#### **Executive Summary**

- As part of continuous improvement efforts, the WIAA sought feedback from both active and retired officials.
- Survey responses will help identify key trends, challenges, and opportunities in officiating, ultimately guiding efforts to enhance recruitment, retention, and overall officiating experiences.
- The Donovan Group administered the survey and collected and analyzed the data.
- > The survey was open from April 7 through April 27, 2025.
- > A total of **2,717 officials** responded.

#### **Process & Methodology**




- Administered using the Donovan Group's survey engine.
- Efforts were made to ensure that all eligible respondents had the opportunity to take the survey, but that no respondents took it multiple times.
- Following best practices in online research and protecting the security of the survey, internet protocol (IP) addresses were logged and each response was time stamped.
- By design, this data is not based on a scientific sample. It should be treated as qualitative data.

#### **Review of Data**

- Reviewed the draft report on May 9 with Executive Director Stephanie Hauser and Assistant Director Chad Schultz.
  - Discussed response data for each individual survey question.
- Conducted additional disaggregation
  - Gender
  - Age group
  - Years of experience officiating
  - Sport officiated




#### At what age did you begin officiating?




#### Why did you start officiating? Check all that apply.




#### Why do you continue to officiate? Select your top two (2) reasons.




## In your opinion, is there a problem with poor sportsmanship?



## Who causes the most problems with poor sportsmanship? Check all that apply.




## Are there schools or conferences where you would not officiate due to poor sportsmanship?




## You indicated there are schools or conferences where you won't/would not officiate due to poor sportsmanship. Please provide your rationale.

- **Hostility from coaches:** Many cited persistent confrontational behaviors from coaches (arguing, berating officials, and setting a negative tone) that trickle down to others.
- **Hostility from spectators**: Officials frequently encounter hostile environments (yelling, being followed) created by adult spectators and parents.
- **Safety concerns**: Several officials described incidents where their physical safety was compromised, such as being caught in on-field brawls, being followed after games, or feeling unsafe due to a lack of crowd control.
- **Accountability from school administration**: Many expressed frustration with administrators who fail to address poor sportsmanship or abusive behavior.
- **Sportsmanship**: Many comments highlighted a broader cultural problem in which winning is prioritized over sportsmanship, leading to environments where poor behavior and disrespect is normalized and perpetuated.


## Who is the most responsible for improving sportsmanship? Check all that apply.




## Have you ever been <u>verbally</u> assaulted/threatened before, during, or after a contest by any of the people listed below? Please check all that apply.




## Have you ever been <u>physically</u> assaulted/threatened before, during, or after a contest by any of the people listed below? Please check all that apply.

#### In your opinion, at what level(s) are sportsmanship the most difficult? Please check all that apply.




#### **30** What does it mean to be a WIAA official?

- **Giving back**: Many expressed that a primary motivation is to give back and provide opportunities for young athletes, contributing to their development and ensuring they can participate.
- **Ensuring fairness and safety**: Officials emphasize the importance of enforcing rules, maintaining fair play, and creating a safe environment for athletes.
- **Being role models**: Officials recognize that they serve as role models for young athletes, coaches, and spectators. They strive to exhibit professionalism, sportsmanship, and leadership, hoping to influence those they interact with positively.
- **Community and camaraderie**: Officiating is often seen as a way to connect with the community and build relationships with fellow officials, coaches, and school personnel.
- **Personal growth and enjoyment**: Many find personal satisfaction, enjoyment, and the chance to continue being part of the game they love.

#### What improvements would you suggest to the WIAA to enhance communication with officials?

- **Digital platform**: Many officials desire a centralized platform (e.g., mobile app or website) that integrates all necessary functions (e.g., scheduling, rules, updates, communication) and is easy to use.
- **Enhanced communication**: Officials want consistent communication, including timely notifications of game changes/cancellations, rule updates, and tournament assignments.
- **Enhanced transparency and feedback**: Many comments emphasized the need for transparency in assigning games (especially playoff games) and evaluating officials (e.g., more constructive feedback).
- **Emphasis on sport-specific communication**: Many believe communication and training should be sports-specific (e.g., rule interpretations and updates).
- **Focus on support and respect**: Officials want to feel valued and supported, including acknowledging their years of service, providing support in dealing with misconduct, and ensuring their safety.

## What improvements would you suggest to <u>conference</u> <u>commissioners</u> to enhance communication with officials?

- **Communication improvements**: Many comments requested improved methods and frequency of communication, including using multiple communication channels (e.g., text, email, app, phone calls) and sending timely reminders and updates.
- **Comprehensive platform**: Many officials expressed frustration with various platforms and would like one standardized platform or system.
- **Providing clear and detailed information**: Officials want clear, detailed information about game assignments (e.g., times, locations, special instructions), with better communication of expectations, rules, and feedback.
- **Enhanced transparency and fairness**: Officials want more transparency in the assignment process, clear criteria for assigning games, and opportunities to provide feedback.
- **Improved responsiveness**: Many comments emphasize the importance of timely responses, more accessibility, and support to address issues promptly and effectively.

#### **Next Steps**

- WIAA staff has received additional reports with data disaggregated by:
  - Gender
  - Age group
  - Years of experience officiating
  - Sport officiated
- Evaluate frequency of future data collection from officials via survey or other means
