be allowed to compete in the WIAA tournaments se-

STATE TOURNAMENT SOCCER BALL

The WIAA has announced that the Molten Colani FX-1000 will be the official state tournament soccer ball beginning in the fall of 2007. In early April, each boys soccer coach should be receiving a Colani ball. We have been informed by Molten that the Colani ball should be available to sporting good dealers sometime in May. KM Sports in Pewaukee (262-521-2112) and Stefan's Soccer Supply in New Berlin (262-432-0440 x 227) will have the Colani ball. There will be other suppliers carrying the ball as well. Just a reminder that this soccer ball will be used exclusively at the WIAA state boys and girls tournaments beginning in the fall of 2007. This is a 3-year agreement.

SHINGUARD REQUIREMENT DELAYED

The shinguard requirement has been postponed for another year. Beginning with the FALL OF 2008, shinguards must meet the NOCSAE standard. Guards will need to have the NOCSAE seal on them identifying them as approved shinguards. If you are looking for guards with the NOCSAE seal this spring and fall, you may not be able to find them as they are not yet readily avail-

WEATHER-RELATED REMINDERS

If a soccer game must be suspended because conditions make it impossible to continue before one complete half has been played, the game will continue from that point unless both coaches agree to let the recorded score stand. If at least one half of the game has been completed, the game is an official game.

Coaches and athletic directors are reminded that players, fans, etc., should be removed from the playing field if lightning is detected. The National Federation soccer rule book recommends that once play has been suspended, wait at least 30 minutes after the last flash of lightning is witnessed or thunder is heard prior to resuming play.



Golf Interpretations

INTERPRETATION: USGA Decision 18-2a/19 - The player did not make a stroke - see definition of "Stroke." Since the ball was not in play - see definition of "Ball in Play" - he incurred no penalty under Rule 18-2a. The player st put a ball into play from the teeing ground.

QUESTION: How about if a player takes a practice swing after teeing off and acci-

INTERPRETATION: USGA Decision 18-2a/20 - He incurs a penalty stroke under Rule 18-2a for moving his ball in play, and the ball must be replaced.

QUESTION: What if a golfer grounds the putter on the green, then the ball moves, then the player takes his stance? I then the player takes his stance?

INTERPRETATION: USGA Decision 18-2b/4 - If the ball moved after the club was placed in position but before the player had completed taking the stance, he incurs a penalty stroke under Rule 18-2a for having caused the ball

to move and must replace the ball, unless there is strong evidence that wind or some other agency caused the ball to move.

QUESTION: I believe I understand now what the WIAA position is on the middle

school golf thing. However, my question to you is if I have some supremely qualified junior players that I want to invite to practice with our squad - other than just being a potentially not so politically correct thing - am I allowed to make selections about who I choose to offer this invitation to? My concern about opening it up to every middle school student in school district A is clear. The size would just become unmanageable. What

INTERPRETATION: As I have indicated, this is truly a local, school district matter. One that creates very dangerous situations for coaches, school administrators and school districts.

All I can provide for you is what I have witnessed during recent years. This includes numerous coaches and school administrators being put in very difficult places, up to and including loosing their positions, as either perceptions developed or things were said to indicate that a certain middle school student would receive "privileges" once they got to the high school team. Investigations across the state have become rather intense regarding promises being made to student-athletes who are asked to practice with high school teams.

Consequently, my best advice to school officials who check in on this matter is to suggest that if they decide to allow 8th graders to practice on high school teams, that any potential players in that program be offered the opportunity. As programs like golf continue to grow in participation numbers and program levels, this direction offers the safest approach for coaches and school administrators. In addition, it promotes the sport even further as more and more students set the emportunity to participate Additional support by and more students get the opportunity to participate. Additional support by allowing more students will be a big plus for golf as well. The more students we can send away enjoying the game at the high school level, the more support we will have in future years.

Keep in mind, that once the golf team starts to allow 8th graders into high

school practices, it is a certainty that other sports will follow. Obviously, this can easily lead to growing issues between programs at your school.

QUESTION: Can high school golfers participate in the WSGA Match Play Qualifier

INTERPRETATION: WIAA regulations as found in Article VI - Nonschool INTERPRETATION: WIAA regulations as found in Article VI - Nonschool Participation on page 37 of the WIAA Senior High School Handbook indicate that events must be for international competition, National Federation recognized or on a level in golf with Walker Cup matches. Unfortunately, this event as a state-wide qualifier that is held during the WIAA school season. High school golfers that participate in this event are not allowed to continue competition with their high school golf team for the remainder of this year. In other words, should you decide to participate in this event, you would not be eligible to continue participation with your school golf team during the WIAA tournament series. If you happen to be exempt from the qualifier, the actual match play competition does follow the WIAA State Championship Meet. Consequently, those high school golfers who do not have to qualify for this match sequently, those high school golfers who do not have to qualify for this match play event, can participate in the June competition.

play event, can participate in the June competition.

QUESTION: Is there a penalty stroke if a player takes a practice swing in a lateral hazard and barely touches the tops of the grass?

INTERPRETATION: USGA Decision 13-4/4--No, provided the player did not improve his lie or test the condition of the hazard - see Note to Rule 13-4.

There is some gray area with this rule as "grounding" the club in the grass is a penalty stroke - see USGA Decision 18-2b/5.

QUESTION: Is there a rule that golf meets cannot be held if the weather temperature is below 40 degrees?

INTERPRETATION: The WIAA does not have any language that prohibits a and the state of t

QUESTION: On Sunday, May 6 the golf booster club is having an outing as a fundraiser. Can boys from the team play? Can girls from the girl's team play?

