


WIAA Provides Opportunities; Structure . . .

The Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association (WIAA) is a voluntary, unincorporated, and nonprofit organization. The Association membership has a diversified membership of public high schools, nonpublic high schools, public middle schools, and nonpublic middle schools. Its purpose is to organize, develop, direct and provide interscholastic athletics for member schools.

There are 515 senior high schools affiliated with the WIAA. The estimated number of student-athletes in athletics is 80,000-85,000 annually.

Governance of the WIAA is performed by the member schools. Rules and policies of the Association are developed, promulgated and implemented by the membership either through membership vote for constitutional issues or through a membership-elected committee structure for sport seasons regulations. Therefore, ownership of the membership's rules and regulations, as well as the responsibility of compliance with them, lies with each member school.

The Development of Rules . . .

As fans watch the games during the tournament, some wonder how the rules of the game and of the WIAA were created.

- ◆ The National Federation of State High School Associations is the authority of the competition rules for sport contests (i.e. uniforms, length of contest, game rules). As a member of the NFHS, the WIAA adheres to those rules as a member in good standing. The WIAA, as well as all state associations in the NFHS, has input with an advisory role in the review and promulgation of the playing rules. The NFHS office is located in Indianapolis, Indiana.The NFHS logo consists of the letters "NFHS" in a bold, white, sans-serif font, set against a blue rectangular background with three diagonal white stripes.
- ◆ For changes to the membership's Constitution, Bylaws and Rules of Eligibility, a vote of the entire membership is required at the Annual Meeting each spring. The Constitution contains information relating to the Association as an organization. The Bylaws encompass information relating to member high schools' responsibility concerning WIAA rules and regulations. The Rules of Eligibility embody information relating to the relationship of the student-athlete to the high school and the WIAA.
- ◆ The Board of Control has the ultimate authority in determining the outcome of sport seasons rule recommendations and regulations. Changes to the sport seasons regulations are advanced through the democratic committee structure. Among the advisory groups that provide input to the Board are the coaches advisory committees for each sport; the sports advisory committee, comprised of school athletic directors from each of the seven districts; the Advisory Council, consisting of school administrators from each elector district; and the executive staff. Other groups with advisory responsibilities include the Medical Advisory Committee, Sportsmanship Committee and the Officials Advisory Committee. The Season Regulations address, among other topics, definition of the sports seasons, participation, contest control and tournament procedures.

Currently, the Association sponsors 24 sports including baseball, basketball, cross country, 8-player, 11-player football, golf, hockey, soccer, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field, volleyball and wrestling for boys; and basketball, cross country, golf, gymnastics, hockey, soccer, softball, swimming & diving, tennis, track & field and volleyball for girls.



2021 State Preview

2021 TOURNAMENT BY THE NUMBERS: There will be champions crowned in 14 weight classes in three divisions. Wrestlers who finished first or second in each weight class at last weekend's four sectionals in each division qualified for the State Tournament. Therefore, there are eight qualifiers per weight in each division and 112 total qualifiers for each division. There are 172 programs represented at this year's individual championships, including 60 from Division 1, and 60 in Division 2 and 52 in Division 3.

MORE NUMBERS: Kaukauna has qualified the most wrestlers in the Division 1 field with eight. Stoughton is next on the list with six. Amery and Prairie du Chien have the distinction of qualifying the most individuals in Division 2 with seven. In Division 3, Kenosha Christian Life, Mineral Point and Random Lake claim the most qualifiers with six. There are 23 former champions in the tournament field this year.

TOTAL INDIVIDUAL TITLES BY SCHOOL: Stoughton has produced the most individual championships with 53. Mineral Point is next with 51, followed by Wisconsin Rapids Lincoln with 44 and then Luxemburg-Casco with 42. Others with significant totals are Milwaukee South with 39 and Coleman with 38.

TRACKING THE CHAMPIONS – DIVISION 1: The Division 1 field features six former champions on a quest for another crown. Two of the champions are in pursuit of their third State titles, and two of the weight classes have a pair of former champions on a collision course to the crown. Junior Nicolar Rivera of Stoughton attempts to win his third straight championship. He won at 106 in 2019 and at 120 last season. He moves up two weights to 132 with a 9-0 record entering the State Tournament. He has yet to lose a match in his prep career with a 118-0 mark. He'll need to contend with another State champion in senior Jager Eisch of Kaukauna. He won the championship at 126 a year ago and moves up a weight possessing a 14-0 record this season. Senior Hayden Halter of Waterford seeks to return to the top spot on the awards podium this season at 126 as he did in winning the titles at 106 in 2018 and 120 in 2019. He fell to third competing at 126 last season. He enters the opening round of competition this week with an 11-0 mark. One of the challengers standing in the way of Halter's third title is sophomore Greysen Clark of Kaukauna. He was the 106 champion last year who has moved up three weight classes. He has yet to lose a match this season as well with a 15-0 record. Junior Mitchell Mesenbrink of Arrowhead seeks his second consecutive title after winning the championship at 138 in 2020. That came on the heels of a third-place finish at 120 in 2019. He is 14-0 this season moving up to the 152-pound weight class. Senior Brooks Empey of Stoughton will attempt to win his second straight crown at 220. Prior to winning the title a season ago, he placed runner-up at 195 in 2019 and was sixth at 182 in 2018. Empey is 10-0 this season with only one loss over the last two seasons.

