WIAA Provides Opportunities; Structure . . .

The Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association (WIAA) is a voluntary, unincorporated, and nonprofit organization. The Association membership has a diversified membership of public high schools, nonpublic high schools, public middle schools, and nonpublic middle schools. Its purpose is to organize, develop, direct and provide interscholastic athletics for member schools.

There are 515 senior high schools affiliated with the WIAA. The estimated number of student-athletes in athletics is 80,000-85,000 annually.

Governance of the WIAA is performed by the member schools. Rules and policies of the Association are developed, promulgated and implemented by the membership either through membership vote for constitutional issues or through a membership-elected committee structure for sport seasons regulations. Therefore, ownership of the membership's rules and regulations, as well as the responsibility of compliance with them, lies with each member school.

The Development of Rules . . .

As fans watch the games during the tournament, some wonder how the rules of the game and of the WIAA were created.

- ◆ The National Federation of State High School Associations is the authority of the competition rules for sport contests (i.e. uniforms, length of contest, game rules). As a member of the NFHS, the WIAA adheres to those rules as a member in good standing. The WIAA, as well as all state associations in the NFHS, has input with an advisory role in the review and promulgation of the playing rules. The NFHS office is located in Indianapolis, Indiana.
- ◆ For changes to the membership's Constitution, Bylaws and Rules of Eligibility, a vote of the entire membership is required at the Annual Meeting each spring. The Constitution contains information relating to the Association as an organization. The Bylaws encompass information relating to member high schools' responsibility concerning WIAA rules and regulations. The Rules of Eligibility embody information relating to the relationship of the student-athlete to the high school and the WIAA.
- ◆ The Board of Control has the ultimate authority in determining the outcome of sport seasons rule recommendations and regulations. Changes to the sport seasons regulations are advanced through the democratic committee structure. Among the advisory groups that provide input to the Board are the coaches advisory committees for each sport; the sports advisory committee, comprised of school athletic directors from each of the seven districts; the Advisory Council, consisting of school administrators from each elector district; and the executive staff. Other groups with advisory responsibilities include the Medical Advisory Committee, Sportsmanship Committee and the Officials Advisory Committee. The Season Regulations address, among other topics, definition of the sports seasons, participation, contest control and tournament procedures.

Currently, the Association sponsors 24 sports including baseball, basketball, cross country, 8-player, 11-player football, golf, hockey, soccer, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field, volleyball and wrestling for boys; and basketball, cross country, golf, gymnastics, hockey, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and volleyball for girls.

Qualifying Procedures

In 2021, 185 schools are sponsoring boys tennis. There are 122 schools that are placed in Division 1 and the remaining 63 are placed in Division 2.

INDIVIDUAL TOURNAMENT

Participants who finished first through fourth in Flight 1 singles and doubles and first in Flight 2 singles and doubles in sectional competition qualified automatically for the WIAA Individual Tennis Tournament. Sixteen additional singles and doubles teams were chosen by the state seeding committee in Division 1 and eight additional singles and doubles teams in Division 2.

A total of 56 singles players and doubles teams will participate in Division 1. Twenty-eight singles and doubles teams will be participating in Division 2. Medals will be presented to the top six finishers in singles and doubles in each division following the completion of play on Saturday.

Subsectional and sectional tournaments provided both individual qualifiers for this tournament and provided the teams for the team tournament. The State Team Tournament will be held next weekend at Menard Tennis Center in Eau Claire for Division 1 at noon on Friday and Sports Core in Kohler for Division 2 beginning on Saturday at 9 a.m.

TEAM TOURNAMENT

Teams who finished first in one of eight Division 1 and four Division 2 sectionals are competing in the WIAA State Team Tennis Tournament this weekend. Teams scored points through subsectional and sectional play on June 7-10.

Teams were allowed to enter a total of 10 players at the subsectional level. Four flights of singles and three flights of doubles have enabled more athletes to participate in the WIAA tennis tournament program. Up until 1994-95, schools were allowed to enter only two singles players and two doubles teams. The addition of flights has allowed coaches to include their regular season players into the tournament structure.

Teams will be playing dual meets to determine who will advance to the championship round. The team scoring the most individual flight wins will advance to the next level of competition. The order of play at the State Team Tennis Tournament will be: #4 Singles, #3 Doubles, #3 Singles, #2 Doubles, #2 Singles, #1 Doubles, #1 Singles. The brackets were designed via a seeding meeting with all the participating coaches.

Awards will be presented following the completion of the championship matches on Saturday afternoon. Medals and trophies will be presented to both teams competing in the championship match of each division.