INTERPRETATION: First, let's deal with the boys from the boys golf team. In the Sr. High School Handbook, page 37, you will find information regarding Nonschool Participation. Fundraising golf outings like this are considered to be "contests" and can be looked at in no other way. Since this outing is being conducted during the WIAA boy's searon, the boys are not eligible to participation. conducted during the WIAA boy's season, the boys are not eligible to participate in this event. If a boy on the Edgerton golf team were to participate in the outing, they would not be eligible for the remainder of the golf season.

Next, let's go over the girls situation. If allowed, the girls are able to par-ticipate in the outing since their season has been completed. Girls with remaining eligibility, however, are not allowed to accept any prizes or gifts from the event except if they are gifts that everyone receives or if it is a trophy, plaque, medal, etc. You will find this information in the WIAA Sr. High School Handbook on page 34 under Article IV - Amateur Status rules. Girls with remaining book on page 34 under Article IV - Amateur Status rules. Girls with remaining eligibility may not receive gift certificates, clubs, golf attire, any type of merchandise and other prizes for such things as long putt, long drive, closest to the pin, winning an event or the outing. If a girl with remaining eligibility accepts a prize, other than one that is symbolic (nonmerchandise) in nature (like a trophy, medal or plaque), this is a career ending violation as she becomes in eligible for all further participation in the school's interscholastic program.

QUESTION: Is it legal for a driving range/golf course to offer discounts to the golf team outside of a scheduled practice at that facility?

INTERDEPETATION: The fundamental principal of amateur status for this

INTERPRETATION: The fundamental principal of amateur status for this matter is that athletes may not benefit directly or indirectly based on athletic ability/potential or performance and coaches must allow all students in a school to have an opportunity for this reduced rate. Prior to the season begin ning, coaches may provide these cards to members of their teams so long as all students have had an opportunity to join the golf team and they understand that student-athletes cut from the golf team, once practice begins, are able to

QUESTION: Can teams/players walk a course prior to competing in a meet at that

INTERPRETATION: Meet managers can allow teams to walk a course prior to a meet. If they choose to allow a team to walk the course, all teams involved should be provided this opportunity. In addition, teams/players need to be reminded that no practice can take place on the course and no testing of the surface of any putting green is allowed per USGA Rule 7.

QUESTION: Are high school golfers allowed to use a pull cart during competition?

INTERPRETATION: WIAA rules do allow the use of pull carts at any time for

high school and jr. high school golfers. It is only use of a riding golf cart where

a waiver is necessary.

QUESTION: Can we play both our varsity and JV's in the same invitational on the

INTERPRETATION: In golf, schools are allowed to play both their varsity and JV teams in the same invitational on the same day. Coaches and athletic administrators are advised to review carefully the MAXIMUM ALLOWED MEETS and the INDIVIDUAL PARTICIPATION LIMITATIONS sections of the WIAA Spring Season Regulations to be certain these maximums are not exceeded.

QUESTION: Can we play two varsity teams in one invitational? Can we play five

different players each day?

INTERPRETATION: I am not aware of a school golf program that has approved of two varsity programs. To have two varsity teams in one golf meet requires the approval of two varsity teams by a school board or governing body of a school. Coaches should not make a quick decision to have two varsity teams without the approval of their governing board. If two teams are approved for a school, two separate schedules would be necessary, one for each varsity team.

Some schools have been fortunate to get varsity reserve programs ap-proved. Any time additional teams are considered for a tournament, coaches need to obtain approval for that program from their administrators and their governing bodies.

The selection of the players that compete in a meet is the decision of the school. Five different players can be allowed to compete in the invitational on the second day.

QUESTION: We had a golf meet postponed due to inclement weather. Originally it was scheduled as a two-day, 18-hole meet with nine holes played on each day. Can our golf team obtain a waiver that will allow us to play one meet on two different days

INTERPRETATION: WIAA Season Regulations are specific with regard to maximum allowed meets. On page 13 of the Spring Season Regulations under letter b. it indicates that "No meet may continue more than two days." Splitting this meet into two separate days will require each day to count toward the meet maximum.

QUESTION: We have a day off of school and a nine-hole meet in the afternoon. Can the golfers play the front nine of this course prior to the afternoon meet since we will play the back nine during our meet?

INTERPRETATION: No, USGA RULE 7. Practice, b. Stroke Play, "On any day of a stroke competition or play-off, a competitor shall not practice on the competition course or test the surface of any putting green of the course before a round or play-off."

Exception: Practice putting or chipping on or near the first teeing ground before starting a round or play-off is permitted.
Penalty for breach of Rule 7-1b: Disqualification.

QUESTION: Can student-athletes purchase their own golf shirts at discounted prices through a NIKE purchase program?

INTERPRETATION: As long as the golf program is available to all students in a school, all students have been given the opportunity to participate, and the discount is available to all members of each team (JV, varsity, etc.) discounted prices can be provided to members of the golf team QUESTION: Can a foundation program provide funds to the school that will pay for a golf membership for members of the golf team if we do not cut anyone?

INTERPRETATION: There are a couple of issues in this question that require responses on their own.

quire responses on their own.

The only way that members of a golf team can have their golf membership paid for is if this individual, "nonschool" membership opportunity is available for all students. School funds may never be used for students' "nonschool" pursuits. School administrators should maintain copies of the announcements made providing this information to all the school's stu-

A benefactor could cover course fees for a school team/program for the school season. A "gift" to the school might be earmarked for golf-fees for the school season. School officials should follow district policies pertaining to the acceptance of a gift. the acceptance or a girt.
Individual "Nonschool" memberships must be available for all students
QUESTION: Can a golf shirt have the company name on the sleeve of the shirt?

