Board of Control Approves Conference Realignment Proposal

STEVENS POINT, Wis. – The Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association Board of Control approved first consideration of a conference realignment plan at its monthly meeting here today.

The Executive Staff's conference realignment proposal impacts the Eastern Valley and Wisconsin Flyway Conferences. The plan moves Omro from the Eastern Valley Conference to the Wisconsin Flyway Conference. Implementation is scheduled for the fall of 2010. The complete overview of schools in each of the conferences under the current and new alignment plan is attached.

WIAA procedures provide a 40-day window for schools to appeal April 3 action before the Board considers final action. Thus, schools have until May 13 to appeal the Board's initial approval. The Board will make a final determination at its May 15, 2009, meeting.

The Board also approved clarifying language on the co-op program application intended to affirm the requirement of institutional control and oversight of multi-school programs.

A lengthy discussion focused on divisional placements and the continued pursuit of options intended to address the disproportionate success of religious and independent schools in the membership's Tournament Series. The Board directed the staff to develop specific proposals to be discussed at next fall's Area Meetings.

Other deliberations included a summary of topics on the agenda of the Annual Meeting scheduled later this month, conference realignment and an introduction of receipts and expenditures anticipated in the 2009-10 budget. The Board was also viewed a video presentation on the progress of the UW-La Crosse stadium project.

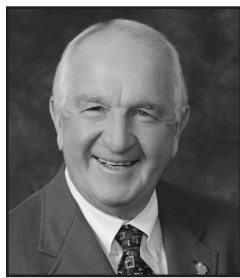

Chickering to Keynote Scholar Athlete Ceremony

WIAA Executive Director Doug Chickering will serve as the featured speaker at the 26th Annual Scholar Athlete Ceremony scheduled for Sunday, May 3 at the Westwood Conference Center in Wausau, Wis.

Chickering has led the WIAA to unprecedented levels of success and popularity. Included in his accomplishments are the addition of private schools into the Association in 2000, the substantial expansion of State Tournament Series opportunities in all sports for girls and boys, the addition of nonpublic and ethnic minority representation on the Board of Control and Advisory Council, the hiring of the current executive staff, the placing of State Tournaments in the finest facilities throughout the state, the planning and construction of the current WIAA headquarters and the guidance in enhancing exposure of high schools sports through various media platforms.

Chickering will be retiring following more than 23 years of service with the organization and 45 years in the education profession on July 31, 2009.

"Mr. Chickering's work to initiate the WIAA Scholar Athlete program, along with his determination to develop the integrity, respect and admiration this program is recognized for statewide, makes this a most appropriate time for him to address these outstanding student athletes," said Tom Shafanski, assistant director of the WIAA and the overseer of the Scholar Athlete program.

In addition to his contributions in Wisconsin, Doug has also had an impact on interscholastic athletics at

the national level. He has completed his second term on the National Federation of State High School Associations Board in 2008. He served in a similar capacity from 1990-93, completing that term as president of the organization in 1992-93, making him an influential sports figure both in the state and nationally.

He has also served on the NFHS New Paradigm Task Force and on a number of other national committees including Sportsmanship, Ethics and Integrity; Football Rules; Risk Management; and three Strategic Planning Committees, chairing the first committee in 1996. He currently serves as chairman of the NFHS Foundation Board of Directors.

Doug has received numerous honors during his distinguished career. In 2003, he was presented with the Distinguished Service Award by the National Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association in recognition of his length of service, special accomplishments and contributions to interscholastic athletics at the local, state and national levels. This past summer, he was the recipient of a NFHS citation in recognition for his distinguished record of involvement and impact as

a member of the Federation Foundation's Board of Directors.

He was inducted into the Wisconsin Basketball Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 1999 and the Wisconsin Football Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2002. In addition, he received the 2009 Dave McClain Distinguished Service Award presented by the WFCA last month.

Doug has also received special recognition for service to Wisconsin education. In 2007, he received the prestigious Distinguished Friend of Education Award presented by the Association of Wisconsin School Administrators, and he was the recipient of a special recognition from the Wisconsin Association of School District Administrators in 2001. Furthermore, in 2003, he was honored with the Lifetime Achievement Award from UW-Eau Claire.

In recognition of his work with the statewide media, the Oakley-Lindsey Foundation committed \$30,000 to the Wisconsin Broadcaster's Association Foundation in Doug's name to fully endow the WBA Foundation's Annual Sports Reporters Workshop. +

Officials Center - On the Officials Center homepage is a listing of up-coming deadlines and recently posted information. This has been added to help officials keep better track of deadlines and new postings. It is extremely important that all officials check the Officials Center on our website regularly for up-dated information. Many officials are finding out that their classification level is being affected because they missed filling out a required form, missed a due date, missed sport meeting/video viewing notifications, etc.

Sport Meetings - When face-to-face meetings are offered, attendance is required. When these meetings are not offered there will be an online video on the Officials Center. The viewing of this video is required, not only so that you are familiar with any rule changes but for classification advancement credit. Once you have viewed the video, you will be required to fill out the video verification form that is also on the Officials Center. Once you submit this form, you can check the listing that is titled "Video Verification Forms Received" to make sure that your official's number is listed. If this is not completed properly or by the due date listed, your classification level will be affected when you re-license for the following school year.

Exams - Remember to make a copy of your exam before you send it to our office. Corrected exams are not returned. Access the Officials Center for scores. Once the due date to submit the exam has passed, answers and rule references will be placed on the Officials Center.

Rankings - If coaches are to give accurate rankings at the end of the season it is important that they can read an official's signature in the scorebook. Please write legibly. Provide the head coach with a copy of the ranking card that is available to print on the Officials Center.

Number of Officials - Contests are not to be started without the required number of officials. This applies to all levels of competition i.e. varsity, JV, freshmen, etc. The required number of officials listing for all sports can be found on Page 6 in the Guide for Officials, which is on the Officials Center.

Rule Adaptations - Wisconsin Adaptations to NFHS playing rules for each sport are on the Officials Center and should be printed and placed in the rule book for easy access.

Ejections - All ejections are to be reported immediately following a contest. The ejection form is an online submittable form that is on the Officials Center.

Independent Contractor - Officials are acting as an independent contractor and not as an employee of the WIAA or its member schools when seeking and accepting officiating contracts.

Guide for Officials - Please read the Guide for Officials, found on the Officials Center. This publication will help officials understand the classification process, ranking process, etc.

One of the girls started attending track practice as a way to kill time while waiting for her host, who plays softball, to go home. Would there be any harm in letting her experience a couple of track meets, competing at the JV level?

A.: There is no provision for eligibility within the member's rules available to offer.

Q.: We have a student who has been attending since school started last fall and is a student in good standing in the 11th grade. She transferred from out of state. Due to family problems back home she is living with family friends in our district. I told the student and the

house parents that she is not eligible for any interscholastic competition for the obvious reason. This was not a problem because she had not participated in sports during her high school career. She now is working out with our five girl track team. I have told all parties that she may not participate in meets. They would like her to run as a non-scoring independent or as a JV. I told them that is unlikely but I would see if it is possible.

A.: You have provided mostly correct information to the student and family. First, the member's rules of eligibility (Art. II, Sect. 1A) provide that a student is eligible in the district where his/her parents reside; full-time in their primary residence. Without parents in your district the student is ineligible. In addition, Section III of that same rule provides that a student who transfers after their fourth con-

secutive semester following entry into grade nine is ineligible to practice and play (at all levels). As you know this rule does contain a provision by which a waiver can be sought. Based on your current description, student is not eligible to practice or play.

Q.: We have a softball player this season who is a 10th grader. The student has been in our district all year for this 2008-09 year. The athlete came from out of state last summer to stay with her second cousin. She plans on staying the rest of this year and the next and hopefully graduate from here. The athlete's father passed away last fall. The athlete's mother has health issues and this is why she is living with her second cousin in our district. As of now there is a chance that she could make the var-

