WIAA Provides Opportunities; Structure . . .

The Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association (WIAA) is a voluntary, unincorporated, and nonprofit organization. The Association membership has a diversified membership of public high schools, nonpublic high schools, public middle schools, and nonpublic middle schools. Its purpose is to organize, develop, direct and provide interscholastic athletics for member schools.

There are 515 senior high schools affiliated with the WIAA. The estimated number of student-athletes in athletics is 80,000-85,000 annually.

Governance of the WIAA is performed by the member schools. Rules and policies of the Association are developed, promulgated and implemented by the membership either through membership vote for constitutional issues or through a membership-elected committee structure for sport seasons regulations. Therefore, ownership of the membership's rules and regulations, as well as the responsibility of compliance with them, lies with each member school.

The Development of Rules . . .

As fans watch the games during the tournament, some wonder how the rules of the game and of the WIAA were created.

- ◆ The National Federation of State High School Associations is the authority of the competition rules for sport contests (i.e. uniforms, length of contest, game rules). As a member of the NFHS, the WIAA adheres to those rules as a member in good standing. The WIAA, as well as all state associations in the NFHS, has input with an advisory role in the review and promulgation of the playing rules. The NFHS office is located in Indianapolis, Indiana.
- ◆ For changes to the membership's Constitution, Bylaws and Rules of Eligibility, a vote of the entire membership is required at the Annual Meeting each spring. The Constitution contains information relating to the Association as an organization. The Bylaws encompass information relating to member high schools' responsibility concerning WIAA rules and regulations. The Rules of Eligibility embody information relating to the relationship of the student-athlete to the high school and the WIAA.
- ◆ The Board of Control has the ultimate authority in determining the outcome of sport seasons rule recommendations and regulations. Changes to the sport seasons regulations are advanced through the democratic committee structure. Among the advisory groups that provide input to the Board are the coaches advisory committees for each sport; the sports advisory committee, comprised of school athletic directors from each of the seven districts; the Advisory Council, consisting of school administrators from each elector district; and the executive staff. Other groups with advisory responsibilities include the Medical Advisory Committee, Sportsmanship Committee and the Officials Advisory Committee. The Season Regulations address, among other topics, definition of the sports seasons, participation, contest control and tournament procedures.

Currently, the Association sponsors 24 sports including baseball, basketball, cross country, 8-player, 11-player football, golf, hockey, soccer, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field, volleyball and wrestling for boys; and basketball, cross country, golf, gymnastics, hockey, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and volleyball for girls.

The WIAA Welcomes You To The

2021 State Boys Golf Championship

The WIAA goes back to 1923 to determine the beginning of its boys spring golf tournament program.

There were 11 schools that participated the first year of the Boys State Golf Tournament. It was held in Racine. Racine (a one high school district at that time) won the championship with Hartland (now Arrowhead) second and South Milwaukee third.

Racine held the tournament the next three years, too, then it moved around among many communities. Lawsonia, near Green Lake, has hosted the State Tournament on two separate occasions (1955-62 and 1976-80). But usually, the sites changed after two or three years. Lake Arrowhead in Adams County held it from 1986 to 1989.

Because golf became a two-class tournament program in 1989, the B-C portion that year went to Mishicot (Fox Hills) where the entire program - meaning three classes for the first time - was held in 1990. Terminology was changed in 1991 from Classes to Divisions (1-2-3). Beginning in 1994, the tournament moved to the University Ridge Course in Madison where it remains today.

The only interruptions in conducting the State Tournament Series to its completion came in 1933 during the Great Depression, in 1943 and 1944 during World War II, and in 2020 when the entire season and Tournament Series were canceled to help prevent the spread of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Madison West holds the greatest number of team titles with 15. Osseo-Fairchild is next with nine, then Arrowhead with eight and Racine Park with seven.

Arrowhead (2007-10) and St. Mary's Springs (2015-18) are the only programs to have won four straight championships. Racine (1923-25), Madison West (1934-36 and 1960-62), Middleton (1997-99) Osseo-Fairchild (1994-96) and Edgewood (2017-19) have won three consecutive titles.

Bill Heim of Green Bay Preble and Jeremy Lyons of Glenwood City are the only

individuals to win medalist honors three times. Heim won from 1986-88 and Lyons from 1997-99.

There have been 15 other individuals that have been medalists twice. Edward Lock of Lake Geneva (now Badger) was the first in 1927-28. Steve Bull of Racine Horlick did it in 1950 and 1952. Rick Radder of Madison West won in both 1961 and 1962; Andy North of Monona Grove won in 1966 and 1967; Mark Voeller of Whitewater in 1988 and 1989; Kent Higley of Eleva-Strum in 1989 and 1990; Scott Cole of New Richmond in 1993 and 1995; Chad Kovaleski of New Richmond in 1999 and 2000; Matt Bark of Washburn in 2000 and 2001; Tyler Obermueller of River Falls in 2002 and 2004; Cody Strang of Edgewood and Jake Nelson of Lady-smith in 2008 and 2009; Charlie Danielson of Osceola in 2010 and 2012; Tyler Leach of Spring Valley in 2016 and 2018; and Piercen Hunt of Arrowhead in 2017 and 2018.

Madison West has produced the individual medalist nine times, the most of any member institution. Four champions have been crowned from Badger, Edgerton, Eleva-Strum, Green Bay Preble, New Richmond, Osseo-Fairchild and Racine Horlick.

Since moving to University Ridge in 1994, Andy Hansen and Jordan Niebrugge of Homestead have shot the best 36-hole score in the State Tournament with a 136 in 2006 and 2012, respectively. The only other golfers to hit below 140 were a 137 by Russell Dettmering of Merrill in 2019, a 138 by Emmet Herb of Middleton in 2016 and a 139 shot by Anthony Aicher of Wausau East in 2009.