INTERPRETATION: All of the WIAA attire rules can be found in the WIAA Spring Season Regulations under ADAPTATIONS TO USGA RULES page 14. This rule indicates, "When a course has specific attire rules, (i.e., collared shirt) players will comply with the rule or will not be allowed to participate in the meet. Host school shall enforce the attire rule.

Inappropriate dress includes, but is not limited to, clothing displaying

anything relating to drugs, alcohol, tobacco, or inappropriate language

(1) A boy must be attired in a shirt (not sleeveless) and golf slacks, tailored shorts (golf or tennis shorts) or jeans (but not those frayed or altered). Golf shoes or rubber-soled shoes must be worn.

(2) A girl must be attired in NO LESS than a sleeveless blouse and tai-



Tennis Interpretations

QUESTION: Can one school identify a meet as a dual meet only others identify the meet as one of their six multi-duals?

INTERPRETATION: No, meets can only be identified as multi-meets for all schools involved.

QUESTION: I would like to request a waiver to allow a university student to help volunteer coach for a couple of weeks with our boy's tennis team this spring. The reason we need to have a waiver is because this UWEC student did work as an intern at the YMCA tennis center over the winter months and had some (but very little) contact

with some of our JV tennis players.

INTERPRETATION: I regret there is not relief we can provide in this instance. The emergency coaching waiver is provided - effectively, setting aside the out-of-season contact restrictions - only in situations when/where denying relief would mean your school/the tennis program would have no coach at all. We would never leave you without any coach at all; but, there is zero precedent for waiving the rule in the circumstance described here.

QUESTION: I had a grandparent from the other team yell, "Keep it away from the tall one." The grandparent was right but the behavior was wrong. In that case, we had a polite conversation correcting the behavior. I've had other cases where it hasn't been so polite.

INTERPRETATION: You are correct, this is illegal coaching and can be penalized. In situations like this, I will warn the grandparent first and explain to them the violation and the Point Penalty System after getting them to a private area. In almost every case, this has worked and the individual involved has understood the need to change their behavior.

QUESTION: Tom, we come across situations where we go to a multi-team meet, and due to various reasons one or two teams might not have enough people to fill all 7 flights.

INTERPRETATION: If this is a conference meet, the conference needs to develop language as to how this should be han-

dled and where the singles and doubles teams need to play. If it is a non-conference meet, the host school needs to determine how this will be handled. It has been suggested/recommended that if a school team does not have enough players to fill a team, they should be placed in rank order in the top positions (#1, #2, etc.) until all players are used.

QUESTION: At the same time, some teams have brought extra

players who end up filling the vacant spots for a team other than

INTERPRETATION: No, WIAA Season Regulations, 6., c., A school may enter only one varsity meet per day. WIAA regulations do not allow additional players to take a vacated spot available from another team nor do WIAA regulations allow student-athletes from one school to practice with or compete for another school team other than the school where they are

QUESTION: The results of those matches are not recorded on

INTERPRETATION: Results of all matches must be recorded and will be used for seeding purposes for the WIAA State tour-

OUESTION: As long as the pace of play is not hindered JV coaches are allowed to talk/coach players. Is this correct?

INTERPRETATION: Yes, JV coaches are allowed to talk, coaches can provide signals to players. The intent of this rule is to allow coaches-especially head coaches-the opportunity to work with JV players who are learning the game of tennis during competitive matches. USTA Rule 29. Continuous play and all other USTA and WIAA time limitations need to be main-

QUESTION: If a team is at a varsity invite with 3 or more sites, can a one coach be at each site?

INTERPRETATION: The new interpretation following discus-

sion at the 2005 WIAA Coaches Advisory Committee meeting on this issue is that up to two coaches per level of program can provide instruction to tennis players as found in the WIAA Season Regulations at the times indicated. This allows two coaches to be identified at the varsity level and two different coaches (if available) to provide instruction at the JV level. Coaches must be under contract with the school as tennis coaches to be eligible to instruct during a tennis meet.

If the meet is a varsity only meet, only two coaches can be used to provide instruction.

QUESTION: Are JV and varsity coaches allowed coaching both levels at a meet?

INTERPRETATION: If a school has only two coaches (head coach and assistant), yes, both the head coach and the assistant can instruct both the varsity and the JV players during their matches. If a school has three or more coaches, the coaches that will be working with student athletes at each level need to be identified $\bar{\text{prior}}$ to the start of the match.

QUESTION: Can a school tennis team have their JV team compete in a varsity invite on the same day that school's varsity team hosts their own invitational?

INTERPRETATION: No, WIAA rules only allow one varsity meet per day per WIAA Season Regulations, 6., c., page 36.

QUESTION: Can a school tennis team have "captain's practices" prior to the start of the boy's tennis season?

INTERPRETATION: No, "captain's practices" can only be held during the summertime period. There are no restrictions relative to voluntary assembling of students during the summer in excess of five (5) days in tennis without school/coach involvement. (WIAA Sr. High Handbook-pg. 38)

QUESTION: Can scrimmages be scheduled for the varsity reserve and JV teams in tennis? INTERPRETATION: Yes, however, a couple of points of em-

phasis here: 1. Please review the WIAA Season Regulations as found on page 35-36 regarding scrimmages. 2. Scrimmages are allowed so long as there is no loss of academic time. 3. An individual student is allowed to participate in only one day of scrimmage activity. Note: An individual student may participate in multiple levels of scrimmages conducted on the same day. 4. One tennis team cannot consider a scrimmage to be a meet and the other team to consider it to be a scrimmage. A scrimmage is either a meet for both schools or a scrimmage

 ${\bf QUESTION:}$ Can a singles player be entered at the number two position if he has played the varsity number three position most of the year and only played the varsity number two position twice?