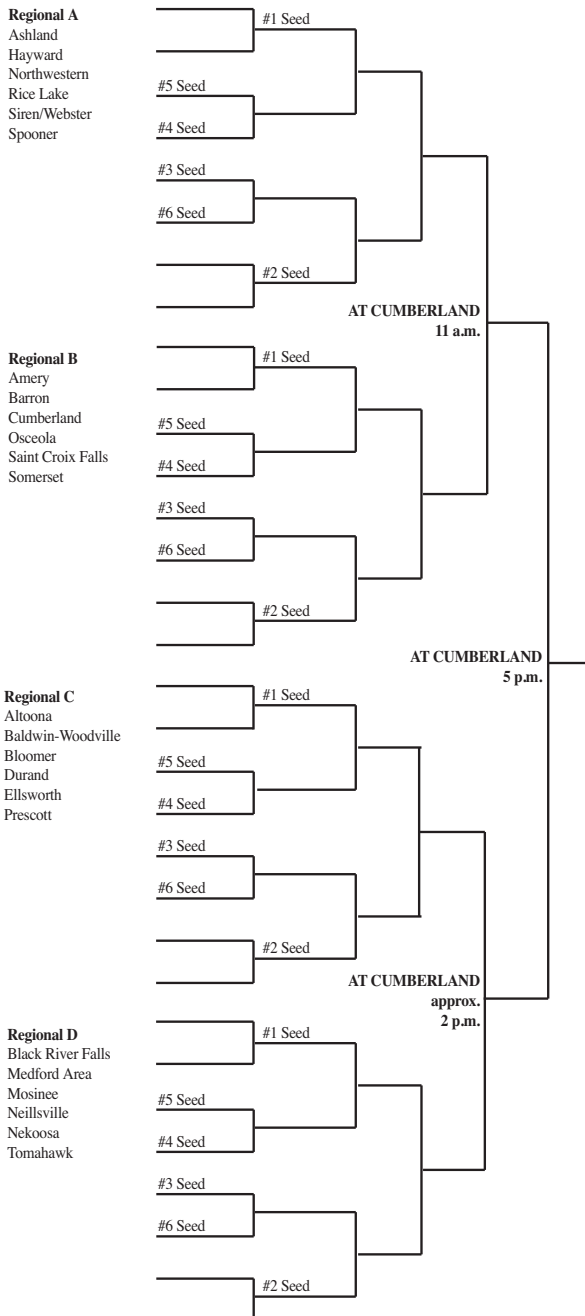

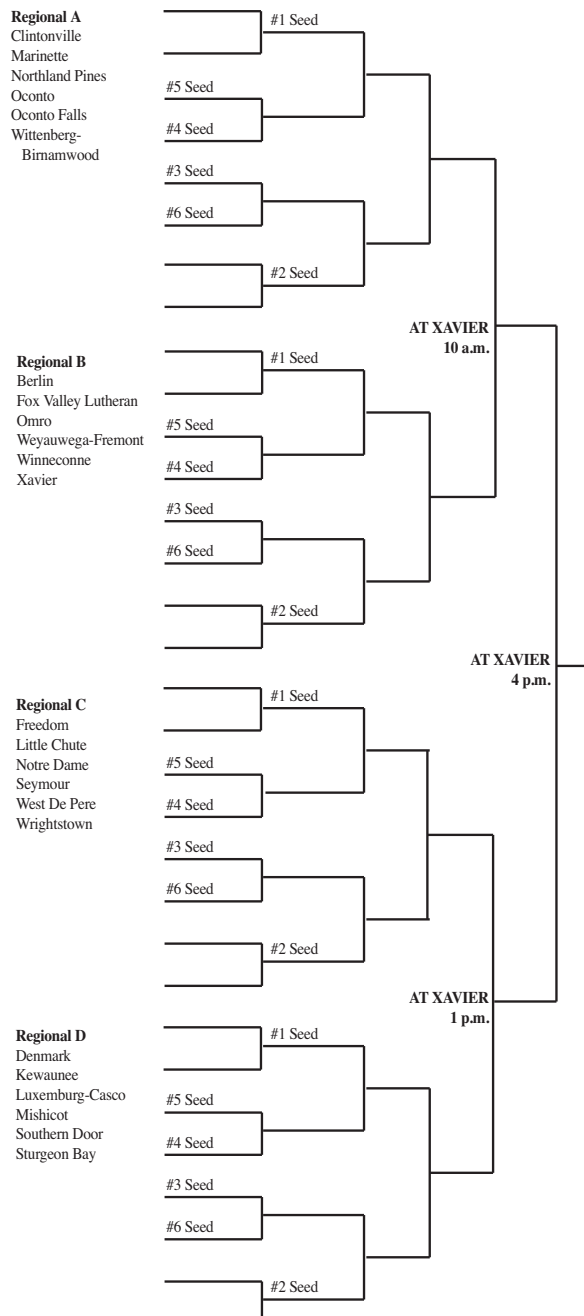

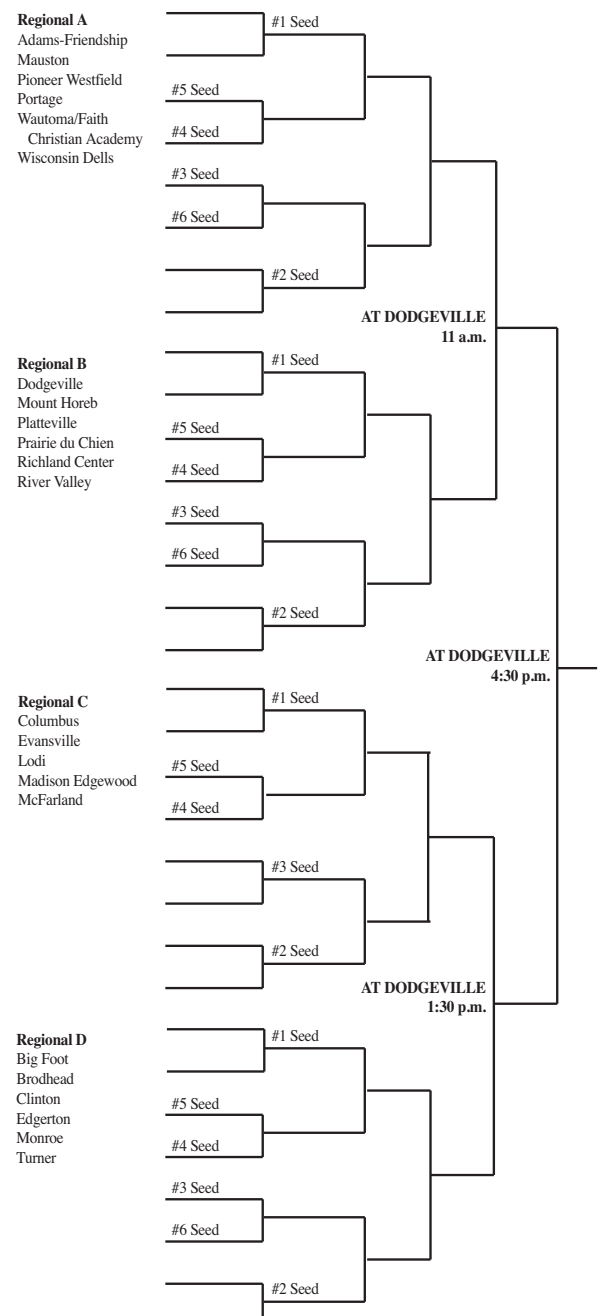

sity softball team and play some JV. Is she good to play? Anything that I need to do so the gal is able to play varsity?

A.: Student could be afforded non-varsity opportunities only, this year; unless a waiver is sought/provided. Her practice is not restricted (ROE-IIB).

Amateur Status

Q.: I read Article IV Amateur Status, Section 1B, 1) b. My question is this: I have some track t-shirts that I received at no cost. I thought of giving them away to track athletes, one at a time per week. (i.e., an athlete who never misses practice, or an athlete who demonstrates a wonderful attitude during practice). My AD suggested that I better check to see if this is OK.

A.: No Problem. Both in the Bylaws, Art. XI (p. 29) and in the Rules of Eligibil-

ity – as you have identified; our members have determined a T-shirt to be an acceptable award for athletes to receive.

Competition & Practice

Q.: I am a high school girls varsity soccer coach. I have two guys that want to be managers for our girls soccer team. As you know we play in the spring and the boys play in the fall. They are going to be seniors next year, and I am assuming they will play on the guys team.

1) Can they be managers for our team without affecting their eligibility? 2) Can they come to our practice? In the past, I had two guys that were seniors, so it does not apply, I used them in some drills, etc., to show how it is done.

A.: Using these students as managers might be done within the rules. Key is that they are 100 percent managers. Hustling water, first aid, nets, balls, equipment, keeping stats, etc. – No Problems. ABSOLUTELY ZERO involvement with coach-

ing/instruction, drills etc. Any involvement outside of pure managerial – is a violation and holds potential peril for the boys and school team. Ordinarily, managers do attend practice. But again, they can not engage in any way/shape or form with your practice – other than in off-field managerial role. WIAA provisions allow each student up to four seasons of school sponsored soccer – and only one per school year. In this instance, the students hold the potential for burning their last season of school-sponsored soccer - in a spring practice setting. For seniors, this isn't a problem – moot point. Their HS eligibility is already over.

Participation Issues

Q.: The parents of a local home-school boy have asked our golf coach if their son could practice with our team. They were told that