2021 State Preview

DIVISION 1 SINGLES OUTLOOK: Senior Martin Blagoev of Kenosha Indian Trail was granted the #1 seed with his undefeated record this season at 19-0. He qualified and won two matches in 2019 and qualified as a freshman in 2018. Senior Elijah Zifferblatt of West De Pere is the second seed with a 21-1 record this year. He qualified for State and won two matches in both 2019 and 2018 before being ousted from title contention. Senior Noah Viste of Wauwatosa East is the #3 seed. He enters play this week with an undefeated 20-0 record. He qualified and advanced to the quarterfinals before being defeated in 2019, and he qualified and won a match in 2018 as a freshman. Sophomore Sam Klein of Brookfield East qualifies for State for the first time sporting a 25-1 record this season. He was issued the #4 seed in the bracket. Sophomore Ethan Yu of Madison West is also experiencing State for the first time. He is seeded fifth with a 16-1 mark on the season. The sixth seed was issued to sophomore Chatton Haws of Cedarburg. He enters play with a 28-2 record. Junior Chase Lindwell of Monona Grove has compiled a 16-4 record this year, which earns him the #7 seed in the bracket. He gained tourney experience by qualifying his freshman season in 2019. Junior Tyler Nelson of Waunakee is seeded eighth with a 15-3 record this season. He qualified and won a match in 2019. Despite the cancellation of the tournament last spring, there are 13 players in the singles bracket that have State Tournament singles experience. Since 2001, the top-seed in the bracket has won 12 of the 19 singles titles during that span, and the lowest seed to win the championship since then was a fourth seed.

DIVISION 1 DOUBLES OUTLOOK: The Arrowhead senior duo of Sam Kredell and Nick Tiahnybik are the top seed in the doubles bracket. The tandem has posted an undefeated 24-0 record this season. Kredell has quality tournament experience, having won two matches with other partners in 2018 and 2019. Juniors Henry Irwin and Reed Scullen of Brookfield East qualify as the #2 seed with an 18-1 record. Scullen gained experience in 2019 qualifying with a different partner to win two matches in doubles play, and Scullen has State experience qualifying in the singles bracket in 2019. Seniors JV Steckart and Tommy Zakowski of Notre Dame are the third-seeded tandem. Both of them have State experience in singles play in Division 2. Each won first-round matches in 2019. They enter doubles play this week with an undefeated 16-0 record. Seniors Simon Johnstone and Nick Fisher of Brookfield East are seeded fourth with their 20-1 record. Fisher advanced to the third round with a different partner in 2019 and also qualified in 2018 with another partner. The tandem of senior Ted Wind and junior Jasper Delasanta of Sheboygan North remains intact after the duo qualified and fell in the first round in 2019. They enter the tournament this season as the #5 seed with a 19-3 record. The Homestead tandem of seniors Zach Sprinkmann and Travis Weber are the sixth seed with their 23-2 record. Senior Sam Marshall and sophomore Lincoln Marshall of Marquette are seeded seventh. They have compiled a 17-7 record this year. The eighth seed was handed to juniors James Mirsberger and Sriram Arvind of Brookfield Central. They have compiled a 21-5 record. There are 15 players in the doubles bracket that have had previous experience in the State Tournament in doubles play. Since 2001, the top-seed in the bracket has won 12 of the 19 doubles titles during that span, and the lowest seed to win the championship since then was a fourth seed.

DIVISION 2 SINGLES OUTLOOK: The top seed is senior Alex Sviatoslavsky of Edgewood. He enters the tournament undefeated this season at 22-0. Sviatoslavsky finished runner-up in 2019 and advanced to the quarterfinals in 2018. A freshman was granted the #2 seed in the bracket. Adrian Yin of Brookfield Academy is 13-3 this season. Sophomore Max Watchmaker of University School of Milwaukee is the #3 seed with a 12-3 record, and senior Andrew Larson of Pius XI Catholic is seeded fourth with a 19-3 win-loss tally this season. He advanced to the quarterfinals before a loss ended his title chances in 2019. Junior Teddy Wong of Dominican/Eastbrook Academy qualifies this season as the fifth seed with an 11-3 record. It's the same seed he received when he finished sixth in 2019. Sixth-seeded Dayne Lindow, a junior from East Troy, qualifies for the second time. In 2019, he won one match in the tournament as a freshman. He enters play with a 24-2 record this year. Junior Jack Hehlh of West Salem is the seventh seed with an undefeated mark of 24-0 this season. He qualified and fell in his first-round match in 2019. Sophomore Taytem Matthews of Brookfield Academy qualifies for the second time in singles play with a 15-4 record. He qualified in 2019 and won his first-round match, after winning the doubles championship as a freshman in 2018. There are six players in the singles bracket that have State Tournament singles experience. Since 2001, the top-seed in the bracket has won 13 of the 19 singles titles during that span, and the lowest seed to win the championship since then was a sixth seed.