INTERPRETATION: Yes, to be allowed to be entered in the WIAA Tennis Subsectional in singles flights 1, 2 and 3, a player must have played at least three singles matches during the regular season at any varsity flight. A player entered at flight 4 does not have to meet this requirement.

QUESTION: Tom, what would happen if the player in question play's #4 with his non-dominate hand throughout the regular season after which (after the conclusion of the regular season and before the start of the State tournament series) he has permission from his doctor to begin playing with his dominate hand. Let's say that playing with his dominate hand enables him to beat (in challenge matches) the player(s) on our team who played #1, #2 or #3 during the regular season. If that was the case and he was entered in the sub-sectionals as #4, would we be in violation of the 'order of

INTERPRETATION: Obviously, we can't predict this just yet and, ultimately, other coaches will police this matter. If someone is <u>clearly</u> better than the players above him, tennis regulations for rank order indicate that player must be moved up.

The answer if this happens is-yes- if a player is given approval to use his/her dominate hand after playing with a nondominate hand throughout the regular season; if a coach believes he/she is the number one player on the team, during the tournament series he/she would have to be the number one player otherwise you would be in violation of the rank order regulation.

Coaches are going to question a #3 or #4 position when a player should/could be a #1. As always, I encourage regular documentation of challenge matches and regular season matches. In this case, since he was a State qualifier last year and almost won his first match against a very good opponent, it will be best to play him at the higher spot if there is any question.


QUESTION: My daughter will be playing on the XXX High School varsity team during the 2007-2008 season. The official start date for practicing is August 7, 2007. However, there is a USTA tournament scheduled for August 6-9. If my daughter starts practicing with her team on August 7, is she in violation of the state tennis regulations if she participates in this USTA tournament on August 6-9?

INTERPRETATION: WIAA Regulations as found the WIAA Senior High School Handbook indicate that in the sports of girls tennis, golf and swimming and diving, girls may report to their school teams after completing summer non-school competition so long as they report to their school team prior to the first interscholastic meet. In other words, when a non-school tournament takes place at the start of the tennis season, girls are allowed to complete this non-school tournament and are allowed to join the school team so long as they do so prior to their first meet of the season. There is no WIAA regulation that prevents your daughter from completing her non-school competition and then joining the high school tennis team after

QUESTION: Are the boys allowed to attend group tennis lessons school practice....they are additional hitting opportunities for the play ers that are run by the club pro

INTERPRETATION: After the conclusion of the school practice, student-athletes are not prohibited from attending other non-school practice sessions, clinics or instructional opportunities on their own. If this happens to be in a "group" nario, they are allowed to do so. A couple of things to keep in mind with this, if the group tennis lesson is a requirement, then the instructor becomes a team coach, and this can only be done one time on one day. I also will always remind parents and student-athletes that ask this question that they do need to communicate their intentions with their head coach as risk of injury increases with additional workouts. In addition, differences in philosophy may exist between the school coach and the club pro; not to mention the loss of academic study time that is also being greatly reduced. +







Eligibility Questions & Answers

Residence & Transfer

Q.: My son was attending the public school in our community. On March 6, he transferred to the private school. This was part way into his 4th semester. He currently is in the 10th grade. Is he eligible to play sports at the new school at a non-varsity level this year? Is he eligible to play at the start of next year in varsity sports?

A.: Provided both schools agree and the sending school has indicated 'no objections' on the transfer student form – YES, non-varsity opportunities could be provided for this spring. He would be eligible to participate at the varsity level in the fall, but it is important to note that this is an interpretation which is in some respects unique and 'transitional' in nature – It is intended to help facilitate the membership's implementation of their new transfer rule which begins following the current school year. If this sort of transfer takes place next school year, the answer to your second question will be/would be – "NO." In similar situations next year, the transfer rule will again restrict eligibility to non-varsity status for a calendar year unless a waiver is provided.

Q.: There is a young lady (sophomore) presently attending North High who just made North's JV soccer team. She would like to transfer to West; attend classes and be on our JV girls soccer team. The school district has no problem with her transfer for academic reasons; parents are divorced and they have joint-custody (mother lives in North attendance area & dad lives in West attendance area). HOWEVER, the North AD and I believe she is NOT ABLE OR ELIGIBLE to play at West because she already made the team at North High. Are we correct? Has she lost her soccer eligibility because she practiced and was accepted to North's girls soccer team?

A.: As described I would say - "I don't know" because at present, this is still 'your call' on this matter (as a sophomore would be your call next year, too!). Rules of Eligibility, Art. II, Sect. 1A-10 (p. 32) still identifies that: For 'WIAA purposes' a student needs to meet residence requirement - i.e., live in your district. What specific school the student is assigned to, whether the student can transfer from A to B, whether the student can transfer and be eligible at B is still up to your local district policy and its interpretation. Just be sure that if challenged you are able to 'connect the dots' - that other students/parents will know of and have access to same considerations and treatment. Next year, sub-article 10 will be edited to read: "Except in situations involving transfer after a student's fourth consecutive semester, the Board of Education shall deter-