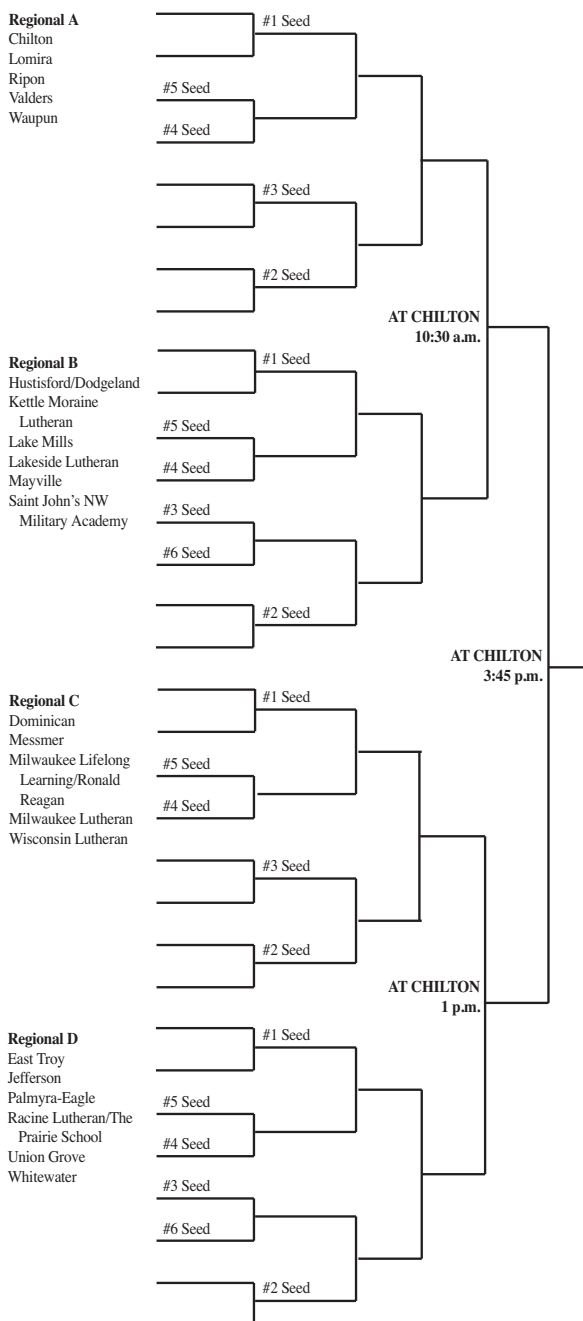

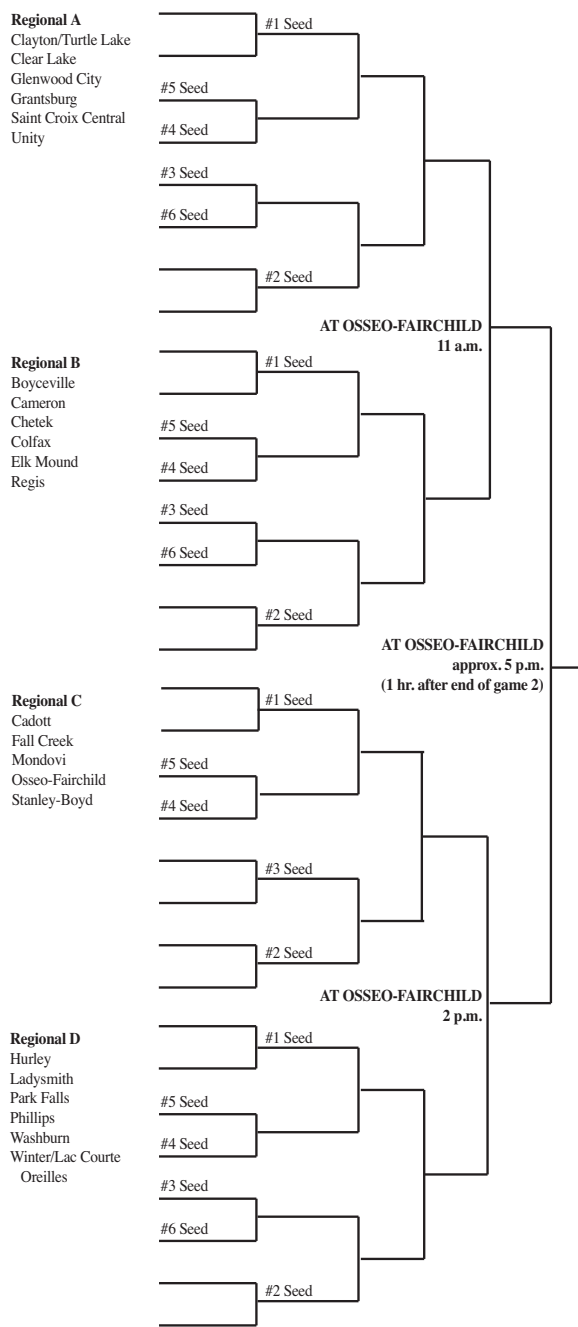

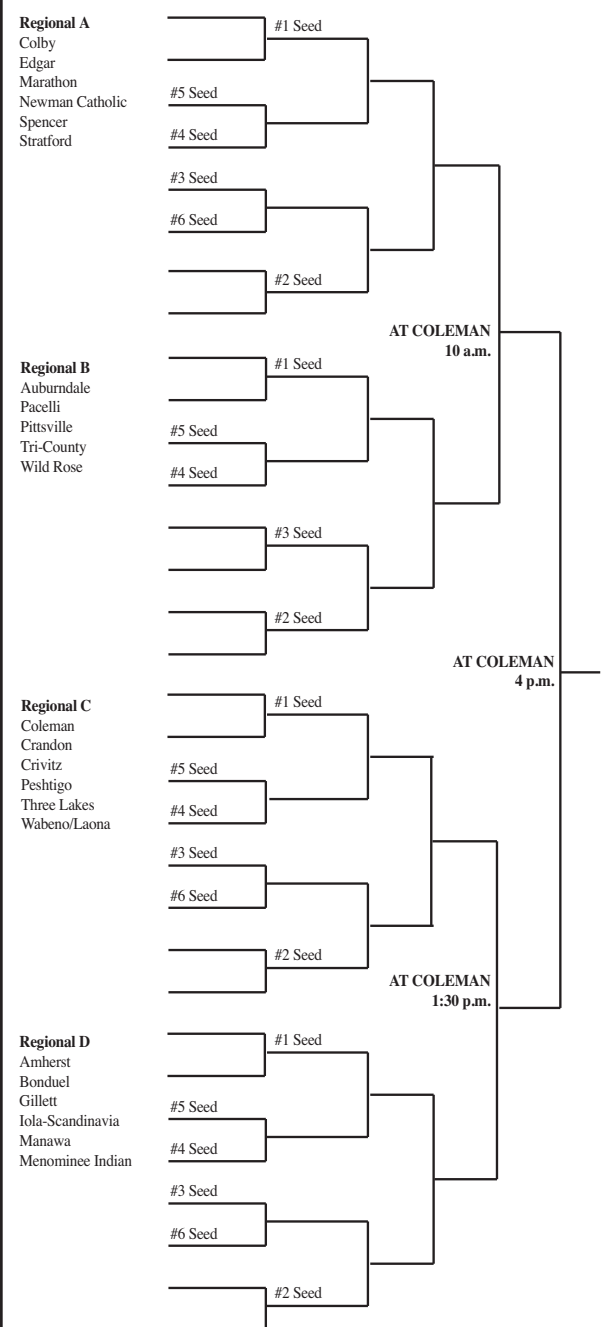

state guidelines would not permit their son to be a participating member of the team. They understood the rule scenario. They felt that merely being able to be around a team would be a very positive effect on their son. The boy is supposedly very mildly autistic. We know that he has played golf for several years with the autism in no way affecting his ability to play the game or be part of a group. He is taking one (1) class at our school. We have nine (9) players on our team this season. Allowing this boy to play as our 10th player would seem only the proper path to follow. All parties would know that his score would not count or in any way affect the outcome of any match. He shoots in the 50s on what would be considered to be tougher than normal high school course. JV players in our area usually shoot in that range. I know our conference coaches would not object but we felt it proper to run this by

you.

A.: If there was any relief that we could offer you, of course we would. Our member's rules provide that you will only use your own full-time students on your interscholastic athletic teams. You may involve "members of the community" in your practices as you might wish to allow. But in so far as setting aside the member's rule – neither you or I have the unilateral authority to do that. If the student wishes to golf for your school team – one solution would be to have him enroll as a full-time student.

Out-of-Season Concerns/Equipment

Q.: I have a question for you about an all-star game for conference basketball players (all seniors of course). The date is scheduled for April 19 - so it is for sure "out-of-season." My

question is this: We have five teams that we pick players from for each team (five team north; five team south). We would like the coach from the best team (according to the season ending standings) from the north and the coach from the best team from the south coach these seniors boys for the all-star game. Is there any problem with this? They are all seniors - out-of-season, is there anything wrong with this? Or should the coaches switch teams so they don't coach any of their players?

A.: Bylaws, Article IV (All Star Prohibition) states, "A school, including its administrators (district administrator and principal), athletic director, and coaches, shall not become involved directly or indirectly with the coaching, management, direction, and/or promotion of any kind of all-star game or similar contest involving

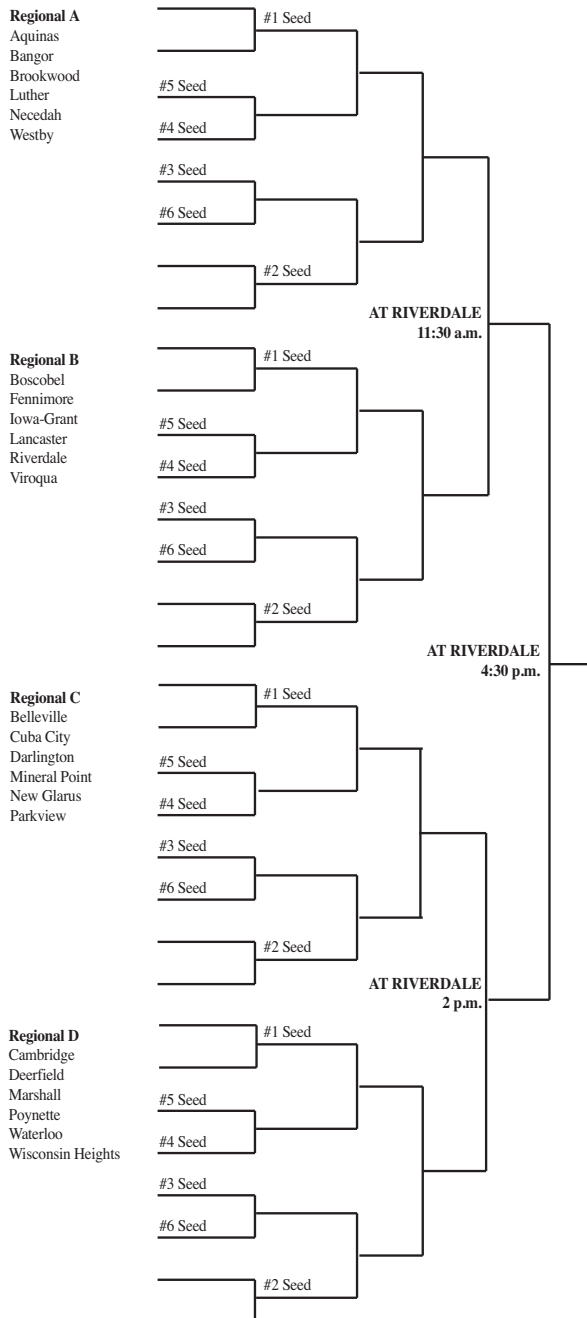

I don't believe that either of the scenarios you might have hoped for may be do-able. Sorry. Some of these sorts of events are bringing back some retired/area "coaching legends" to serve in these events.

Health & Behavior

Q.: What is the rule regarding a coach threatening a player with physical harm. Or calling out that player's parents in front of everyone?

