WIAA Overtime Rules

• The WIAA's adoption of the 25-yard line tiebreaker must be used to resolve all senior high contests (varsity, junior varsity, sophomore, and freshman/sophomore) which are tied at the end of regulation play. (Football Fall Season Regulations, pg. 13, 16-a.)

Rule Regarding Use of Running Time (Football Fall Season Regulations, pg. 13, 16-b.)

- The following rule regarding the use of running time must be used:
 - After the first quarter, when the score differential reaches 35 points or more, a mandatory running clock will be used.
 - > Normal clock operating procedures resume if the score differential goes back under 35 points in the second and third quarters.
 - ➤ Beginning with the ensuing kickoff, the clock will run continuously except for the following situations when it will be stopped: time outs charged to a team, after a score, intermission between 3rd and 4th quarters, extended injury time outs, any time officials determine it is necessary for safety reasons.
 - > The running clock will be maintained in the fourth quarter even if the score differential goes below 35 points.
 - The use of this rule does not preclude the use of Rule 3-1-3 which reads, "A period or periods may be shortened in any emergency by agreement of the opposing coaches and the referee. By mutual agreement of the opposing coaches and the referee any remaining periods may be shortened at any time or the game may be terminated."

Attention Athletics Directors and Officials!! Arbiter Pay Update