Q.: 1) Student A is a now in their fourth consecutive semester at our independent school. They are not a boarding student, but rather attend during the day and go home after school as they live in a neighboring town. If this student were to transfer next year to their local public high school, in the district where the parents reside (not the district in our town), under the new WIAA transfer rule, would this student be eligible to participate in athletics in 2007-08 at their local high school? 2) Student B is now in the fourth consecutive semester of high school. For the first two semesters (freshman year), this student attended the local public high school. For the third and fourth semesters (sophomore year), this student attended our independent school. If this student were to transfer back to the local high school for their junior year, would the student be eligible to participate in athletics in 2007-08 at the local high school? 3) Student C, a freshman now in his second semester at our school, has a parent who has been admitted to the war college in Pennsylvania during the 2007-08 school year. The family will be stationed with him in Pennsylvania for that year only. There should not be a problem with the student's eligibility at our school when the family returns to their home in town and the student re-enrolls at our school for the 2008-09 school year, cor-

A.: 1) If student transferred after this/current school year, would not be eligible to practice or compete for a calendar year, unless a waiver were provided. As described, the student's status next school year would be as a 'new/transfer' student at the start of 2007-08. 2) Same answer as above. 3) Correct. It would appear this would be a transfer made necessary due to complete/total moves by family.

If student transferred prior to end of this/current school year, will be "ineligible and/or have restricted eligibility" for the balance of this school year (as a result of 'current' transfer rules..BUT, would be considered a 'continuing/returning student' next fall – and afforded eligibility. (This is a transitional interpretation – only in place to more equitably 'launch' this new rule of the membership).

Q.: I'm inquiring about participation rules for our daughter who is currently a 10th grader at a member school. For a job transfer, we are moving out of one county into the neighboring county and we are looking at enrolling our daughter into a private school (moving into that community) for the fall. Will she be able to participate in the fall in girls sports (she plays volleyball, basketball and softball)? Or will she need to be enrolled for the last semester of this school year for eligibility?

A.: Knowing only what's been shared above, I will respond that when a transfer has been made necessary as a result of a complete and total move, and provided there were no objections by/between the involved member schools, I would expect your daughter would be determined to be eligible next fall. See I and IIA of the Transfer Rules At A Glance. There is no intent or desire to be evasive in this re-


sponse. It is a little difficult to answer some questions with a simple, yes or no. Until we hear the actual and specific details of a transfer from a member school's athletics director, the best I can do is reference what the rule provides. Work related family moves, relocations and student transfers are a familiar part of any given school year. When parents take new jobs and a family move needs to take place, makes sense to take place, a student is not arbitrarily penalized as a result.

Q.: I have a question about a transfer student. We have a young girl (sophomore) who will be coming to live with her aunt and uncle. She is transferring from out of state. Her parents just got a divorce and she has been, I guess, determined to be excess baggage. The aunt and uncle have been given legal guardianship. If she decides she would like to go out for athletics a) this spring, or b) next fall. I want to be able to give them the correct answers on her eligibility. I always check with the previous school for conduct and academic penalties but was concerned on the guardianship questions. If everything goes through she would be arriving this spring.

#2 Seed

A.: First, when you get the transfer student eligibility form back from the sending school - if it indicates "no objections" on the bottom of the form, you may allow the student non-varsity opportunities once you verify other eligibility requirements. Second - if unrestricted eligibility is desired, you will need 'sending family' to explain/document the "need" for this transfer - should be from both mother and father. The "receiving family" must also provide their documentation/explanation. It would be helpful if the documentation were detailed enough to clarify at least a couple of additional specific details, including: Are there other siblings? If so, where are they? Why couldn't the student stay with one or the other of the parents, e.g.? Try to help the families understand we are not desiring to be intrusive or 'nosy'... we are looking for details that help us understand why this needed to happen. It is the sort of information that will allow us to defend saying "yes" to relief - if it's sought and if it can be provided. When we can clearly recognize children in need through no fault of their own, we try to say "yes." But we know there will be times when we may need to clearly demonstrate why/how we said yes to one child and not the other. If upon your becoming more familiar with the story and if you then believe there are bona fide extenuating circumstances and/or home life betterment issues it is your prerogative to put a cover letter together requesting a residence and transfer waiver in your student's behalf.

Q.: I was wondering how we as coaches can check on opposing player's eligibility? We are playing a team tonight that has a player who moved out of state and back into state applied for waiver to play but how do we as opposing coaches verify this?

A.: It is always a great place to start by talking with your own school's AD and your AD contacting the other member school and flatly alerting them that: "as a heads-up – we are hearing some rumblings about so and so, possibly having transferred and wanted to alert you so you might not be unpleasantly surprised, after it's too late. Just thought you'd like to be aware!!" That's far and away the most professional course, to try to help prevent another member school from distress and/or forfeit, if possible.

Q.: Our son is a 7th grader in school district A. He would like to attend high school in School District B in part to be able to participate in B high school varsity hockey. This sport is not offered in School District A. Unaware of the new rules, he did not open enroll in District B for his

8th grade year. We anticipate his open enrollment in Feb. of 2008 to be a freshman at B for the 2008-2009 school year. Will he be eligible for varsity sport participation in that first year at B? The rules discuss four semester attendance as the start point for restrictions. However, it is unclear to us if middle school participation is included in the four semesters. If he begins school in B as a freshman, is he immediately eligible? If not, are there options to obtain a waiver in these circumstances?

A.: If open enrolling in/to School B as a freshman a student would be eligible without restriction provided all other rules governing eligibility are met. Text of new rules provides, "four consecutive semesters upon/following entry into 9th grade." The member's new rule does contain a waiver provision. It is unlikely that what's thus far been described would meet the threshold to be viewed as a compelling reason to provide a waiver, if one were necessary or requested. I see nothing extenuating in what's been thus far shared – only a choice/preference a family has made.