A.: A coach has no status in the WIAA. The coach is an employee of the school district. Such threats should be reported to the school's administration - immediately. †

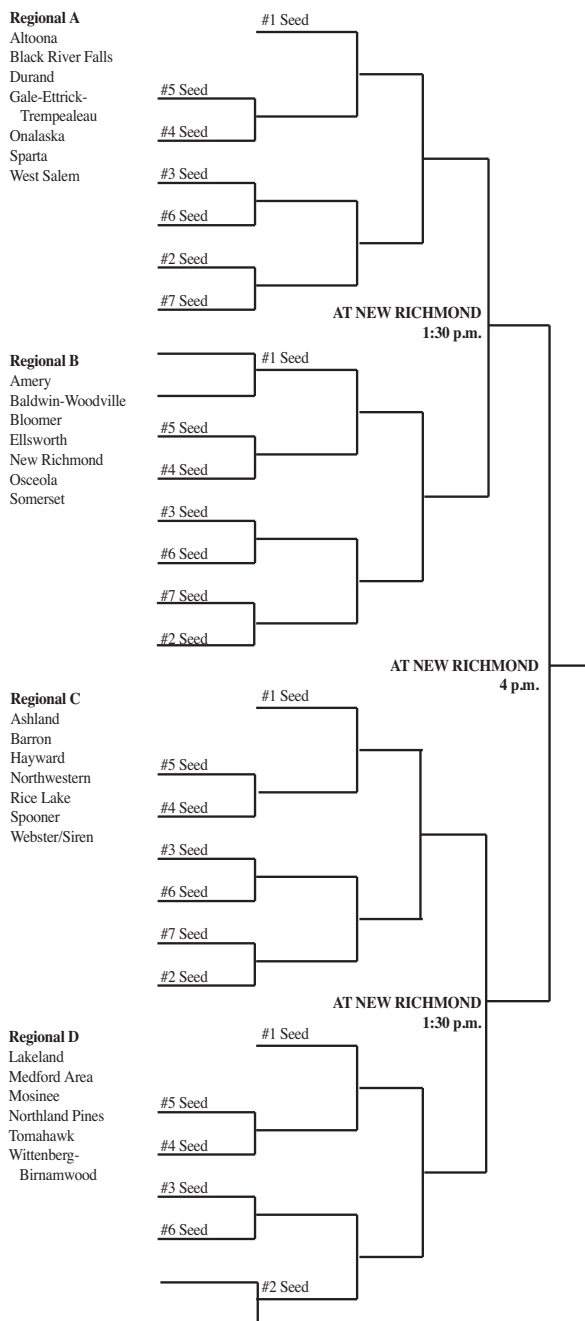

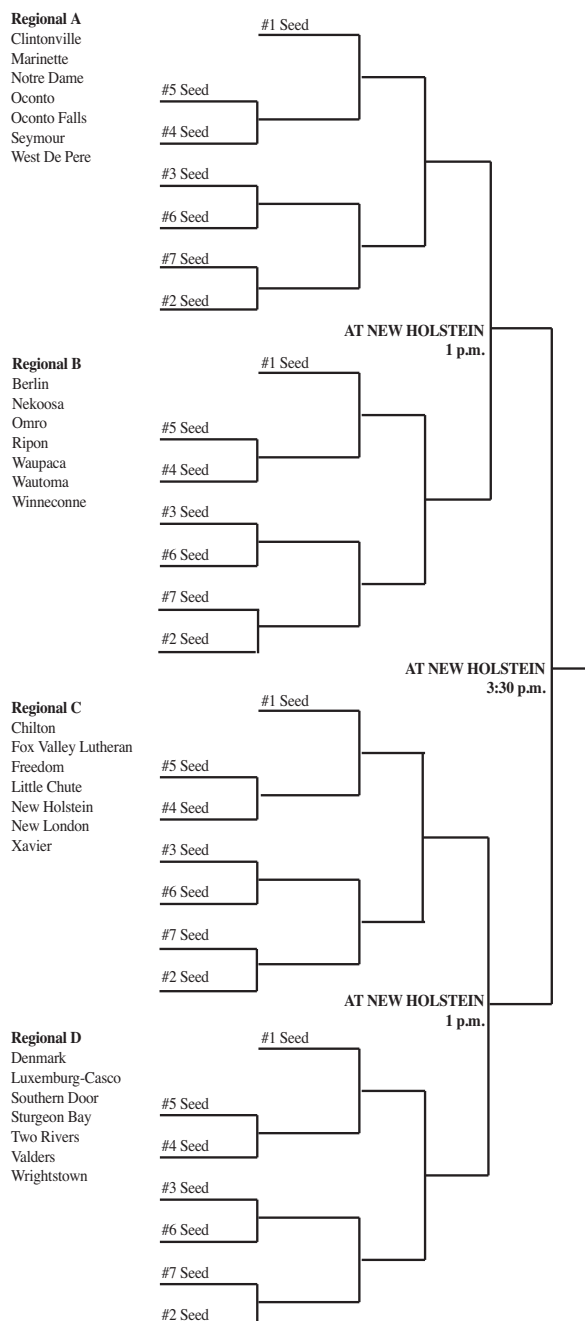

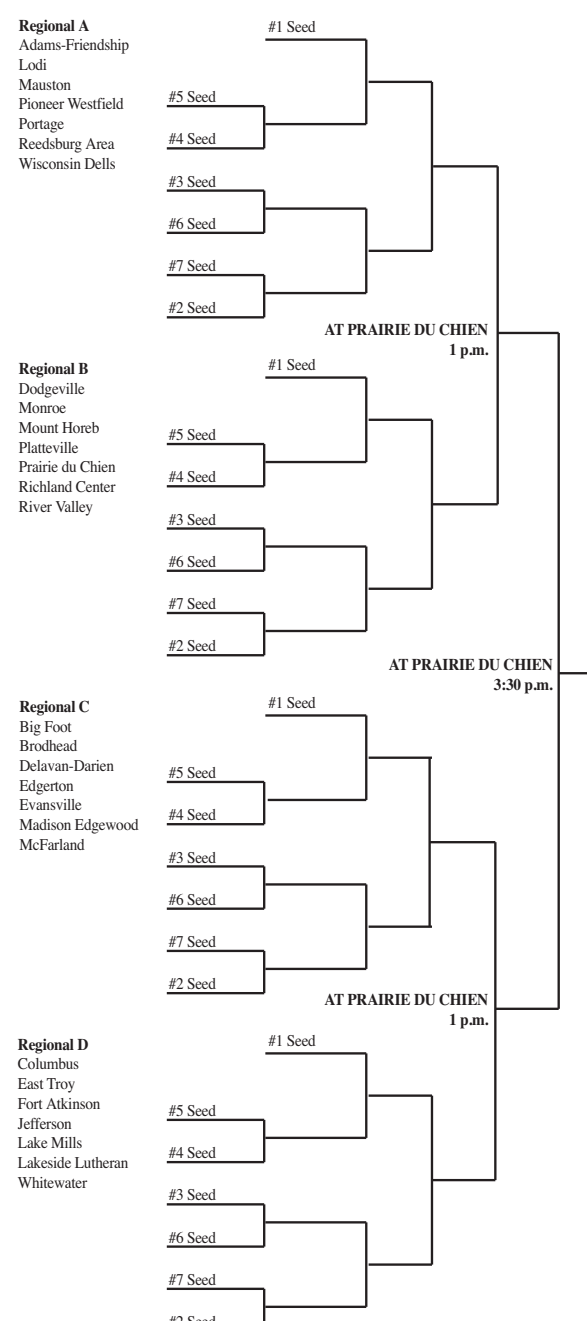

COACHING ADVICE

QUESTION: With the new WIAA coaching regulation, can a coach now walk down the fairways with their golfers?

INTERPRETATION: Yes, it is now allowable for a coach to walk down a fairway with a player. This can be done as long as play is not delayed in any way and the coach remains out of any bunkers and does not go on the greens during the meet.

QUESTION: Can a coach have an electronic measuring device and walk down the fairway with one of their players?

INTERPRETATION: Yes, walking down the fairway with a player and the coach possessing an electronic measuring device is allowed. It is players who are not allowed to possess electronic measuring devices.

Coaches are allowed to do so and are allowed to relay information to players.

Spectators are allowed to carry and use electronic measuring devices, but may only relay yardage information to coaches. Spectators are not allowed to provide any type of information to players during a competition.

QUESTION: Can a coach provide yardage (distance) information to an opponent?

INTERPRETATION: Yes, USGA definitions of advice have been modified to allow the exchange of information on distance, as it is not considered to be "advice."

QUESTION: Can a coach holler to a player on the green the break of a putt?

INTERPRETATION: Yes, a coach can holler to a player the break of a putt; however, appropriate golf etiquette needs to be maintained so as other players are not disturbed and appropriate pace of play is maintained.

PACE OF PLAY

QUESTION: I am concerned about the pace of play we may be dealing with this year due to the new WIAA coaching rule. Can you explain how pace of play delays should be handled?

INTERPRETATION: Keep in mind that pace of play requires both a time limitation and a continuous flow where a group of players get more than a hole behind the group in front of them.

WIAA Spring Season Regulations, Boys Golf, page 15, 15., g., indicates, "Host schools must determine an appropriate length of time to play the course. Each host manager must mark the

starting time on a designated card for each group, with one card marked per group. The recommended amount of time is two hours and 15 minutes for nine holes and four hours and 30 minutes for 18 holes. First violation - warning; second violation - a one-stroke penalty will be assessed to groups that do not meet the pace of play limits." If a group is behind in time and more than a hole behind the group in front of them then the penalty for delay is a group penalty on the players in that group.

