

**STATE TOURNAMENT**

The 1933 State Tournament produced some of the best basketball ever shown at the annual meet. While the attendance did not measure up to previous years it nevertheless exceeded expectations. The attendance the first two days was the poorest in years while the last two days produced the best crowds ever to attend the State Meet. The total attendance was 11,563 of which number 5,615 attended the last two sessions. In spite of the reduced admissions the meet paid expenses as will be seen from the financial statement. Expenses were paid on a reduced basis. Other expenditures were also cut with the result that the total cost of the event was \$791.10 less than last year.

The competition was keen and the final between Beloit and Wausau was a thriller which kept the large crowd in uproar until the final gun. The 1933 margin between the winning score and the losing average was 11 points. In spite of the substantial margin a number of games were close, four ending in a one point margin. No contests went into overtime. Kenosha, the consolation winner, played excellent basketball and was unfortunate in that they were compelled to play the ultimate winner in the first game.

Free Throwing showed an improvement over 1932 when 65% of foul tosses were converted. The 1933 average was slightly better than 67%. Many games are actually won from the free throw line and coaches would do well to emphasize free throwing during the season.

The 1933 State Meet produced an unusual number of high class teams. Beloit, the winner, had a well balanced team and played excellent ball. That they were a great team was demonstrated in two games when they came from behind to win. Kenosha had a powerful team. Wausau played good ball, even in defeat at the hands of Beloit in the last game.

**SUPPLEMENTARY TOURNAMENTS**

Fourteen Supplementary Tournaments were conducted this year. This number is only three under the record of seventeen made last year. The total attendance at these fourteen tournaments was 22,207, a decrease of only 5,330 from a total attendance at the seventeen meets last year. A substantial reduction in the admission prices reduced the total receipts from \$5,848.08 in 1932 to \$3,445.49 this year.

Competing teams, however, fared better than last year. In 1932 teams averaged 42% of expenses while this year they were given 53%. This splendid return was due to the substantial reduction in the local expenses. In 1932