Amateur Status

Q.: According to the Handbook, a student shall be an amateur in all recognized sports of WIAA in order to compete in any sport. What about a senior that gets paid to compete in kick-boxing matches? Are they eligible for baseball seeing this is not a recognized sport of WIAA?

A.: Yes. Kick-boxing is not a WIAA recognized sport.

Q.: Our sports booster club is planning a post-season banquet for our basketball team and wants to know if it is within the rules for them (the booster club) to buy the meal for the players and charge the rest that attend?

A.: In a word - yes, so long as approved by school administration. See Senior High Handbook, Bylaws - Art. IX, Sect. 2A (p. 29).

Q.: I am just writing to clarify an amateur status concern. A local hospital or clinic wants to do a commercial on one of our students who had ACL repair. They know they cannot do this while he is still a HS student/athlete but have asked if they can do this after he graduates and after his high school baseball season is over? His mom is also checking NCAA rules. As part of this commercial, they have also asked if it is allowable to take footage of the inside of our school and athletic facilities? Can you help me out?

A.: YES - once student has exhausted his high school eligibility the Association has no authority, its rules do not apply to non-students. Use of image of your school facilities – is school board's call. You may wish to be very specific and/or make certain of intentions here; i.e., if commercial desires to use images of any others in your student body – as background and/or extras in the commercial – and whether you will allow, or not.

Bear in mind, this is not a news story, it is a commercial/promotion. Speaking generally, health care providers and their promotions may present the single biggest source of amateur status violations across this membership.


Q.: I have a male student that would like to start participating in track. He is a very good and accomplished gymnast as well. Would any of the amateur status issues apply to him or am I correct to assume that gymnastics is only a WIAA sport for girls?

A.: Interesting. I had not encountered the elements of this question previously. Wanted to affirm the interpretation with Mr. Chickering and he concurs with your analysis. He also was able to draw upon some of his past experiences – when the Association sponsored volleyball, only for girls. If your student were to accept/receive an award for performance/achievement in men's gymnastics that might otherwise be unacceptable for performance/achievement in a 'recognized' sport, we would not view it as a violation of the Association's amateur status provisions. We recognize the gender specific nature inherent to this question and interpretation. Friendly advice: be sure student investigates NCAA eligibility in same area.

Competition & Practice

Q:: I am a college baseball coach. I was thumbing through the March 30 Bulletin and I noticed a question about campus visits. The concern was whether it's OK for a player to attend a practice and in turn actually practice with the college team. I thought your answer and advice to the parent (visit ncaa.org) was right on. I'm sure you get that question or similar versions of it on a regular

basis. The general answer to the question, regarding NCAA schools, is prospective student-athletes can attend/watch a practice, but they may not participate. If it's a NCAA Division I or Division II school, there are certain windows of time, "quiet periods," and "dead periods," where a prospective student-athlete cannot attend a practice either. Division III schools do not have "quiet periods" or "dead periods," but some conferences have additional rules above the NCAA rules in regards to recruiting, i.e. no home visits, in-school visits, etc. I would also point parents/AD's/players/coaches back to the NCAA website as well because additional info on the recruiting calendars for NCAA D-1 and D-II schools in regards to "quiet periods," and "dead periods," is on the site. If the parent was talking about a visit to an NAIA school or a junior college, then players are indeed allowed to work-out/practice with the team. If you would like to forward my email address or phone number to the parent/AD/coach that asked the question, I would be happy to clarify things for them. The last thing any of us would like to see is someone lose eligibility over a misunderstanding of recruiting guidelines.

A.: Thanks for touching base and for the feedback.

Q.: Later this month we are having a Saturday practice for the distance runners and were thinking of buying breakfast for those who came and ran the route as kind of a team building thing. My question is whether this is legal/OK to do. I as coach would be buying and wondered if this was OK. If not the kids can buy for themselves but with an 8 a.m. optional practice I am not sure how many would come without an incentive.

A.: A coach buying breakfast for the team, under the circumstances as described, would contain no peril.

Q.: 1) Our girl's soccer team is traveling to Kansas City, MO over spring break to play two Kansas City soccer teams. Do we need any kind of approval from the WIAA? We play one team on Friday night and another team on Saturday. It is not a tournament. 2) Our cross country team will be participating in the Roy Griak Invitational cross country meet in the fall in Minnesota. Do we need approval for this? If so, can you forward the proper forms for me to complete.

A.: 1) First - be certain to affirm that both KC/MO teams are in fact, school teams and not soccer club teams. If so, then answer's - 'NO.' This configuration would not require WIAA waiver (even though not an 'adjacent state' - still involves only total of three schools/two states.) Ref. ROE II-5F-3 and 4. 2) My recollection of this competition is that it is a pretty big event. If the event would require National Federation sanctioning - as outlined in text of Sect. 5F, 1-2-3 - Then WIAA approval would be necessary. It will be up to the event organizer/sponsors to pursue NF sanctioning. You might ask them to confirm if sanctioning will be necessary, if it's been requested, if it's been approved (likely a bit early for that). It's also my recollection that a number of our members did request and receive approval to attend this event last fall.

Q.: We are scheduled to take our varsity girls soccer team to Illinois for games against a prep school on Friday, and X academy on Saturday. Both opponents are high school teams as Illinois also has the girls' soccer season in the spring. These are separate/individually contracted contests. Another area school will be playing the same schools on opposite evenings, but this is NOT a tournament or showcase. This will be the first time in many years that I will be taking our squad across state lines. Could you please advise on any procedures necessary for clearance by WIAA for these games?