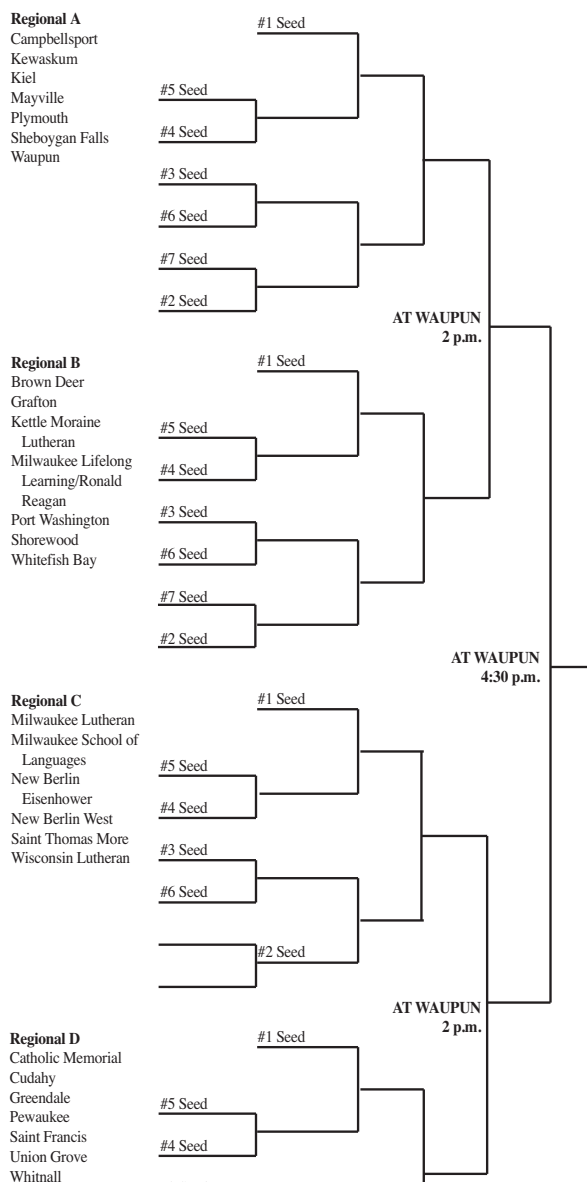

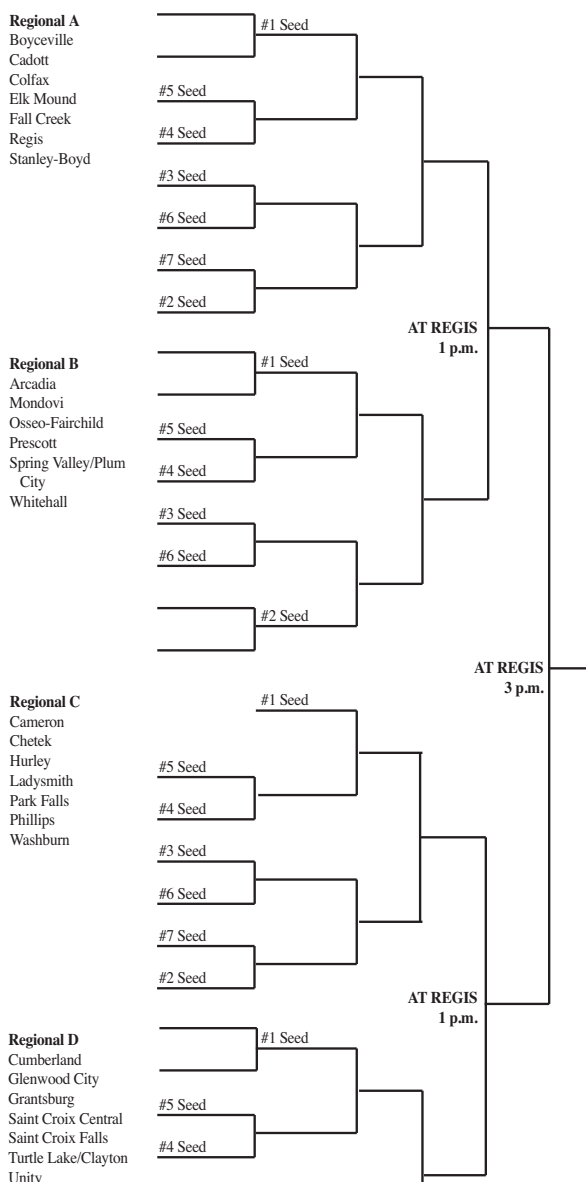

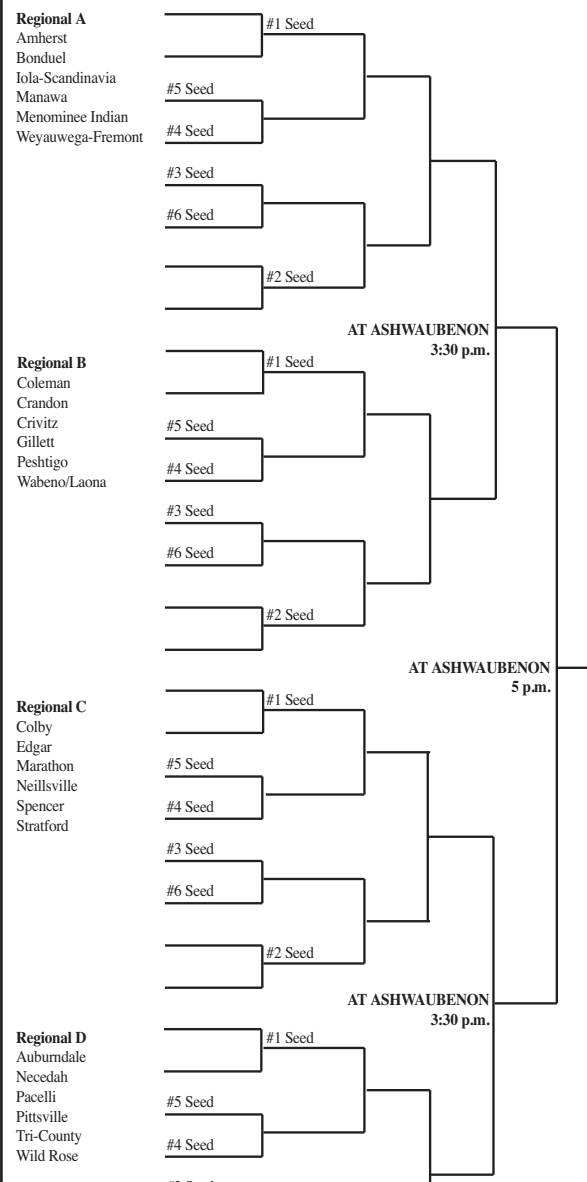

SUMMARY. Here you will find the appeal process that can be used if a penalty is assessed and it is only one individual or a couple of individuals/coaches in a group who have caused the delays: "If a player or players feel an individual or individuals are responsible for the group's penalty/penalties under this structure and would like the meet management to consider waiving the penalty/penalties, the player or players must make an appeal to the meet director/tournament director or the senior rules official prior to leaving the scoring area.

PRACTICE

QUESTION: I would like to take my team to another course to practice (because our home course is not going to open too soon) - the issue is that this other course is not one of

my "home" courses - we do not play a match or tournament at this course this year, so if I take the team over there, does that practice have to count as a meet (toward our maximum)?

INTERPRETATION: Yes, WIAA Season Regulations, page 14, 9., identifies that it is practice at courses where later in the season (regular season and WIAA tournament series) your team will be competing must count such practices in its maximum allowed meets. If you do not have a regular season meet or a WIAA tournament series meet at this site, you are allowed, with school administration approval, to practice at this site.

QUESTION: Is documentation necessary for the five-day summertime contact period?

INTERPRETATION: Yes, your athletic director has a calendar that is to be provided to each

coach who will be having summertime contact for the five-day period prior to July 31. It is best to identify the five days and then have this calendar on file in the athletic director's office in case questions should arise.

AMATEUR STATUS

QUESTION: Can our golf course provide a free pass to members of our golf team for the remainder of the year?

INTERPRETATION: Only if this offer of a free pass is not only made to the members of the golf team, but is also available to all students at your high school.

Providing a free pass to member or members of the golf team violates WIAA Amateur Status regulations where it is indicated: "A student shall be determined to be in violation if he/she: Accepts, receives and/or directs to another, reimbursement or award in any form of (a) salary,

(b) cash, (c) merchandise of any kind or amount or (d) share of game or season proceeds, for achievement in athletics.

QUESTION: Can a school golf team be allowed to practice or compete at a golf course for free?

INTERPRETATION: Yes, so long as the golf program is open to all students in the high school to try out for the team, golf teams are allowed to receive benefits like free or reduced practice rounds, competition rounds, and range balls.

USGA REGULATIONS

QUESTION: What if a golfer grounds the putter on the green, then the ball moves, and then the player takes his stance?

