

Propelled by Sam Antcliffe's record-shattering scoring performance, West Allis Hale trounced LaCrosse Central 83-64 to capture the State Prep Basketball Tourney's Consolation crown.

Antcliffe, 6'3" center, scored 41 points to establish 5 new all-time tournament records. They are as follows: (1) Field goals for a single game: 18; (2) Total points for single game: 41; (3) Field goals for three games: 41; (4) Total points for three games: 91; (5) Best field goal percentage for three games: .683.

The Huskies were in command all the way, grabbing the lead on Antcliffes opening basket and never relinquishing the advantage. Dick Ludtke scored 20 points for Hale. Ammerman paced LaCrosse with 20 points. Ron Panke of LaCrosse added 18 markers.

Shawano's young but poised basketball team became the 1956 Wisconsin State High Basketball Champion by defeating Appleton's speedy outfit 74-68 before a capacity crowd at the University of Wisconsin Field House.

Outscored in field goals 28-21, Shawano more than made up for that by putting 32 free throws in 40 attempts while Appleton was making 12 out of 23.

Shawano had previously won the State Championship in 1940 and the Class B Title in 1938. This was Shawano's first trip to the State meet since 1943.

Appleton won its only State Championship back in 1921, and this was its first trip to the State Tournament since 1926.

Fred Opperman paced the winner's attack with 19 points, but it was balance more than anything else that won for Shawano in this game. The Indians used six other players, one scored 7 points, 3 scored 8, one 10, and

one tallied 14.

Jim Ray, slim Appleton forward, paced his team with 20 points, Moede scored 15, Verkuilen 13 and Schulze 11, to pace the Appleton attack.

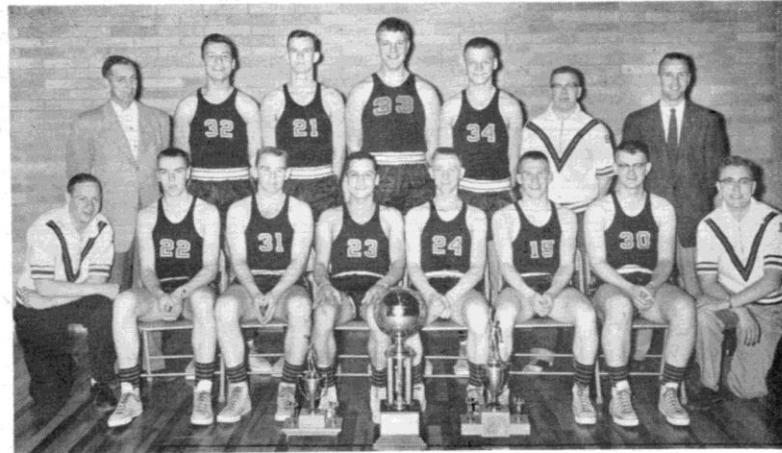