A.: These contests do <u>not</u> require additional/special WIAA approval. For added understanding / future awareness: The member schools did away with the 'old' 600 mile travel waiver requirement a few years back. Miles are no longer the critical variable for when added approval is needed. Grab a copy of the WIAA Senior High Handbook and see p.27 (Bylaws Article II, Section 5F,1-6). 5F-4 specifically applies to this situation, as you've described and I've understood it.

Q.: Our boys and girls track coaches are wondering if the Walt Disney Track Invitational is sanctioned by the National Federation and if the WIAA will allow our boys and girls athletes to attend next year? We know that if it is allowed that this meet would count as one of our total meets for next year.

A.: While it's not possible to say "yes" right now to your question, I can tell you that: We do not presently find the Disney *Track Invitational* identified on the NF sanctioned events website. The National Federation has sanctioned the Disney (Fla.) *Track and Field Showcase* in 04-05, and the *Disney Relays* (Fla) in 05-06. If the event you outline above applies for and is provided NF sanctioning next year, and if this falls within the Association's track competition season, and if the competition fits within your season allowed meet maximums and coach is present, etc. – it is most probable the WIAA would approve an out-of-state competition waiver for this event. Review Bylaws – Article II, Sect. 5-F for details on Interstate Competition.

Participation Issues

Q.: We have a parent who's been asking if his son, who attends one of the parochial schools in the area, can play on our high school basketball team without attending public school. Is there an official "ruling" on this?

A.: Simple answer is, "no." Your school along with the other 504 schools that compose the membership of this Association, require within their rules for eligibility that a member school may only use their own full-time students on their interscholastic

athletic teams. That rule is foundational for this membership and is part of the reason school's formed this Association around 112 years ago.

Nonschool Competition/Participation

Q.: My son currently is a member of a high school track team. Is he allowed to participate in non-professional charity-sponsored 5k events outside of school during the track season?

A.: Not as a runner – no. If he wants to participate as a walker, our member's rules do not prevent that.

See III-D of the Rules At A Glance. Also more in Eligibility Q/A – under the "Regulations" icon on our home page.


Q.: One of my distance runners has a road race they want to enter. Its an event named after the cousin of one of my athletes who has cancer and raises money for the Wisconsin Ovarian Cancer Alliance. I said I would have to check because I think there is some rule (at least there was in Illinois) about running road races in season. I was told that if they can't run, they could volunteer, so I am fine either way. Just wanted to ask.

A.: See/share III-D of the Rules At A Glance. If this race is to be held during the school's track sea-

son and this student is presently a member of the school's track team – it would violate the 'school loyalty provisions' (non-school competition) and render the student ineligible for the remainder of the school season and tournament series. There are two acceptable possibilities available to your student if they feel compelled to support this cause: Your suggestion of volunteering is a great suggestion. Secondly, your student could enter as a walker – if that element is offered. The Association does not sponsor interscholastic race walking.

Q.: I emailed you last September about a senior student-athlete who was playing hockey (not school affiliated) and going to school in Illinois. He did indeed move back with his parents to finish out his senior year and play baseball. I am seeking verification that he is eligible to play. He lives with his parents who reside in our district. He has been a student here his first three years of H.S. He did not play any school sports in Illinois. He was on a club team. His academic standing is confirmed, as well as deportment at previous school. He plans on participating in baseball, as he has done since his freshman year, and graduating with his class in June.

A.: I see no obvious reason to deny this student eligibility.

Coach Contact

Q.: We have a fairly new soccer coach, and I am not

sure he understands what his role can be in the off season especially summer. He has been having open gyms on Sunday evenings at our high school for the past month. Recently he has planned fund-raisers for the summer (June) and is mandating that every returning player show up to work. He is also planning on being in attendance. I was under the impression that he can not mandate attendance over the summer. Many boys are attending soccer camps and are employed. He is also holding a alumni soccer camp and game in July which he is mandating attendance. I want to know what the rules and guidelines for summer and off season are? I thought he could only have five contact sessions with the boys, that is what our prior coach did. Is that strictly five sessions in which he coaches? He is trying to be involved in scheduling scrimmages for the summer and wants to be contacted about anything the boys are trying to schedule amongst themselves during the off season especially summer. Your clarification will be greatly appreciated.

A.: Read Article I of Rules At A Glance - very carefully. A coach making any out-of-season attendance mandatory, is potentially quite hazardous - as can be alumni games. You can also find a volume of Q/A on this topic on our website, under the Regulations icon - in Eligibility Q/A.

Q.: I have a question about the WIAA rule change that states that a school may now sponsor clinics/camps or

competitions in the summertime. Does that mean that I could use student-fund money to pay for Central League, tournaments etc...? That's the way the rule appeared to read but just wanted to check it out.

A.: With approval of school administration, school funds could be used on/for the five unrestricted contact days (only), in the summer.

Q.: During summer contact days, can anyone other than athlete/parent pay for travel, entry fees, other costs associated with going to said contact days?

A.: In a word - "YES." IF an opportunity is contained within an "unrestricted contact day," you/the school can actually cover costs. If booster's wish to underwrite or cover, they can "gift" the money to the school. Related Rule Reference is Rule of Eligibility Article VI, Sect. 2C - 5-*Note. For all extents and purposes, the summer contact period is almost like - has some similar qualities as - a "mini" school season.

Q.: I would like to hire someone to do some training with the volleyball team during the five contact days allowed in the summer before Aug. 31. My question is regarding paying this person. Am I allowed to pay out of volleyball fundraised money? It is my understanding that the fundraised money could not go towards any camps the girls do on their own, is that correct? For example, could they use the fundraising money to go to a camp between August 1 and August 7?