INTERPRETATION: USGA Decision 18-2b/4 - If the ball moved after the club was placed in position but before the player had

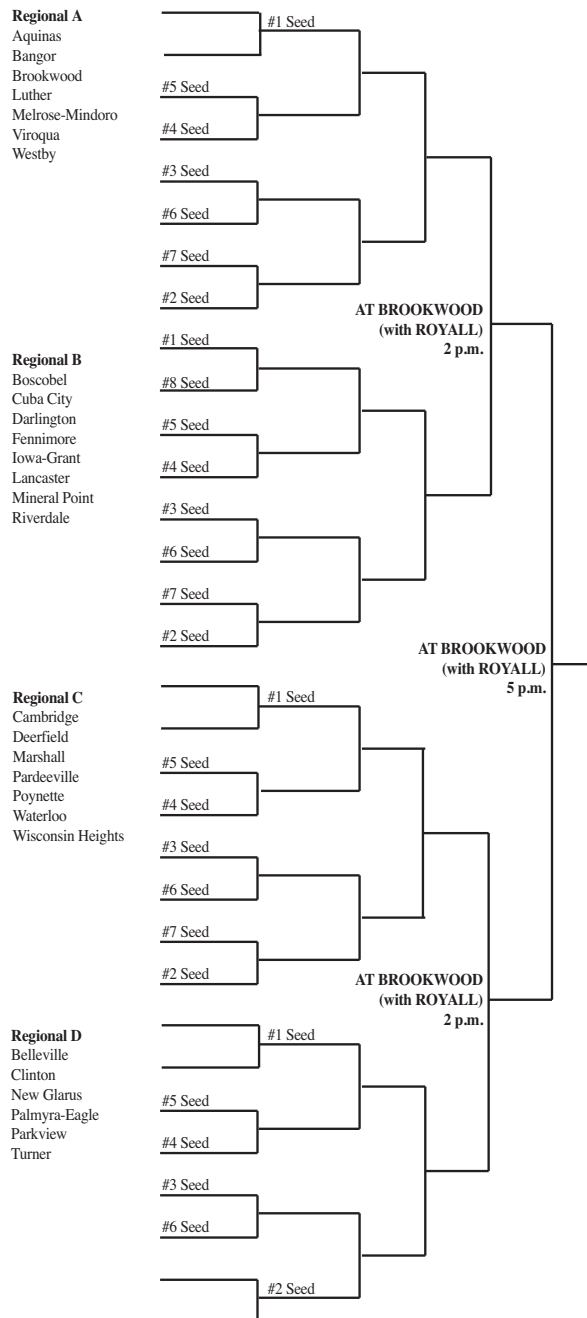

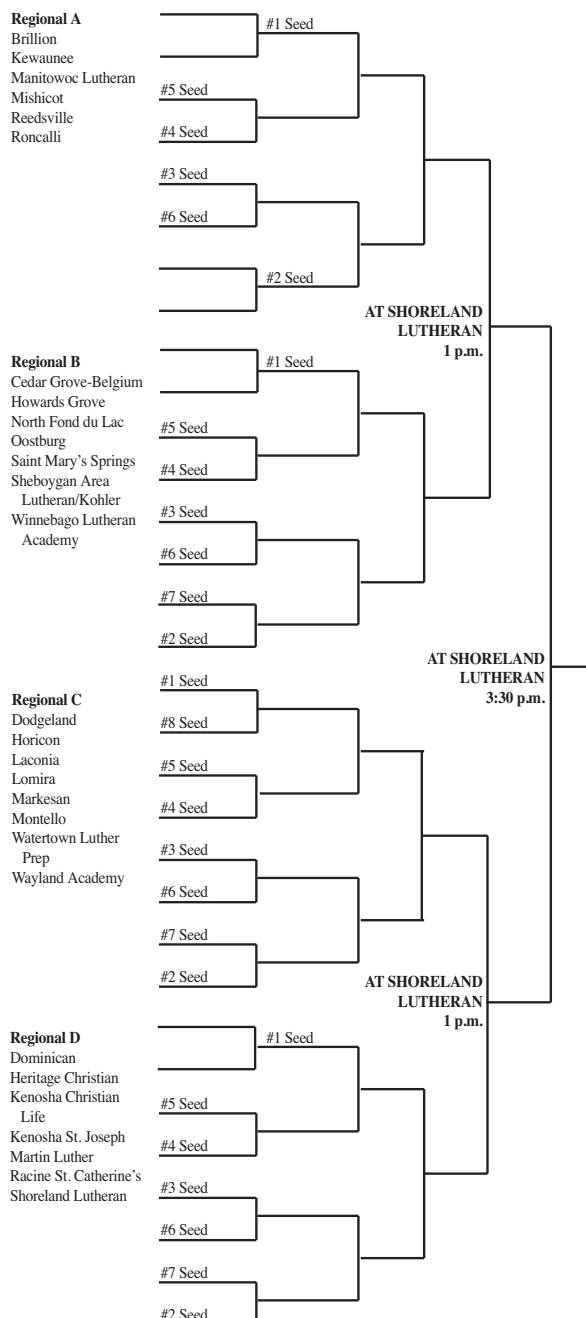

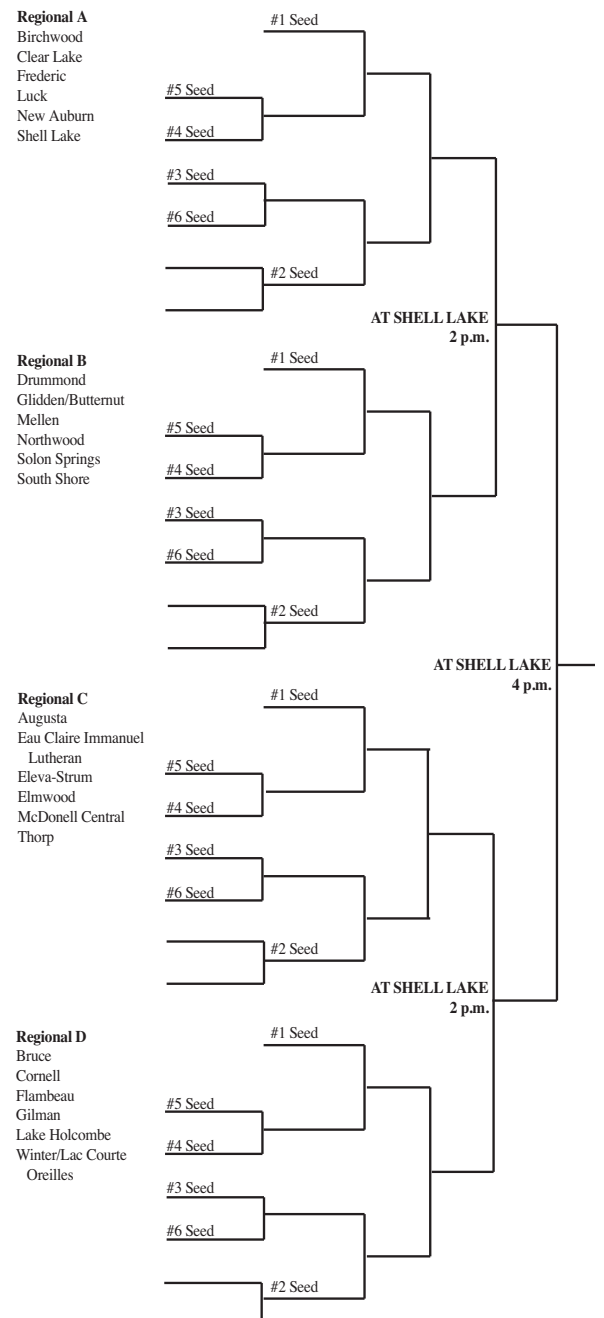

completed taking the stance, he incurs a penalty stroke under Rule 18-2a for having caused the ball to move and must replace the ball, unless there is strong evidence that wind or some other agency caused the ball to move.

QUESTION: Is there a penalty stroke if a player takes a practice swing in a lateral hazard and barely touches the tops of the grass?

INTERPRETATION: USGA Decision 13-4/4 – No, provided the player did not improve his lie or test the condition of the hazard – see Note to Rule 13-4.

There is some gray area with this rule as “grounding” the club in the grass is a penalty stroke – see USGA Decision 18-2b/5.

NON-SCHOOL COMPETITIONS

QUESTION: Can high school golfers participate in any of the WSGA Match Play Qualifiers, May 28-31, 2009?

INTERPRETATION: No, WIAA regulations as found in Article VI – Nonschool Participation on

page 37 of the WIAA Senior High School Handbook indicates: **Note 2: No waiver shall be provided for nonschool competition which occurs during the respective WIAA tournament series in a sport.**

WIAA GOLF REGULATIONS

QUESTION: Is there a rule that golf meets cannot be held if the weather temperature is below 40 degrees?

INTERPRETATION: The WIAA does not have any language that prohibits a golf meet from being held when the temperature drops to 40 degrees or below. Athletic directors and golf coaches should check with the host site management to identify if they have any such regulations.

QUESTION: Can we play both our varsity and JV’s in the same invitational on the same day?

INTERPRETATION: In golf, schools are allowed to play both their varsity and JV teams in the same invitational on the same

day. Coaches and athletic administrators are advised to review carefully the **MAXIMUM ALLOWED MEETS** and the **INDIVIDUAL PARTICIPATION LIMITATIONS** sections of the WIAA Spring Season Regulations to be certain these maximums are not exceeded.

QUESTION: If a coach sees a player throw a club, they are supposed to report that to the tournament manager. Are they supposed to tell the player? Are they specifically not supposed to talk with the player? In most cases the coach is out on the golf course and will not see the tournament manager for some time and the player may not be notified until much later than the infraction. What if another player in the group wants to call the player for throwing a club, what is that procedure?

INTERPRETATION: If a coach sees a player throw a club, the correct procedure as described in 15., c., page 15 of the WIAA Season Regulations, identifies that this kind of unsportsman-

like conduct should be reported to the tournament manager. The tournament manager is the one to investigate. Coaches should find the tournament manager as quickly as possible so the matter can be investigated and resolved.