TRACKING THE CHAMPIONS – DIVISION 2: The Division 2 field has six former champions, including Senior Matty Bianchi of Two Rivers, who is attempting to become the 19th wrestler to win four State individual championships. Two others in the division are seeking their third titles. Bianchi's legacy began in 2018 with a title at 113, followed by the 132 title in 2019. Last year, he claimed the crown at 138, and he moves up to 145 this season. He is 9-0 heading into first-round action at State. According to available records, Bianchi has compiled a 147-10 record during his career. Senior Blaine Brenner of Stanley-Boyd/Owen-Withee embarks on his quest to win three straight State titles. He won at 106 in 2019 and added the 120 title last year. This season, Brenner moves up two weights to 132 with a 15-0 record to this point in the season, which gives him a stellar 107-2 mark in the past three seasons. Junior Clayton Whiting of Oconto Falls is also in position to win a third straight championship. He moves up to 182 this season after winning titles at 152 in 2019 and 170 last year. His record of 14-0 this season improves his record to 110-4 during his career. Sophomore Rhett Koenig of Prairie du Chien moves up a weight to 113 after earning the championship at 106 last season. He is 16-1 this season heading into State Tournament competition. Junior Caleb Meunier of Winneconne won the 113 title last year after finishing runner-up at 106 as a freshman in 2019. He moves up to 126 this season with a 15-2 record. Sophomore Braeden Scoles of Kewaskum made quite an impression his freshman season last year by winning the 145-pound title. He's back in the State Tournament seeking his second title with a 13-0 mark at 160.

TRACKING THE CHAMPIONS – DIVISION 3: The Division 3 field has 11 former champions looking to add another gold medal after winning titles last season, including a trio of wrestlers seeking their third title. Junior Tanner Gerber of Cameron moves up two weight classes to 126 after winning the 113 title last season and the 106 championship in 2019. He has a 13-0 record heading into competition this week, which gives him a 110-3 career record in his first three years. Junior Kole Marko of St. Croix Falls is also pursuing his third championship. He won the crown at 145 last season and the 138 crown the year before that. Marko moves up to contend for the

152 title this year with a 15-0 record heading into the tourney, which gives him a 98-4 record during his career. Senior Trett Joles of Boyceville moves up a weight to 195 after ruling the 182 weight class the past few seasons, winning titles in 2019 and 2020 after placing third at the weight in 2018. He advances to State with a 16-0 record this season and a 158-3 mark during his career. Sophomore Brayden Sonnentag of Cadott jumps to the 120-pound class this season after winning the title at 106 in 2020. He begins competition at State with a 16-0 tally this season. Two of last year's champions have moved into the 138-pound weight class. Junior Cash Stewart of Poynette moves up three weight classes from 120 after winning gold last year and finishing fourth at 113 in 2019. He has won all seven of his matches so far this season at 138. Junior Gavin Drexler of Stratford moves up two weights to join Stewart after capturing the title at 126 last year. Drexler is 18-0 this year. Junior Karson Casper of Coleman moves on from 138 after winning the championship at the weight a year ago. At 145 this season, Casper has posted a 14-0 record. Senior Jack Severin of Kewaunee won the Division 2 championship at 126 last year after placing fourth at 126 in Division 3 in 2019 and fifth at 120 in 2018. He is back in Division 3 this season, qualifying at 132 with a 19-0 mark. Senior Aidan Vandenbush of Random Lake is aiming his attention on a title at 160 after winning the championship at 152 last season and finishing third in 2019. He hasn't lost this year in 18 matches, which gives him a 115-4 record over the last three years. Senior Nolan Springer of Mineral Point moves up a weight to 170 after conquering the 160-pound weight class last season and finishing fifth at 152 in 2019. He has compiled an 11-0 record this year. Senior Tanner Gaffey of St. Croix Falls attempts to defend his title at 285. He went undefeated last season to earn the crown. He is 15-0 this season, giving him a 107-3 record the last three seasons. It may be interesting to note that all but two of the 22 former champions competing this week enter the tournament undefeated.