A.: There's a couple things to clarify in this note and question. The five days of unrestricted summer contact runs from the end of school to JULY 31 - not August. Might have been a typo on your coach's part - but it's not something she wants to confuse!!! Second, Bylaws were changed in recent years to greatly liberalize the five unrestricted summer days. The special instructor can be paid with fundraised dollars. Even if those dollars are in a school/activity account - so long as the camp/clinic is part of the unrestricted contact days and the opportunity is made known and available to any/all students who are interested. If the fundraised dollars are in a non school/booster account. I recommend the dollars be 'gifted' to the school and the school writes the check for the clinician. Now, if we are talking about a camp in August (outside of the unrestricted contact window) and using fund raised money to send kids to camp - answer's "No" - 100 percent of costs must be covered by student and family. Lots of Q/A on this and related - on our home page, wiaawi.org. Pull down on Regulations icon and click on Eligibility Q/A.

Health & Behavior

Q.: I have been doing the entering of our students forms required to participate in a sport. I had some parents challenge me about the alternate year card, so I thought I should have you clarify it with me so I have it right.

If a student has a physical after April 1, I know it's valid for the following two school years. The way I took it, if a student had a physical in a previous school year (say they had one 4/2/06), then in the following school year they need an alternate year card. So they would need an alternate year card for the 2006/2007 school year and for the 2007/2008 school year. Is this right? If not, what would they need for the 2006/2007 school year? If they participate in a spring sport which goes from March - May, wouldn't they need to have at least an alternate year card on file with us to say their health hasn't changed? – or does the WIAA rules state the physical card is good from 4/2/06 through the end of the school year 2007. Then for the 2007/2008 school year they would need an alternate year card?

A.: School years should not be mixed up with calendar years, nor as meaning, 'from date of exam,' etc. It is a 'face value' statement – 'good for the next two (complete) school years.' In this situation, the original green card is good for 06/07 and the alternate year card required for the second, i.e., 07/08. Presumably, student may likely either have a previous physical or alternate year card that carried them to /through the spring of 06, or you would use the 4/2 green card to do spring of 06 and the rest of the 06/07 school year.


Fundraisers & Booster Clubs

Q.: Had a parent ask if it is legal to have a team photo put on a t-shirt and have the players sign the shirt to sell/silent auction at a public school fundraiser. Can you clarify the legality of this?

A.: As a school fundraiser and as described, this could be done without peril to the student athlete's amateur status eligibility. +

EDITORIAL

The Way We Were; The Way We Are

It wasn't too long ago when identifying descriptors for the schools in the WIAA membership was not too difficult of a task. However, it is no longer your father's WIAA membership.

Identifying the various types of schools has gotten increasingly complex over the past decade. Today, the popularity of school choice has altered traditional student enrollment models.

In 2000, schools without district boundaries became eligible to become members, and most volunteered to exercise that opportunity. Prior to that, identifying a member school was easy. Schools within the membership could fit into three neat and understood categories: large, medium and small. Now, it seems, district boundaries serve only as a reference point. There are religious and independent schools; there are charter schools; there are virtual schools; there are home schools; there are schools within other schools; and then there is open enrollment. Each of these educational designs have changed the landscape of education.

To add another possible wrinkle to the mix, there may be legislation introduced that would develop a governmental committee that could override local school board's decisions on formation of charter schools within districts.

Much of the attention recently has been directed to the private and independent school segments of the membership. Such focus has allowed other potential influences on the membership to go without similar

Following a boys basketball championship game last year, when a religious school member defeated a public school member by 39 points, a significant number of members requested measures to "level the playing field." Interestingly, when a public school defeated another public school in the girls Division 3 championship game by 42 points this year, it was a considered a seeding

It's easy to rationalize and find reasons why games are not as competitive as we would like them to be at the State and sectional levels. But, the simple fact is one team played very well and one team did not. Overanalyze it enough, however, and there can always be more provocative or compelling reasons to debate.

Interscholastic athletics, in its pure and ideal form, embodies a healthy work ethic, teamwork and fairness. They are not designed to enable, whereby making it easier for those not as successful to experience success without necessarily requiring them to improve to the level of a champion.

There may very well be advantages or disadvantages to different segments of the membership, but perception is often not reality in complex issues. Careful consideration of an issue will usually yield a better and more comprehensive resolution than one made in hasty reaction.

The impact of open enrollment-introduced in 2000 as well-has not received the same public scrutiny as the inception of the religious and independent schools. Yet, its impact has been quite substantial.

Recent proposals that test the practicality of moving private and independent schools to a higher division in basketball from where their enrollment would normally place them has been analyzed during the past year. However, to implement a requirement on one segment of the membership without acknowledging the impact of open enrollment on the majority of the schools in the membership would not be prudent in maintaining a unified association.

The WIAA passed rules at last year's Annual Meeting that addresses student-athlete movement from any school to any other school without placing the impetus on one segment of the membership. What impact these rules have on the debate will be meas-

An expanded membership has made the WIAA much more diverse than it was 10 vears ago. The direction for which we continue to administer interscholastic athletics and offer post-season championship tournaments will be influenced by the involvement of more than 500 schools. Some of the enrollment issues we face today may appear small compared to what we may be confronted with in the not-too-distant future.

While the description of member schools in the WIAA may have changed and may continue to change, the ideals and purpose of an association 111-years in the making remains intact. This month's Annual Meeting provides an active, informed and unified membership a role in shaping the future landscape of interscholastic athletics. +