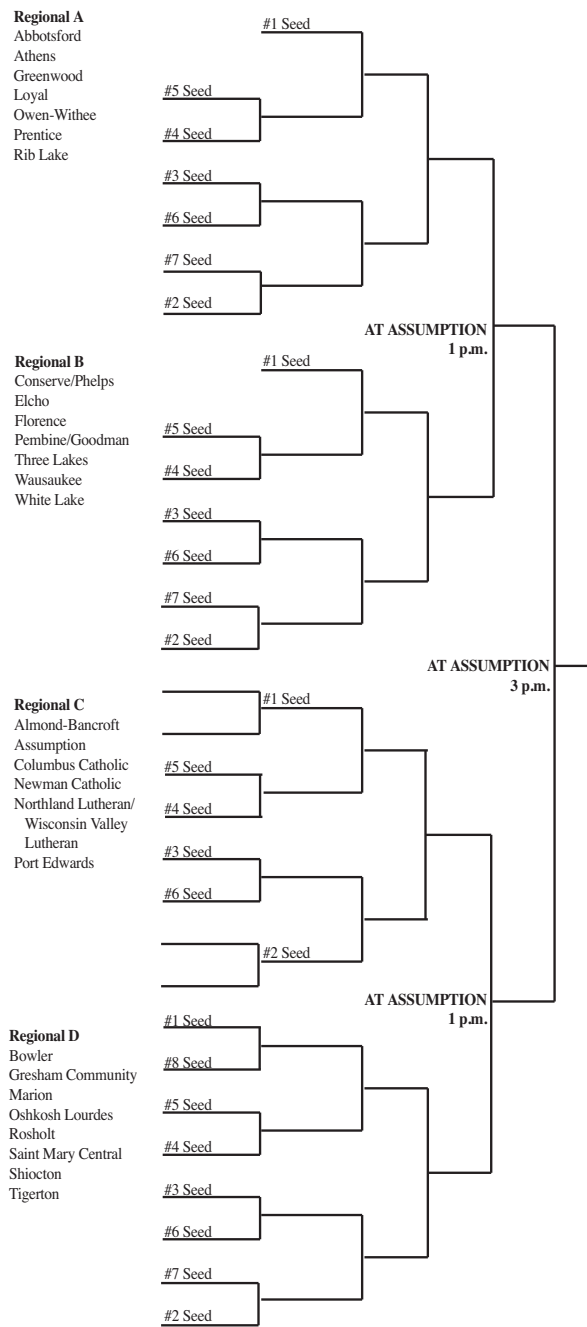
If a player witnesses unsportsmanlike conduct in his/her group, “players may also assess another player a warning for the first violation and two stroke penalty for the second unsportsmanlike conduct violation, but must report a third violation to the tournament manager for disqualification.” For the first and second violations, players are to inform the responsible player of the unsportsmanlike conduct and then inform their coach or tournament manager of the incident whenever they come around to their group. On a third violation, a player needs to report this infraction to the tournament manager. †

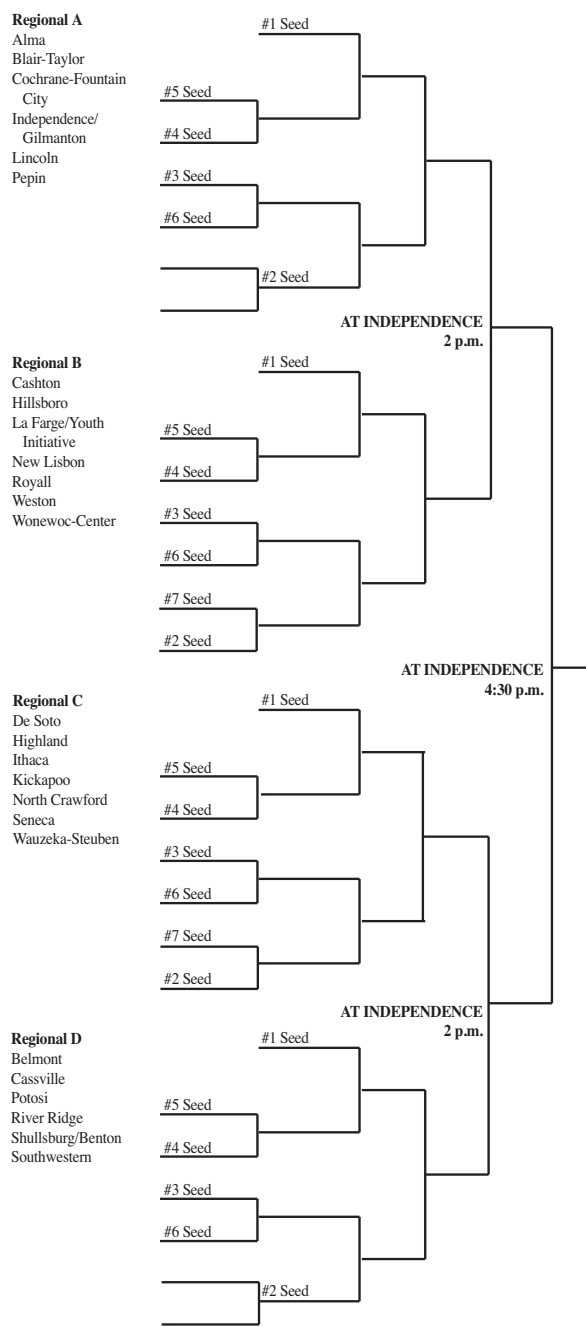

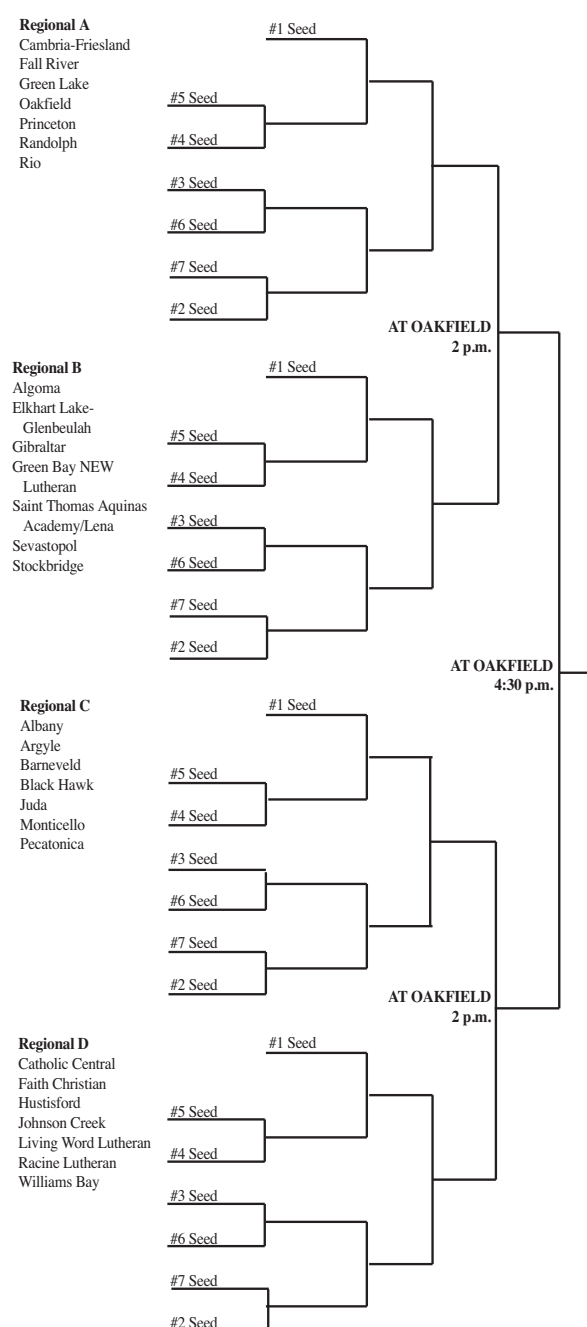

ELECTRONIC PLAYER SEASON RECORD (PSR) FORM

QUESTION: Where do I find the new Player Season Record form?

INTERPRETATION: The new, interactive Player Season Record (PSR) form has been emailed to athletic directors of WIAA tennis schools and to key members of the Wisconsin High School Tennis Coaches Association. The easiest way to attain your form is to contact your athletic director.

This new electronic form allows coaches to email it for both regular season and WIAA tournament seeding and special qualifier purposes. We encourage you to email your PSR for seeding and special qualifiers for the WIAA Individual Tournament to dlepak@wiaawi.org.

QUESTION: How should I title all the different Player Season Record forms for my players and doubles teams?

INTERPRETATION: Each form or file needs to be identified for each singles player or doubles team as follows:

Singles players: use the first four letters of a players last name followed by a "." and then the complete school name followed by the suffix ".xls."

Example: brow.Brookfield East.xls – (for Mary Brown from Brookfield East High School).

Doubles teams: Use the first four letters of one of the players last name followed by a ".", then the first four letters of the other players last name followed by a ".", the schools complete name and then the suffix ".xls."

Example: jone.keye.Brookfield Central.xls – (for Mike Jones and Jerry Keyes from Brookfield Central High School.)

QUESTION: In the tennis meeting video you refer to an electronic means of submitting a players record. Will there be a tool available that will allow us to electronically compile our players' stats during the season?

INTERPRETATION: The new Electronic Player Season Record form provided to your athletic director and to key members of the WHSTCA is the form for coaches to now use.

WITHDRAWALS

QUESTION: If a player withdraws from a match during the regular season, how is that now handled?

INTERPRETATION: The new regulation reads as follows: If a player is unable to compete (withdraws, retires, defaults, walks over, or disqualifies herself/himself) from a match during the regular season that the player/team records a loss on the season record for that match. During WIAA tournament play, the player may not return to play that day. If a match is in progress, the score shall stand, any additional sets not yet played will

be scored 2-0; for a match not yet begun 2-0, 2-0.

TEAM WITHDRAWALS

QUESTION: We've come across situations where we go to a multi-team meet, and due to various reasons one or two teams might not be enough people to fill all seven flights.

INTERPRETATION: If this is a conference meet, the conference needs to develop language as to how this should be handled and where the singles and doubles teams need to play. If it is a non-conference meet, the host school needs to determine how this will be handled. It has been suggested/recommended that if a school team does not have enough players to fill a team, they should be placed in rank order in the top positions (#1, #2, etc.) until all players are used.

QUESTION: At the same time, some teams have brought extra players who end up filling the vacant spots for a team other than theirs.

INTERPRETATION: No, WIAA Season Regulations, 6., c., A school may enter only one varsity meet per day. WIAA regulations do not allow additional players to take a vacated spot available from another team nor do WIAA regulations allow student-athletes from one school to practice with or compete for another school team other than the school where they are eligible.