DIVISION 2 DOUBLES OUTLOOK: Juniors Drew Buckholdt and Pranav Gogineni of Brookfield Academy is the top seed in the bracket with a 9-5 mark this season. Buckholdt qualified as a freshman with a different partner in 2019 and won a first-round match. Senior Andrew Bechthold and junior Shaan Sharma of University School of Milwaukee is issued the #2 seed in the bracket with a limited number of matches and a 5-3 record. The third-seeded doubles squad is senior Chase Korb and freshman Nate Carson of Catholic Memorial with a 17-9 record. Korb gained State experience by qualifying in 2019 with a different partner. Seniors Hayden Houselander and Tanner Witt of New Berlin Eisenhower is seeded fourth with a 13-9 mark this year, and seniors Reed Birzynski and James Bunzel of Pius XI Catholic are the fifth seed with a 10-5 record. A pair of seniors from Shorewood are the #6 seed in the bracket. Alek Kovalcik and Zach Khenaffi has compiled a 7-4 tally this year. The seventh seed is seniors Garrett Butler and Seth Capelli of Aquinas. The duo has compiled an undefeated 16-0 record to this point in 2021. Senior Michael McGuire and sophomore Ben McGuire of St. Mary's Springs are also undefeated heading into play this week with a mark of 14-0. There are two players, Buckholdt and Korb, in the doubles bracket that have had previous experience in the State Tournament in doubles play. Since 2001, the top-seed in the bracket has won 12 of the 19 doubles titles during that span, and an unseeded tandem has won the championship once during that span.

DIVISION 1 NOTES: Third-seeded **Marquette** is essentially the five-time defending champion, with last year's tournament canceled by the COVID-19 pandemic. The Hilltoppers are making their 14th straight appearance and its 17th overall. They have won the team championship in 12 of the last 13 State Tournaments and have won 14 titles overall. They produced State titles in 2002, 2003, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019, as well as a run-

ner-up finish in 2004. The Hilltoppers finished runner-up to top-seeded **Brookfield East**. Brookfield East is making its 10th appearance in the State team tournament and its third in a row after finishing runner-up to Marquette in 2019. The Spartans won their only team title in 2014. They placed first in the Greater Metro Conference this spring. Second-seeded **Middleton** makes its 13th State appearance overall and essentially its second in a row with the cancellation of last year's tournament. The Cardinals have finished runner-up on four occasions, including 2000, 2007, 2009 and 2015. They are the champions of the Big 8 Conference this year. The fourth seed, **Neenah**, makes its seventh State appearance in the last eight seasons—discounting last year's canceled season—and its 18th overall. The Rockets had a string of eight consecutive appearances from 2000-2007. They won five straight championships from 1991-1995 and 10 overall titles, also earning the crown in 1946, 1951, 1953, 1957 and 1965. The Rockets also have 11 runner-up finishes, including 1935, 1940, 1950, 1952, 1971, 1996, 2001, 2005, 2013, 2016 and 2017. This season, they placed atop the Fox Valley Association standings. **Whitefish Bay** enters the tournament as the #5 seed. The Blue Dukes make their sixth State Tournament appearance and their first in Division 1. Their previous five appearances in Division 2 results in State championships, capturing the gold trophy from 1997-2000, and then again in 2002. They are the champions of the North Shore Conference this year. Sixth-seeded **Madison Memorial** is back in the team tournament for the first time in 22 years and for the fifth time overall. The Spartans further advance toward the crown was to the semifinals in 1997. They were runners-up in the Big 8 Conference this spring behind second-seeded Middleton. Seventh-seeded **Eau Claire Memorial** makes its membership-leading 23rd appearance at State and its 19th in the last 20 seasons. The Old Abes' furthest advance in the tournament was to the title match in 2014 when they finished runner-up. They are the champions of the Big Rivers Conference in 2021. **Appleton North**, the #8 seed, makes its first-ever appearance in the State team tournament. The Lightning were runners-up behind Neenah in the Fox Valley Association standing this year.

DIVISION 2 NOTES: **Catholic Memorial** is the top seed in the bracket. The Crusaders make their second appearance at State after qualifying for the first time in 2019, which essentially makes this their second straight appearance with last season canceled. Their initial appearance in the tournament resulted in a loss in semifinals. They placed third in the Classic Eight Conference this season. **Xavier** is back in the State Team Tournament for the sixth time and for the first time since a streak of three straight appearances was snapped in 2009. The Hawks' most notable experience came in 2008 with a runner-up finish. They are the champions of the Bay Conference this spring. Fourth-seeded **Aquinas** has qualified for the eighth time, and for the first time since 2011. The Blugolds' top finish came with a runner-up performance in their first appearance in 2002. They finished the season in second place in the Mississippi Valley Conference. **Brookfield Academy** was issued the #4 seed. The Blue Knights' first experience at State was in 2019, essentially making this their second consecutive appearance. They finished with the silver trophy. The Blue Knights play an independent schedule without a conference affiliation.
