Basketball

Janesville Parker – surprising everyone but itself – reigns as Wisconsin high school basketball champion for 1971.

Unheralded and unrated as well as seven-times beaten during the season, the Vikings of Coach Bob Morgan displayed great championship form, including unbelievable poise under tremendous pressure, in winning the title of the 56th annual State Tournament at the University of Wisconsin fieldhouse in Madison on March 18-19-20.

Victim in the finals was another outstanding team, Milwaukee King, which tried to make a third straight come-from-behind performance only to be stymied by the discipline and cool-headedness of Janesville. The final score was 79-68 with Parker seemingly thriving on the pressure of the final period as it twice made up one-point deficits to fashion the final 11-point victory margin.

The Vikings' title-game effort was nothing short of sensational. They shot at a record championship-game percentage of .622 (28 of 45) and they converted every one of 23 free throws for another record. But even more significant were the fourth-quarter statistics: Seven field goals in seven attempts from the field and 13 free throws in 13 attempts from the line! Not a single miss of any kind in the most nerve-wrecking period of the game!

King grabbed its first lead of the night, 54-52, before the final period was 10 seconds old, and it looked like the Generals of Coach Max Walker were going to follow the same script of their previous evenings in the fieldhouse. They were still in front, 56-55, with 6½ minutes to play. Then came Janesville's closing surge and amazing poise in the face of a pressing, swarming defense that had been King's most effective weapon in compiling 24 victories and only one defeat (that in overtime) during the campaign.

Bob Luchsinger, a star among stars for the champions, hit from the side at the 6:25 mark to put the downstaters in front, 57-56, and a minute later John Brikowski had a lay-in and two free throws to make it 61-56. King had no intentions of folding, however, and baskets by Reggie Dantzler, Mike Goodwin and James Holifield kept the Generals within range, 65-62, with 3:44 to play. There was still time at the 2:22 mark with the score now 69-64 but before another minute had elapsed the outcome was no longer in doubt as Luchsinger with his fourth basket and his third and fourth free tosses of the quarter along with two more gift shots by little but dynamic Jeff Paulson had raised the difference to 75-64. The last minute and a half were anti-climactic.

The title game was one of four great championship-flight contests involving five good teams in the tournament. Semi-final play was nothing short of tremendous. Parker came from 16 points behind in the last 12 minutes to overtake previously unbeaten and perennially-hardluck Neenah (State runnerup in one-point verdicts the previous two years) in a scintillating 54-52 contest. King, meanwhile, first had to erase an eight-point second-period deficit, then had to come back in the last 100 seconds of regulation play before out-battling a fine Wausau East team in an 89-82 overtime that would not have been an overtime — nor a King win — had a short shot by Wausau not bounced off the rim with a second or two to play. King one day earlier in the best game of the opening round had rallied furiously in the last 3-4 minutes to make-up a 10-point deficit and oust the tournament's defending champions, Appleton West, in a thrilling 69-64 contest which was only a point apart with a minute to play.

The brusing battle for third-place honors — even though not in the championship bracket — could not be overlooked as one of the better contests. Neenah nudged Wausau East, 70-69, but not before blowing all but one of a 16-point lead in the last four minutes and then seeing another last-second shot by a Wausau player bounce off the rim.

Consolation honors went to Appleton West in a good performance in which Milwaukee Boys Tech was a 72-58 victim. Appleton West had reached the consolation finals by beating Cumberland, 65-47, while Boys Tech turned back Reedsburg, 74-69, in the other consolation semi-final.

The championship-flight quarter-finals played ahead of the King win over Appleton saw



Janesville Parker came into the tournament with a 16-7 record and finished with 19-7, including 16 victories in its last 18 games. Milwaukee King was 22-1 coming to Madison and 24-2 Neenah start slowly but win handily, 65-47, over Boys Tech; Janesville Parker start quickly and coast to a 71-51 triumph over Reedsburg, and Wausau East topple Cumberland, 77-53.

leaving. Neenah was 23-0 at the start and 25-1 at the finish. Wausau East was 18-5 and 19-7 at the start and finish, respectively. Appleton East finished 21-5 for the year while Boys Tech quintet was 20-6 for the campaign. Cumberland was 22-4 and Reedsburg was 19-7, for the season

Janesville's surprising performance — considering its record as well as its 11-7 won-lost mark for the regular season — featured some great late-season play. Parker beat cross-town rival and Big Eight co-champion Janesville Craig in the Regionals, then won over the other Big Eight champion, Madison West, in the Sectionals before earning — and deserving — its State championship.

The championship contest, which marked the first time either school had even reached this level, in fact, the first time either had been to the State Meet, saw Parker jump to a 19-14 quarter lead and hold a 37-30 edge at halftime as Dick Meier scored eight of his team's first 13 points and Luchsinger and John Bobzien give considerable support. King fell as far as eight points behind early in the second half but four baskets of Raymond Nixon – giving him eight for the game at that point – led a rally that brought the score to a 52-52 deadlock after three periods. Then came the Parker counter-rally which gave the school the State title in only its fourth year in existence.

Luchsinger finished with 25 points while Meier had 16, Paulson 14, Bobzien 10, Brikowski nine and reserve Mike McGrath five to lead Parker. King, which shot .388 on 31 of 80 and made only six of 13 free throws, was led by Nixon with 17. He also had 12 rebounds. King star William Stewart had 16 while Goodwin had 13, Zeddie Roshell 10 and Dantzler and Holifield each six. King had a 42-31 rebounding edge.