UNBLEMISHED MARKS: In any given conventional season, there have been a fairly consistent number of undefeated wrestlers qualifying for the State Individual Wrestling Tournament. The average number of undefeated wrestlers qualifying for State during the past decade is a shade above 21, and each have been recognized in the preview over the years. This year, there are significantly more because of the limited number of matches with restrictions to mitigate the spread of COVID-19. It's suffice to indicate that there are 101 undefeated qualifiers and another 102 that have just one loss this season.

State Tournament Scoring

As you watch the WIAA State Individual Wrestling Tournament, the following match regulations and scoring will apply.

All matches are six minutes in length, except for those involving wrestlers who have lost previously which will be five minutes only (one minute first period).

The first period in all matches is started with both wrestlers in a neutral position on their feet. The second and third periods start from either the neutral position or referee's position down on the mat. The position is selected by one wrestler for the start of the second period and by his opponent for the start of the third period. Prior to assuming an offensive starting position, the offensive wrestler may signal to the referee the neutral position. The defensive wrestler is awarded an escape, and the wrestling begins from the neutral position.

When the wrestlers are on their feet, they are to continuously work for a takedown.

When a wrestler has the advantage, he must try to breakdown or flatten his opponent to set him up for a pinning combination.

The wrestler in the underneath position tries to score points by escaping or reversing his opponent.

The referee indicates with his fingers the points awarded each wrestler.

Each wrestler in the tournament will wear a red or green ankle band for purposes of identification during the match. If, for example, a wrestler is wearing a green band and he scores a point in the match, the referee will indicate the point by calling out: "One point green." He will simultaneously raise the arm with the corresponding colored wristband and indicate the number of points with his fingers.

MATCH SCORING

Fall or Pin – A fall is scored when a wrestler holds his opponent's shoulders to the mat continuously for two seconds. A fall ends the match.

Technical Fall – A technical fall is earned any time a wrestler has gained a 15 point advantage over his opponent.

Decision – If neither wrestler scores a fall or technical fall, a decision is awarded to the wrestler who scores the greater number of individual match points. Takedown – 2 pts; Escape – 1 pt.; Reversal – 2 pts.; Near Fall – 2, 3 or 4 pts.; and Penalties – 1 or 2 pts.

OVERTIME PROCEDURES

When the contestants are tied at the end of the three regular periods, they will wrestle overtime. Overtime will consist of a one-minute sudden victory period, and if needed two 30-second tiebreakers. If the score remains tied at the end of the two 30-second tiebreakers, a 30-second ultimate tiebreaker shall take place. The procedure will be:

- a. no rest between the regulation match and the sudden victory;
- b. wrestlers in the neutral position;
- c. the wrestler who scores the first point(s) will be declared the winner; if no winner is declared by the end of the sudden victory, then the following procedure will be used:
 1. two 30-second tiebreakers will be wrestled to completion and score kept as in the regular match;
 2. the referee shall flip a disk to determine which wrestler has the choice of starting position for the first tiebreaker;
 3. the wrestler who has choice in the first tiebreaker may select top, bottom, or defer the choice to the opponent;
 4. at the conclusion of the first 30-second tiebreaker, the opponent will have the choice of top or bottom position;
 5. whichever wrestler has scored the most points in the two 30-second tiebreakers will be declared the winner;
 6. if the score is tied at the end of the two 30-second tiebreakers; the choice of position for the ultimate tiebreaker will be granted to the wrestler who scored the first point(s) in the regulation match (first three periods of the match); the wrestler whose opponent has received an unsportsmanlike conduct penalty at any time during the match will have the choice of position. The unsportsmanlike conduct penalty will supersede the first points scored in the regulation match; if no points are scored in the regulation match, a flip of the disk shall determine the wrestler who has the choice (points for double-stalling or simultaneous penalties shall be considered as no points for the purpose of the tiebreaker choice);
 7. the wrestler who has choice may select top, bottom or defer the choice to the opponent;
 8. the wrestler who scores the first point(s) during the ultimate tiebreaker will be declared the winner. If no scoring occurs during the ultimate tiebreaker, the offensive wrestler will be declared the winner and the one match point shall be added to the offensive wrestler's score.
- d. a fall terminates the match.

Overtime is an extension of the regular match. All points, penalties, cautions, warnings, time-out and injury time will be cumulative throughout the regular match and the overtime period.

If the points earned in the sudden victory or ultimate tiebreaker involve a takedown or reversal straight to near-fall criteria, the match shall continue until the near-fall or fall situation has concluded.

INFRACTIONS

Stalling – Failing to wrestle aggressively. After one warning, the referee will penalize a wrestler for stalling by awarding his opponent one point.

Illegal Holds – Any hold which endangers the opponent or which is used for punishment only is illegal. The referee will award one point to the offended wrestler.

Technical Violations – Points will be awarded his opponent if a wrestler commits various technical violations such as: Delay of match, intentionally going off mat to avoid a situation, and clasping hand around opponent's body or legs while in a position of control down on the mat.