JV COACHING CONTACT DURING A MEET

QUESTION: As long as the pace of play is not hindered JV coaches are allowed to talk/coach players. Is this correct?

INTERPRETATION: Yes, JV coaches are allowed to talk, coaches can provide signals to players. The intent of this rule is to allow coaches – especially head coaches – the opportunity to work with JV players who are learning the game of tennis during competitive matches. USTA Rule 29. Continuous play and all other USTA and WIAA time limitations need to be maintained.

QUESTION: Are JV and varsity coaches allowed coaching both levels at a meet?

INTERPRETATION: If a school has only two coaches (head coach and assistant), yes, both the head coach and the assistant can instruct both the varsity and the JV players during their matches. If a school has three or more coaches, the coaches that will be working with student athletes at each level need to be identified prior to the start of the match.

MULTI-SITE EVENTS

QUESTION: If a team is at a varsity invite with three or more sites, can one coach be at each site?

INTERPRETATION: The new interpretation following discussion at the 2005 WIAA Coaches Advisory Committee meeting on this issue is that

up to two coaches per level of program can provide instruction to tennis players as found in the WIAA Season Regulations at the times indicated. This allows two coaches to be identified at the varsity level and two different coaches (if available) to provide instruction at the JV level. Coaches must be under contract with the school as tennis coaches to be eligible to instruct during a tennis meet.

If the meet is a varsity only meet, only two coaches can be used to provide instruction.

WIAA SEASON REGULATIONS

QUESTION: Can a school tennis team have their JV team compete in a varsity invite on the same day that a school's varsity team hosts their own invitational?

INTERPRETATION: No, WIAA rules only allow one varsity meet per day per WIAA Season Regulations, 6., c., page 36.

QUESTION: Can a school tennis team have "captain's practices" prior to the start of the boy's tennis season?

INTERPRETATION: No, "captain's practices" can only be held during the summertime period. There are no restrictions relative to voluntary assembling of students during the summer in excess of five (5) days in tennis without school/coach involvement. (WIAA Sr. High Handbook-pg. 38)

QUESTION: Can scrimmages be scheduled for the varsity reserve and JV teams in tennis?

INTERPRETATION: Yes, however, a couple of points of emphasis here: 1. Please review the WIAA Season Regulations as found on page 35-36 regarding scrimmages. 2. Scrimmages are allowed so long as there is no loss of academic time. 3. An individual student is allowed to participate in only one day of scrimmage activity. Note: An individual student may participate in multiple levels of scrimmages conducted on the same day. 4. One tennis team cannot consider a scrimmage to be a meet and the other team consider it to be a scrimmage. A scrimmage is either a meet for both schools or a scrimmage for both schools.

QUESTION: Can a singles player be entered at the number two position if he has played the varsity number three position most of the year and only played the varsity number two position twice?

INTERPRETATION: Yes, to be allowed to be entered in the WIAA tennis sectional in singles flights 1, 2 and 3, a player must have played at least three singles matches during the regular season at any varsity flight. A player entered at flight four does not have to meet this requirement.

QUESTION: Tom, what would happen if the player in question play's #4 with

his non-dominate hand throughout the regular season after which (after the conclusion of the regular season and before the start of the state tournament series) he has permission from his doctor to begin playing with his dominate hand. Let's say that playing with his dominate hand enables him to beat (in challenge matches) the player(s) on our team who played #1, #2 or #3 during the regular season. If that was the case and he was entered in the sectionals as #4, would we be in violation of the "order of strength rule"?

INTERPRETATION: Obviously, we can't predict this just yet and, ultimately, other coaches will police this matter. If someone is clearly better than the players above him, tennis regulations for rank order indicate that player must be moved up.

The answer if this happens is – yes – if a player is given approval to use his/her dominate hand after playing with a non-dominate hand throughout the regular season; if a coach believes he/she is the number one player on the team, during the tournament series he/she would have to be the number one player otherwise you would be in violation of the rank order regulation.

Coaches are going to question a #3 or #4 position when a player should/could be a #1. As always, I encourage regular documentation of challenge matches and regular season matches. In this case, since he was a state qualifier last year and almost won his first match against a very good opponent, it will be best to play him at the higher spot if there is any question.

ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTION

QUESTION: Are the boys allowed to attend group tennis lessons during the season? These lessons do not interfere with or replace the school practice... they are additional hitting opportunities for the players that are run by the club pro.

INTERPRETATION: After the conclusion of the school practice, student-athletes are not prohibited from attending other non-school practice sessions, clinics or instructional opportunities on their own. If this happens to be in a "group" scenario, they are allowed to do so. A couple of things to keep in mind with this, if the group tennis lesson is a requirement, then the instructor becomes a team coach, and this can only be done one time on one day. I also will always remind parents and student-athletes that ask this question that they do need to communicate their intentions with their head coach as risk of injury increases with additional workouts. In addition, differences in philosophy may exist between the school coach and the club pro; not to mention the loss of academic study time that is also being greatly reduced. †

2009 Softball Seeding Meeting Host Sites

Coaches Education Information

If you have coaches that are not licensed to teach (CNLT) in the state of Wisconsin, it is a WIAA requirement that they complete the required coaches education training before they can begin to coach their second year.

The following do not have to take this required training:

A student teacher while student teaching.

An individual with an administrator's or counselor's license.

Guest lecturers (one time appearance).

The following must take an approved course before they can coach a second year:

Anyone that does not fit one of the above listed categories.

Anyone that does not have a current license to teach in Wisconsin.

The following conditions do not exempt a person from the requirement:

Holding a license that has expired.

Being a volunteer

Being unpaid

Being an occasional, but regularly scheduled lecturer or demonstrator.

Having been a student teacher, but is not longer officially in that capacity.

Being a nonvarsity coach

Being an assistant coach.

CNLT's can meet the WIAA coaches education requirement by taking either the American Sports Education Program (ASEP) Sport First Aid and Coaching Principles courses or the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) Fundamentals of Coaching and First Aid for Coaches

courses.

Both the ASEP and NFHS courses are offered online and can be accessed from the WIAA homepage.

Periodically there are instructor-led ASEP courses offered which are listed in the Bulletin and on the WIAA web site. There are no NFHS instructor-led courses offered in Wisconsin.

The cost of the NFHS Fundamentals of Coaching is \$35 and the First Aid for Coaches is \$45. The cost of the ASEP Coaching Principles is \$60 and Sport First is \$50.

EDITORIAL

The Annual Meeting: The Pride of Membership

The strength of any democratic process is the involvement and active participation of the constituency in taking ownership in its policies and governing authority.

That's an aphorism we have stated time and time again. It's also a position few, if any, would dispute on its merits. Therefore, deductive reasoning would lead one to proclaim the saboteur of any democratic process is apathy.

The Association has thrived with participation by a vast majority of schools in its membership through Area Meetings and the Annual Meeting. More than 86 percent of member schools have exercised their privilege by attending at least one Annual Meeting over the past three years.

This overwhelming participation by an engaged and responsible membership is neither surprising nor inconsistent with what has been the norm throughout the 113-year history of the organization.

With this background, what is somewhat perplexing is the consistency a relatively few members electing not to take part in the democratic process afforded them by their Constitution. Nearly 14 percent, or 70 schools, have not attended the Annual Meeting to vote on Constitutional issues the last three years. In addition, 17 member schools have skipped the meeting the past two years. An even greater number have not submitted votes for a candidate representing their respective districts on the Board of Control or Advisory Council.

A review of the list of schools that have not recently attended the Annual Meeting to vote on the membership's Constitutional amendments reveals a majority of them are in the small and medium enrollment classifications. We continue to emphasize and encourage all schools to engage in the issues facing their Association.

Whether attendance is determined by economic and budget considerations or for other reasons, the WIAA Executive Staff is committed to including all its members in the process by disseminating information on policies and issues requiring membership involvement. The Annual Meeting will again be delivered to schools with a live Internet stream on wiaa.tv. While proxy voting privileges are not available, those interested can be apprised of the amendment outcomes and discussions. In the future, technology may allow for consideration of proxy votes.

The agenda for next week's Annual Meeting includes a number of amendments to the Constitution and Rules of Eligibility, editorial changes and discussions on several im-

portant topics of interest to the membership.

Of the five proposed amendments, three received unanimous support for approval in advancing them to a membership vote. The first creates an associate membership for charter schools that are under the auspices of a member public school. The change would create an opportunity for charter school students to participate only at the school their residency places them. Associate members would not have voting or co-op team privileges.

The second reclassifies the sport of cross country from a team sport to an individual sport for the purpose of violation administration. Rationale for the change identifies a means to exclude an individual from team scoring without disqualifying an entire team or other individual competitors.

The third eliminates language from the Waivers section of the Residence and Transfer Article in the Rules of Eligibility that reduces the chance of confusion. It eliminates the home-life betterment text that is best included in the "extenuating circumstances" conditions.

Two of the proposed amendments received significantly more attention and discussion within committees. The first is a proposal to add a penalty to the Flagrant and Unsportsmanlike Conduct Section for inappropriate behavior directed toward a contest official. The amendment would declare a student-athlete immediately ineligible for 90 calendar days from the date the player intentionally and aggressively contacts, or spits on, an official. In addition, the player would be ineligible to compete in the first 25 percent of the next season in that same sport the altercation occurred.

The final amendment advancing for membership vote would add soccer to the list of sports already identified that coaches are allowed unlimited coaching contact in the summertime.

These along with editorial changes intended to clarify—not change—the interpretation of the rules require a membership vote. Other topics to be addressed include supplements, divisional placements, seasonal placements, out-of-season competition, nine-player football and an update of legal proceedings. Each of these topics have an impact on the future direction of the Association.

The pride and strength of the WIAA lies within its committed and connected membership. The Annual Meeting represents that pride and strength, which is sure to reveal itself again next week. +