2021 State Preview

CHAMPIONSHIP NOTES: Madison West holds the record for the most team golf titles with 15. Osseo-Fairchild is next in line with nine, followed by Arrowhead with eight and Racine Park with seven. Madison West has also produced the most individual champions with nine. Arrowhead (2007-2010) and St. Mary's Springs (2015-18) are the only programs to have won four straight team titles, and there are five other schools that have won three straight championships. Osseo-Fairchild accomplished the feat in 1994-96; Racine did it in 1923-25; Madison West won three straight titles twice, in 1934-36 and 1960-62; Middleton did it from 1997-99; and Edgewood did it most recently from 2017-19. Bill Heim of Green Bay Preble and Jeremy Lyons of Glenwood City are the only individuals to win medalist honors three times. Heim won from 1986-88 and Lyons from 1997-99.

Spectator Guidelines

- Spectators **MUST** stay on cart paths. Keep at least 10 yards from any competitor. Please **do not** walk on or across fairways or greens at any time. Only coaches are allowed on the greens during the practice round and to cross the fairways to help look for balls or discuss a ruling with a player during competition.
- Golf carts will not be available for spectator rental. Spectators with a disability certificate or license from Wisconsin or persons with a note signed by a doctor for a medical condition may inquire about renting a cart at the WIAA tournament desk.
- Spectators may **not** caddy for players during the practice round nor during tournament competition.
- Spectators may **NOT** converse with competitors. Violation of this rule could result in the following penalties:
 - a) 1st Violation - Warning
 - b) 2nd Violation - 2 stroke penalty added to competitor's total score and removal of violator from golf course
 - c) 3rd Violation - Disqualification of competitor
- Applause and positive comments such as "nice shot" are encouraged, but spectators may not speak in private with the competitors. Please do not attempt to give rulings to competitors. Rules officials are on the course for this purpose. They can be identified by the orange flag on their cart.
- We ask your assistance in using trash cans and observing proper golf

course etiquette. Use of alcoholic beverages and tobacco products are prohibited during the WIAA tournament. Please conduct yourself in such a manner that we will be welcomed back for future events.

- Lightning Procedure. If inclement weather dictates the removal of people from the golf course, a warning horn will be sounded. Please seek shelter immediately.
- Electronic communication devices (i.e., cell phones, smart phones, ipads, two-way radios, etc.) may be used to follow live hole-by-hole scoring < www.results.golfstat.com > on the golf course during tournament play by spectators. Use of cell phones is only allowed in and near the clubhouse.
- Players are allowed to use an electronic measuring device (EMD) as approved by USGA regulations during competition. A player can request to use an EMD and/or ask for distance information from another player.

Scoring & Qualifying Procedures

Schools were assigned to one of 16 Division 1 regionals or to one of 12 Divisions 2 or 3 regionals. From the regionals, Division 1 teams finishing among the top four teams advanced to one of eight sectionals, and Divisions 2 and 3 top four teams advanced to one of four sectionals. The four best scores of each team are used to determine the team score.

The first two teams and the top three individuals, who were not members of a qualifying team, from each sectional are participating in the State Tournament. Groups for Monday's play have been developed using the team's sectional finish as well

as the individual's rank on his team. All five players from a participating school will tee off in succession. They will be grouped with players holding a similar position at another school.

Tuesday's foursomes will be designed based on the score shot by the team on Monday. Teams will be grouped based on their Monday score with the low team scores teeing off last. This allows teams to compete head-to-head with their competition.

Individual qualifiers will be grouped together and appropriately placed before team groupings.

Teams will be shooting for a team championship

in all three divisions of competition. Trophies will be awarded to the top two teams in each division. Also, all players will be vying for individual honors as medals will be presented to the top six individual finishers.

Playoffs are on a sudden death (hole-by-hole) basis. Duplicate medals will be awarded for ties in individual places two through six with a maximum of five medals being awarded unless there is a tie for sixth place. All five individuals participate in a team playoff with the scores of the top four counted. The score of each individual is not cumulative.

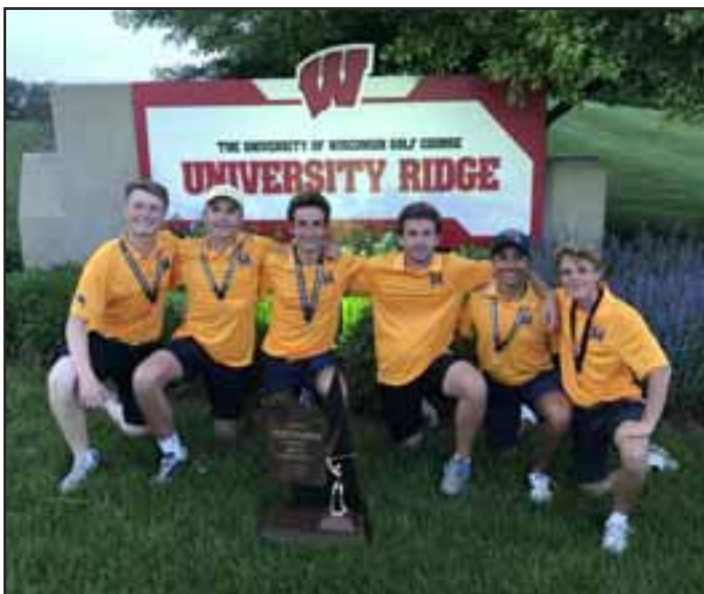
